PROHIBITING FISHING IN WOODLAWN LAKE, EXCEPT BY CERTAIN MEANS AND DURING CERTAIN HOURS ON CERTAIN DAYS AND LIMITING CATCH AS TO NUMBER AND SIZE OF CERTAIN FISH AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR VIOLATION HEREOF.

Zeller, representing the San Antonio Anglers' Club, addressed the Council in behalf of this ordinance, and asked that it be amended to allow fishing on Thursdays as well as Tuesdays and Saturdays. Accordingly, the amendment was written in and the ordinance passed and approved by roll call vote, to-wit: Ayes, Mauermann, Callaghan, Hein, Steffler and Anderson.

The following bids were opened/and referred to the Purchasing Agent: Bids to furnish helmets and foam generator for Fire Department; bids on improvements to tennis courts at Lions Field, and bids on asphalt surfacing various walks in Brackenridge and Koehler Parks.

Bids on improvement of West Avenue, from Fredericksburg Road to the North City Limits were opened and publicly read and referred to the City Engineer.

Two bids were opened and publicly read on construction of sanitary sewer on east side of Nogalitos St. between Gladstone and Division Aves. City Engineer Coghill stated it was necessary to start work as soon as possible on this sewer, as it is to serve a new theatre building which is under construction. He recommended that the bid of George E. Brombaugh be accepted as the low bid. On motion of Commissioner Steffler, seconded by Commissioner Hein and carried by roll call vote, to-wit: Ayes, Mauermann, Callaghan, Hein, Steffler, Anderson, the Council concurred in the recommendation of the Engineers and accepted the Brombaugh bid.
