## AN ORDINANCE

Accepting the proposal of the Mission Wood & Coal Co., Inc., for supplying Lump Coal.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

That the City of San Antonio does hereby accept the attached written proposal of the Mission Wood & Coal Co., dated the twenty-eight day of October, 1933, offering the requirements of the Street Maintenance Department of the City for Lump Coal for the City of San Antonio, in accordance with the specifications, description and conditions contained in said proposal which is a part hereof, upon the condition that said contractor making said proposal shall comply strictly with all requirements made under the stipulations of this ordinance and all instruments referred to herein which are made a part hereof by reference.

The contractor will furnish the City with one car-load of New Trojan Lump Coal from the semi-anthracite district near Steigler, Oklahoma, represented in said proposal as being of the following specifications:

Vol. Mat.	32.	" "	
F. Carbon	60	" "	
Ash	6	" "	and containing 14,500 B T U'S,

in bulk carload, delivered to the railway siding of the St. Maintenance Department, as designated at a price of Six Dollars (\$6.40) and forty cents per ton of two thousand pounds, delivery to be made promptly as shipping will permit. It is understood that the supplies to be furnished hereunder are to be of the kind and grade proposed and that all conditions of said proposal are to be adhered to strictly. Upon the failure of said contractor to furnish the merchandise of

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proper kind and grade at the specified time and at the designated place, the City shall have the right, without cost or obligation to the City, to purchase the proper supplies from whom and at such time and under such conditions as it, the City, may deem to be to its best interest, and any expense and the cost in so doing shall be borne by the said contractor, the Mission Wood and Coal Co., Inc., of San Antonio, Texas.

If any dispute arises between the contractor and the City as to the meaning of any part of the specifications, description or conditions, or as to the manner of performance of the contract arising from the said proposal and this acceptance, or any parts thereof, or as to the quantity or quality of the merchandise tendered, the decision of the Purchasing Agent of the City in such matters shall be final and conclusive, and any doubt as to the meaning of any of the included instruments shall be decided and construed by the Purchasing Agent, who shall give all directions or explanations necessary to give due effect to the same and to make clear any conflict or uncertainty therein.

The acceptance and exercise of any right under this contract by the contractor shall be an acceptance of all its terms and conditions.

All other bids covered by the specification in this ordinance or alternatively considered, are hereby rejected.
