AN ORDINANCE

AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO TO BORROW \$2,500.00 FROM THE ALAMO NATIONAL BANK AND THE FROST NATIONAL BANK TO PAY THE CURRENT EXPENSES OF THE CITY FOR PUBLIC LIBRARIES.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

1. That, for the purpose of paying the current expenses of the City of San Antonio for the support and maintenances of the public libraries of said City for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1932, there shall be borrowed and secured from the Alamo National Bank an advance of money in the sum of \$1,250.00, and from the Frost National Bank an advance of money in the sum of \$1,250.00 as provided by the charter and ordinances of said City, which amounts do not exceed the estimated current revenue and income of said City for said fiscal year applicable to said purpose.
2. That, to evidence said loans and advances by said banks, there shall be executed and delivered to them two promissory notes of the City of San Antonio, numbered consecutively from 25 to 26, both inclusive, the note bearing number 25 to be payable to said Alamo National Bank and the note bearing number 26 to be payable to said Frost National Bank, all as provided by the Charter and Ordinances of the City of San Antonio, which notes shall be of the denomination of \$1,250.00 each, aggregating \$2,500.00, and shall bear interest at the rate of 6% per annum from date until maturity, provided, that interest shall be paid on money actually advanced on said notes and only from the dates of advancement to the dates of payment, and, provided, that said notes shall bear interest at the rate of 7% per annum after maturity until paid; said notes shall be signed by the Mayor, countersigned by the City Auditor, and attested by the

City Clerk, and the corporate seal of the City shall be affixed thereto; all advances shall be made on lawful warrants and/or notes which shall provide maturity not later than the 1st day of July, 1933, with privilege of prepayment prior to maturity; and the said warrants and/or notes given by said City to said banks shall constitute a first lien upon the revenue and fund arising from the special tax levied and collected to create such Library Fund for said fiscal year, and said taxes and revenues are hereby irrevocably pledged for the payment of said loans and advances, and said warrants and/or notes and all interest thereon shall be paid from said taxes and current income and revenues before said taxes, income and revenues may be lawfully appropriated from any other purpose whatever.

3. That the proceeds of said loans shall be used to pay the current expenses of the City of San Antonio as provided by the Library Fund Ordinance of said City, for said fiscal year, and the remainder shall be retained in said fund subject to the stipulation thereof.

4. That the money to be borrowed by the City from said banks as above provided shall be borrowed as provided by and in accordance with the terms of the contract between the City and the banks for the loan thereof by the banks to the City, which contract is set out in and evidenced by ordinance passed by the Commissioners of said City, dated June 28, 1932, and recorded in Vol. "L", p. 126, et seq., of the Minutes of the Commissioners of said City.

5. The form of said notes shall be substantially as follows:

CITY OF SAN ANTONIO LIBRARY FUND NOTE - 1932

The City of San Antonio, a municipal corporation, in the County of Bexar and State of Texas, for value received, acknowledges itself indebted and hereby promises to pay to the order of _____, San Antonio, Texas, on or before the 1st of July, 1933, the principal sum of \$1,250.00 in lawful money of the United States of America, together with interest thereon from date hereof until maturity, at the rate of 6% per annum payable monthly, and at the rate of 7% per annum after maturity until paid.

This note is one of a series of two notes, numbered 25 and 26, both inclusive, of the denomination of \$1,250.00 each, aggregating \$2,500.00 authorized to be issued from time to time by the City of San Antonio to the Alamo National Bank and the Frost National Bank, of San Antonio, Texas, evidencing loans made to said City by said banks, for the purpose of paying indebtedness incurred and to be incurred for current expenses of said City for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1932 and ending May 31, 1933, said notes having been issued under and by virtue of the charter and ordinances of the City of San Antonio, and the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, and in pursuance of an ordinance passed by the Commissioners of said City on the 20th day of February, 1933, which ordinance is recorded in Vol. No. _____, p. _____ et seq., in the Minutes of the City Commissioners of said City.

The date of this note, in conformity with said ordinance, is the date of advancement and payment to the City by the payee herein of the amount hereof.

It is hereby certified and recited that all acts, conditions and things required to be done precedent to and in the issuance of this series of notes have been done, and performed and have happened in regular and due time, form and manner, as required by law; and that a special advalorem tax of two cents on each \$100.00 valuation on all property within the limits of said City subject to taxation, has been duly levied as authorized by the ordinances creating the Library Fund of said City for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1932 and ending May 31, 1933, and that the said special taxes have been and are hereby irrevocably pledged for the punctual payment of the principal and interest of this series of notes."

6. That the Mayor of said City be and he is hereby authorized to execute and deliver said promissory notes to the payees thereof upon payment by said payee of the amount designated in each of said notes, said notes to be delivered to the payee in consecutive numerical order hereinabove designated.

ML-515 AN ORDINANCE

AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO TO BORROW \$18,000.00 TO PAY PART OF THE EXPENSES OF THE CITY FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 1932.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

1. That, to pay the debts of the City of San Antonio incurred for current expenses during the fiscal year 1932, beginning the 1st day of June, 1932, and ending the 31st day of May, 1933, including contingent expenses arising during said fiscal year which can be provided lawfully out of the General Fund of the City for said fiscal year and obligations of the City created during said fiscal year which can be provided lawfully out of the General Fund of the City for said fiscal year and to pay the current expenses of said City for the remainder of said fiscal year, including such contingent expenses, and the obligations created therefor, there shall be borrowed for the use of the City in anticipation of the receipts of taxes levied for said fiscal year and in anticipation of the current revenues for that year, from the Alamo National Bank, and Frost National Bank, a loan of money for said purposes in the amount of \$18,000.00 which amount together with the advances and loans by the Frost National Bank, the Alamo National Bank, and the South Texas Bank and Trust Company, under contracts with the City of San Antonio, and money to be advanced and to be lent by the Frost National Bank, the Alamo National Bank, and the South Texas Bank and Trust Company, under contracts for the current fiscal year, and the loans made by the said banks and other banks aggregating \$30,000.00 and evidenced by City of San Antonio 1932 General Fund Notes 79 to 89, both inclusive, which are included herein by reference, do not exceed the estimated amount of income of the City for such fiscal year, based upon the assessed value, the tax rate thereon, and other revenue of the City from other sources.

2. Promissory notes of the City of San Antonio as hereinafter specified shall be executed to evidence said loans and advances and shall be delivered to said banks as herein provided, as specified under the power vested in the City of San Antonio by its Charter, by the laws of the State of Texas, and by the Constitution of the State of Texas.

3. Said notes shall be numbered consecutively from 90 to 95, both, inclusive, and shall be payable to the persons and in the amounts as specified in the following tabulation:

5. All said notes shall be dated the day and date they are executed, and shall bear

interest at the rate of 6% per annum from date thereof; calculated and payable monthly, as it accrues, provided, that interest shall be paid only on cash actually advanced on said notes and only from the dates of such advancements, and, provided, that said notes or advancements made by said banks to said City shall draw interest after the maturity thereof at the rate of 7% per annum; said notes shall be signed by the Mayor, countersigned by the City Auditor of said City, and attested by the City Clerk of said City, and the corporate seal of said City shall be impressed upon each of said notes; said notes shall provide for final maturity not later than July 1, 1933, with privilege of prepayment prior to maturity.

6. The taxes levied for the current fiscal year and the other revenues of the City of San Antonio for said fiscal year, and all uncollected and unpledged back taxes for previous years, are hereby pledged irrevocably for the payment of the said notes and loans specified above; subject and inferior to notes 1 to 78, both inclusive, issued to the Alamo National Bank and issued to the Frost National Bank under the authority of an Ordinance passed and approved on the 28th day of June, 1932, authorizing the City of San Antonio to borrow \$1,525,000.00 to pay the current expenses of the City during the fiscal year 1932, but except as specified herein notes 90 to 95, both inclusive, shall constitute a first lien upon all of the said taxes and revenues of the City of San Antonio, and shall be paid therefrom before any such taxes, revenues or income may be appropriated to any other purpose or object, the holders of said City of San Antonio 1932 General Fund Notes 79 to 89, both inclusive, agreeing thereto without prejudice otherwise to their said notes and the liens securing same.

7. The proceeds of this loan of \$18,000.00 shall be used as follows: \$3,000.00 for Corporation Court purposes and \$15,000.00 for judgments and suits purposes, and the remainder if any, shall be used to pay the debts of the City of San Antonio incurred legally for the current expenses of said City during said current fiscal year, as stipulated in the Charter and Ordinances of said City.

8. The form of said notes shall be substantially as follows:

City of San Antonio, a municipality of the State of Texas, in the County of Bexar, for value received, promises hereby to pay to the order of (- - - Name of Bank - - -) of San Antonio, Texas, on or before the 1st day of July, A. D. 1933, at the office of the Treasurer of the City of San Antonio, the principal sum of (- - - State amount in dollars - -) in lawful money of the United States of America, together with interest thereon from the date hereof until maturity at the rate of 6% per annum payable monthly and at the rate of 7% per annum after maturity until paid.

This note is one of a series of 6 notes numbered from 90 to 95, both inclusive, aggregating \$18,000.00 authorized to be issued by the City of San Antonio to the City by said bank to pay certain indebtedness for current expenses of said City during the fiscal year 1932 and to supply funds to pay the current expenses of said City for remainder of said fiscal year, said notes having been issued under the authority of the Charter and Ordinances of the City of San Antonio and the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, and in pursuance of an Ordinance passed by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio on the 20 day of February, 1933, which Ordinance is recorded in the Minutes of the City Commission and is included herein by reference for all intents and purposes.

The date of this note shall be the date of the loan and the delivery of the money to the City of San Antonio by the payee as stipulated in said Ordinance.

It is hereby certified and recited that all acts, conditions and things required to be done present to and in the issuance of this series of notes have been done and performed properly and have happened in regular and due time, form and manner, as stipulated by law; and that the full faith and credit of the City of San Antonio and the current taxes and the current revenues of said City for the current fiscal year 1932, and all uncollected and unpledged back taxes for previous years, are pledged hereby for the punctual payment of the amount of this series of notes, subject, however, to the prior payment of notes 1 to 78, both inclusive, heretofore authorized and superior to this series."

9. The City of San Antonio has levied a tax as stipulated by law at a rate sufficient to produce a return sufficient to pay the series of notes specified herein according to their tenor and effect.

10. The Mayor of the City of San Antonio is hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver said notes to the payees herein specified upon the payment by said payees of the amount designated in each of said notes.

The sum of \$5,890.14 be and the same is hereby appropriated out of Improvement District No. 9, payable to Alamo National Bank of San Antonio, Texas, for the purchase of one (1) Bond No. 88 of Library Bonds of 1928 for \$965.00 and accrued interest of \$2.24 on same from February 19, 1933, inclusive; and, for the purchase of five (5) Bonds Nos. 66 to 70 inclusive of Flood Prevention Bonds of 1924 at \$977.50 each, totaling \$4,887.50, and accrued interest of \$35.40 on same from January 1, 1933, to February 21, 1933, inclusive, These Bonds are being purchased as an investment for Sinking Fund - Improvement District No. 9.

On motion, duly seconded and carried, the meeting adjourned.
