AN ORDINANCE

GRANTING THE PETITION OF THE MISSION ICE COMPANY FOR PERMISSION TO CONNECT WITH CITY SANITARY SEWER.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

That the petition of the Mission Ice Company for permission to connect drain line from their new plant on the corner of Fredericksburg Road and Blanco Road, with the City Sanitary Sewer, be and the same is hereby granted, subject to the following conditions:

1. That the permit hereby granted is purely temporary in its nature and the City reserves the right to revoke same at any time, with or without notice, for any reason that may in the judgment of the City be sufficient.
2. That the connection with the City sewer shall be by a sewer line not over 6" in diameter, such connection to be made under the direction of the Commissioner of Streets and Public Improvements, in such manner as he may direct; such connection shall be made at the manhole at the intersection of Blanco Road and Hickman Street.
3. This permit is intended to cover only the sewerage from the ice plant of petitioner, to be located at the corner of Blanco Road and Frederickburg Road, in this City; not more than five hundred (500) gallons per day of clear water, and said water to be free from any acids or salt brine from vats, shall be allowed to enter the City's sewer; and no person or firm shall be permitted by petitioner, its agents, servants or employees, to use said drain line or the City's Sanitary Sewer through the connection here permitted to be made.
4. That the use to be made of its said drain connecting with the City sewer shall be subject to the regulation and direction of the City and no use shall be made thereof which might in any way impair the City sewer or cause same to be obstructed or damaged in any manner whatsoever.
5. That the inspectors of the City shall have free access to grantee's premises and all

buildings situated thereon during the continuance of this permit and while said premises are connected with said City sanitary sewers, for the purposes of inspecting the condition of the plumbing and the use made of said sewers, and that all conditions as herein embodied are being faithfully observed.

6. All expenses incident to making this connection with the City sewer shall be borne by the petitioner, including a charge of \$ _____ for connection, and the petitioner shall indemnify, hold and save harmless the City against any loss or damage of any character whatsoever incident to or cause by its use of the facilities here now granted it.

REQUIRING THE SAN ANTONIO, UVALDE & GULF RAILROAD COMPANY TO CONSTRUCT CROSSING AT INTERSECTION OF ITS TRACKS WITH HARRIMAN PLACE.

WHEREAS, Harriman Place is obstructed by reason of the fact that it is traversed by the tracks of the San Antonio, Uvalde & Gulf Railroad Company, and there is now no crossing over said tracks, thereby rendering said tracks impassable to ordinary travel on account of the lack of proper crossing, and on account of the continuous blocking of said intersection; and,

WHEREAS, such condition constitutes a great inconvenience and a great nuisance to persons residing on said street, adjacent thereto, and in the vicinity thereof; and to persons desiring to travel along and over the same; and to the public generally; and,

WHEREAS, a public necessity exists for the placing of a proper crossing over said railroad tracks where they intersect said street, and the maintenance of said crossing free from obstructions; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION ONE: That the San Antonio, Uvalde & Gulf Railroad Company be and it is hereby ordered, directed and required to build, or cause to be built and constructed, and to maintain free from obstructions, a crossing over the tracks of said Railroad Company where said tracks intersect and traverse Harriman Place,

SECTION TWO: That said crossing shall be constructed in a permanent manner of good and substantial materials and of a width to conform to the line and grade of said street as furnished by the City Engineer of the City of San Antonio.

SECTION THREE: That by reason of the great importance and necessity for such crossing, the said Railroad Company is directed, ordered and required to begin work on said crossing, at once, or not later than five (5) days after the passage and approval of this Ordinance, and to prosecute said construction diligently thereafter until said crossing is completed.

SECTION FOUR: A certified copy of this Ordinance shall be made by the City Clerk, and shall be served by an officer of the Police Department on said Railroad Company, by delivering the same to the Receiver and General Manager, and shall make due return thereof.

SECTION FIVE: The continuous obstruction of said crossing by the said Railroad Company is hereby declared to be a public nuisance, and upon the failure of the said Railroad Company to remove said obstructions of said crossing and make it passable; as provided by the terms of this Ordinance, then the Chief of Police and the Commissioner of Streets and Public Improvements are ordered to clear and open up said crossing at the cost of said Railroad Company.

SECTION SIX: The passage of this Ordinance shall not be deemed as a waiver of any of the penalties which the City of San Antonio may be entitled to recover by reason of the failure

on the part of said Railroad Company to construct said crossing; and in the event of failure of said Railway Company to carry out the provisions of this Ordinance, then the City Attorney is hereby authorized to proceed to enforce the provisions hereof, and the laws and Ordinances applicable thereto.

SECTION SEVEN: This Ordinance is declared to be of urgent public necessity, for reasons of public welfare apparent therefrom, and the same shall take effect immediately after its passage and approval.

AN ORDINANCE

REQUIRING THE INTERNATIONAL-GREAT NORTHERN RAILROAD COMPANY TO CONSTRUCT CROSSINGS AT INTERSECTIONS OF ITS TRACKS WITH HARRIMAN PLACE, WEST ELSMERE PLACE, AND WEST KINGS HIGHWAY.

WHEREAS, Harriman Place, West Elsmere Place and West Kings Highway are obstructed by reason of the fact that they are traversed by the tracks of the International-Great Northern Railroad Company, and there are now no crossings over said tracks, thereby rendering said tracks impassable to ordinary travel on account of the lack of proper crossings, and on account of the continuous blocking of said intersections; and

WHEREAS, such condition constitutes a great inconvenience and a great nuisance to persons residing; on said streets, adjacent thereto, and in the vicinity thereof; and to persons desiring to travel along and over the same; and to the public generally; and,

WHEREAS, a public necessity exists for the placing of proper crossings over said railroad tracks where they intersect said streets, and the maintenance of said crossings free from obstructions; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION ONE: That the International-Great Northern Railroad Company be and it is hereby ordered, directed and required to build, or cause to be built and constructed, and to maintain free from obstructions, crossings over the tracks of said Railroad Company where said tracks intersect and traverse Harriman Place, West Elsmere Place, and West Kings Highway.

SECTION TWO: That said Crossings shall be constructed in a permanent manner of good and substantial materials and of a width to conform to the lines and grades of said streets as furnished by the City Engineer of the City of San Antonio,

SECTION THREE: That by reason of the great importance and necessity for such crossings, the said Railroad Company is directed, ordered and required to begin work on said crossings, and all of them, at once, or not later than five (5) days after the passage and approval of this Ordinance, and to prosecute said construction diligently thereafter until said crossings are completed.

SECTION FOUR: A certified copy of this Ordinance shall be made by the City Clerk, and shall be served by an officer of the Police Department on said Railroad Company, by delivering the same to the Superintendent and shall make due return thereof.

SECTION FIVE: The continuous obstruction of said crossings by the said Railroad Company is hereby declared to be a public nuisance, and upon the failure of the said Railroad Company to remove said obstructions of said crossings and make them passable, as provided by the terms of this Ordinance, then the Chief of Police and the Commissioner of Streets and Public Improvements are ordered to clear and open up said crossings at the cost of said Railroad Company.

SECTION SIX: The passage of this Ordinance shall not be deemed as a waiver of any of the penalties which the City of San Antonio may be entitled to recover by reason of the failure on

the part of said Railroad Company to construct said crossings; and in the event of failure of said Railroad Company to carry out the provisions of this Ordinance, then the City Attorney is hereby authorized to proceed to enforce the provisions hereof, and the laws and Ordinances applicable thereto.

SECTION SEVEN: This Ordinance is declared to be of urgent public welfare apparent therefrom, and the same shall take effect immediately after its passage and approval.
