CONFIRMING THE CITY MANAGER'S APPOINTMENT OF

AN ORDINANCE 25,996

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE CONSTRUCTION AND MAINTENANCE OF THE PORTION OF HIGHWAY NO. I.H. 10 IN THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, BETWEEN THE FOLLOWING LIMITS, TO-WIT: FROM THE NORTHWEST CITY LIMIT LINE OF SAN ANTONIO TO THE INTERSECTION OF I.H. 10 AND LOOP 13 HIGHWAYS IN NORTHWEST SAN ANTONIO AS A CONTROLLED ACCESS HIGHWAY AND AS A STREET, HEREINAFTER REFERRED TO AS "THE PROJECT" AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OF THE CITY TO EXECUTE AND THE CITY CLERK TO AFFIX THE CORPORATE SEAL AND ATTEST THE SAME, A CERTAIN CONTRACT, BETWEEN THE CITY AND THE STATE OF TEXAS PROVIDING FOR THE CONSTRUCTION, MAINTENANCE, EXISTENCE AND USE OF SAID PROJECT AS A CONTROLLED ACCESS HIGHWAY AND AS A STREET, AND DETERMINING THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE CITY AND THE STATE OF TEXAS WITH REFERENCE THERETO; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY AND PROVIDING THAT THE ORDINANCE SHALL BE EFFECTIVE FROM AND AFTER ITS PASSAGE

The Mayor then called upon the Assistant City Manager for a report on the availability and recommendation for the use of the Sunken Garden Theatre in Brackenridge Park by the Lions Club of San Antonio for the purpose of sponsoring a production of the Oberammergau Passion Play. Mr. Andrews, the Assisant City Manager, first read excerpts from the minutes of the Parks and Recreation Advisory Board meeting held today.

Then he made a report on expenditures that will be required for staging of this pageant as follows:

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NECESSARY EXPENDITURES REQUIRED
FOR
STAGING OF THE OBERAMMERGAU PASSION PLAY

After study and investigation, the following is an estimate of expenditures required in order to properly equip and operate the Sunken Garden Theater for the production of the Oberammergau Passion Play, for a period of ten weeks, 6 nights per week.

CAPITAL OUTLAY - (For equipment which could be used in other city functions)

1,000 folding chairs @ \$5.00 each \$ 5,000.00

MAINTENANCE - (Maintenance would be required if this facility is to be used for any purpose)

(1) Repair to 121 seats @ \$2.25 each \$ 262.25
(2) Painting of seats 500.00

Total Maintenance \$ 762.25

Total Capital Outlay and Maintenance \$ 5,762.25
(Expenditures required normally)

CAPITAL OUTLAY, MAINTENANCE AND EQUIPMENT - (Required for the production of Passion Play only)

(1) Two wooden platforms - 10' x 20' \$ 300.00
(2) Grading and clearing top of cliff 400.00
(3) Janitorial service for 10 weeks, at \$192.00 per week 1,920.00
(4) Repair after wear and tear 500.00
(5) Contingencies 500.00

Total Capital Outlay, Maintenance and Equipment \$ 3,620.00
(For production of Passion Play only)

Total expenditures required of the City is \$9,382.25, of which \$5,762.25 is for equipment or maintenance which would eventually have to be provided in normal operations. A total of \$3,620.00 is for expenditures directly for the staging of the Passion Play.

Therefore, it is recommended by the Director of Parks and Recreation that a charge be made sufficient to cover the actual cost of maintenance and operations directly connected with the staging of the Passion Play, in the amount of \$3,620.00 for the 10 week run, which amounts to a charge of \$60.00 per performance for the use of the Sunken Garden Theater.

It is further recommended that the sponsoring organization is to pay for electrical power, parking attendants, ushers, and for any other expenses which might be required.

The Zoological Society has consented to lend three camels for the production; however, the sponsoring organization must pay for services of an attendant to bring the camels over and to take them back to the Zoo.

It is further recommended that the dates of August 11th, 12th, and 13th, 8 a.m. to 12 noon be reserved for the purpose of rehearsing of the Recreation Division's Summer Finale. And that the evenings of August 14th and 15th be reserved for dress rehearsal and performance.

Mr. Andrews then recommended that the Sunken Garden Theatre be made available to the Lions Club or any other organization for the rental of \$75.00 per day and that a contract for ten weeks, six days to a week, be permitted at this rate.
