Providing for borrowing for borrowing Sixty Thousand Dollars from the Alamo National Bank of San Antonio, Texas, for the use of the City.

On motion of Commissioner Lambert, duly seconded and carried, deed to a small triangular piece of land out of N.C.B.2997 tendered by Mr. T.H.Ridgeway was accepted.

Commissioner Lambert recommended that petition for sanitary sewers in Pruitt Avenue be granted and work started as soon as School Board transfers sanitary laterals to City Adopted.

Commissioner Lambert recommended that the petition of Jose Bustos for meat market at 1118 Perez Street be granted. Adopted.

Commissioner Lambert submitted the following proposition from the San Antonio School Board, which was read and adopted by the following vote on roll call, to-wit: Ayes, Brown, Garland, Lambert and Uhr. Absent, Kearny.

STATE OF TEXAS
COUNTY OF BEXAR

WHEREAS, the San Antonio Independent School District is a public corporation organized and existing under and by virtue of a special act of the Legislature of Texas, and is under the management and control of its Board of Trustees known and designated as the San Antonio School Board; and

WHEREAS, said School corporation has heretofore constructed and now owns and controls, under authority of the City of San Antonio, duly granted by ordinance or otherwise, certain sanitary sewers connecting with said City's sanitary sewer mains and laterals, and located in the public streets of said City, the said sanitary sewers so owned and controlled by the said San Antonio School Board, and which are referred to in this contract, being the sewers connecting with the following public schools in San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas, to-wit:

- 1; Sewer connecting with Starr Street School No.12
2. Sewer connecting with Guadalupe School No. 21
3. Sewer connecting with School on N.Hackberry & Center Streets;
4. Sewer connecting with Brooklyn Street School No. 16; and

WHEREAS, the said San Antonio School Board has agreed that the said above mentioned sewers so owned by said School corporation connecting with said four schools, shall become fully a part of the public sanitary sewers of the City of San Antonio, on the conditions hereafter set out.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT KNOWN: That the San Antonio School Board of the San Antonio Independent School District, acting herein by and through its President and Secretary, thereunto duly authorized by proper resolution of said Board, for and in consideration of the construction by the said City of San Antonio, to be executed and an additional sanitary sewer, to extend from S. Flores Street in said City, to the public School known as Collins Garden School No. 27, located in the Collins Garden tract, that portion of said sewer which will extend from S.Flores Street to Nogalitos Street to be ten inches in diameter, and that portion thereof which is to extend from Nogalitos Street to said school to be eight inches in diameter; said entire sewer to be constructed and completed during the year 1916, and said School Board to have the right at any and all times hereafter to make all necessary connections with said sewer

free of cost to said Board; does hereby transfer, assign, convey, release and quit claim to said City of San Antonio, for use as public sewers, all and singular the rights, title and interest of said school corporation in and to all parts of said above mentioned school sewers, except such parts of the same as are located on property owned by said school corporation; and no charges shall hereafter be collected for the benefit of said school corporation from any persons hereafter making connections with such school sewers above mentioned.

This conveyance, however, is subject to, is made and accepted upon the following express conditions which constitute a part of the consideration for this said conveyance, to-wit:

1st; Said school corporation expressly reserves the right to make all such additional connections with said sewers as may hereafter become necessary for school purposes, and the said City shall make no charge to the said school corporation for any such connections.

2nd. All contracts, if any, heretofore made by said school corporation with any person or persons, by the terms of which any such person or persons have been granted the right to connect with any of said sewers, either without cost or upon payment of certain sums specified in such contracts, shall remain in full force and effect and shall be binding on and shall be complied with by said City as fully and as absolutely as if said contracts had been originally executed by said City; the said City hereby assuming and agreeing to carry out all of the terms and conditions imposed upon said school corporation by the terms of all of such contracts; and this conveyance being subject to all such rights in and to the said sewers as may be held by any such person or persons by virtue of any such contracts so heretofore executed by said school corporation to such person or persons.

3rd. In the event the said City shall fail or refuse to so construct and complete the said sewer to the said Collins Garden School hereinabove referred to, within the time hereinabove set out, then this conveyance shall become null and void and shall be of no further force and effect, and all rights and property hereby conveyed shall revert to and become re-invested in the said school corporation without the necessity of any further proceedings; it being the intention that this conveyance shall become effective in accordance with its terms and conditions only upon the completion by the City of said sanitary sewer to said Collins Garden School as hereinabove provided.

With reference to the sewer connecting with the Herff School on the corner of Indiana and Hackberry Streets, the said San Antonio School Board heretofore on August 13, 1912, entered into a contract with M.E.Hansen and others (a copy of which said contract is hereto attached, marked Exhibit "A" and made a part hereof), by the terms of which it was agreed that said Board should thereafter own and control said entire line of sewer until said Board should receive for connections all of the money put in by said Board for the construction of said sewer, the amount to be so received by said Board being \$698.00; the total original cost of said sewer being about \$1643.00, of which said sum \$945.00 was subscribed by the said Hansen and the other citizens named in said contract; said contract specifically providing that after said board shall have received for connections with said sewer said sum of \$698.00, that the ownership of said line of sewer should thereupon become vested in said citizens named in said contract, who contributed to the building and construction of said sewer, and said line of sewer should be thereupon turned over to them; and further, the said Hansen and others being granted and allowed free connections, with privileges of selling their rights of connection together with their lot or lots; and the said School Board agreeing not to allow anyone to connect with said sewer (other than those persons named) for less than \$35.00 for each connection. Since the date of said contract, the said School Board has received for connections with said sewer, the sum of \$_____; leaving a balance of \$_____ which the said board still has the right to collect for such connections as may be hereafter made with said sewer, under the terms of said contract, before turning said line of sewer over to the said Hansen and the others named in said contract; and said school corporation does hereby also transfer, assign and convey unto the said City of San Antonio, for the considerations and upon the conditions hereinabove set forth out, all such rights as said school corporation now has in said Herff School sewer under said contract with the said Hansen and others; said rights of said school corporation however, consisting only of the right to hereafter collect and receive, for such connections as may be hereafter made with said sewer, the said balance of \$_____, after which all rights of the said school board, and of the said City, in and to said sewer line, shall cease, and said sewer shall be turned over to the said Hansen and others in accordance with said contract; and by the acceptance of of this said conveyance, the said City of San Antonio hereby recognizes the existence of said contract, and expressly assumes all of the obligations imposed upon the said school board by the terms of said contract, and agree to carry out and comply with the terms of said contract with the said Hansen and others.

August 13, 1912

Received of M.E.Hansen, check amounting to Seven Hundred and Seventy Dollars (\$770.00) and cash amounting to One Hundred and Forty Dollars (\$140.00) making a total of Nine Hundred and Ten Dollars (\$910.00) leaving Thirty-five Dollars uncollected which M.E. Hansen agrees to collect and turn into the San Antonio School Board, which will bring the total up to Nine Hundred and Forty-five Dollars (\$945.00)

This money is to be used by the School Board to build a sewer line beginning at Plum St., on Delaware, east on Delaware to So. Mesquite, north on So. Mesquite about 520 feet (as shown in red lines of map), also from So. Mesquite on Indiana to Hackberry St. in front of the Ferd Herff School. Now in consideration of the Nine Hundred and Ten Dollars (\$910.00) and of Thirty Five Dollars (\$35.00) yet to be turned in by M.E.Hansen inside of ten days, the School Board agrees to accept the bid of Wm. G. Schuwirth & Co., of Sixteen Hundred and Forty Three Dollars (\$1643.00) and pay the difference which is Six

Hundred and Ninety -eight Dollars (\$698.00)

It is further agreed and understood that the School Board will own and control the entire line until they have received for connections all the money they have put in, and then the line will be turned over to the citizens who contributed to the building of the said line. The following have contributed to the said line are to be allowed free connections together with their lot or lots;

All of the above conditions subject to the passing of an ordinance by the City Council authorizing the construction of said sewer line.

WHEREAS, the San Antonio Independent School District has transferred and set over to the City of San Antonio, Texas, all its right and ownership in and to a private sewer connecting with the Herff School, corner Hack berry and Indiana Streets and

WHEREAS, M.E.Hansen and others are joint owners of said private sewer having invested \$945.00 in its construction, the City of San Antonio agrees that said Hansen and others shall have the right to collect \$35.00 for each connection made to said private sewer until the full amount of \$945.00 has been repaid to said Hansen and associates.

MB-278 AN ORDINANCE

Granting permit to W. A. Baity to construct sanitary sewer in Henrietta Street;

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, that,

Section 1. That permission is hereby granted W.A.Baity to construct an 8" sanitary sewer in Henrietta Street beginning at the end of said stub, 40 feet north of the center of Temple Street and extending to the center of Barbee Street, according to plat, line and grade made by the City Engineer hereto attached; the cost of said sewer being estimated about Three Hundred and Fifty nine Dollars (\$359.00) to be paid by the said W.A.Baity. The final actual cost to be filed with the City Engineer within ten (10) days after the completion of the sewer.

Section 2. Said sewer when completed to become the property of the City of San Antonio and part of its public sewer system.

Section 3. The City Engineer is hereby directed to collect the sum of Twenty Dollars (\$20) for each and every connection made with said sewer main or house service going into said main and pay the same over to the said W.A.Beatty, Trustee, not later than the 10th day of each month following the month in which said connection is made until the sum of Three Hundred and Fifty Nine Dollars(\$359.00) being the actual cost of said sewer shall have been collected and paid over as aforesaid, when no further

connection fee of Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) shall be collected.

This ordinance is here by declared to be of urgent importance for reasons of public welfare apparent herefrom, and the same shall take effect at once.

Petition of Lowry and Doolin for permit to erect an electric sign at Travis and St. Mary Streets, and Boston Shoe repairing, for permit to erect an electric sign at 110 W. Houston Street was granted.

Petitions of Stires Out Door Adv. Co. for permit to erect billboards at Grayson and Pine Streets and Locust and San Pedro Ave. were read and referred to Commissioner of Fire and Police.

Commissioner Uhr recommended that petition of B'nai Zion Association for permit to conduct circus at Bowens Island; also petition of Dixie Tire Shop, for permit to install gasoline tank at 1421 S. Flores Street, be granted. Adopted.

A communication from the Chief of the Fire Department recommending the purchase of 5000 feet of hose from the Eureka Fire Hose Company, was read and adopted on recommendation of Commissioner Uhr.

Commissioner Uhr submitted the following names for appointment in the Police Department, and the same were confirmed by unanimous vote of Commissioners present:

M. D. Roark, F. East and A. H. McLean, as Extra Policemen.

T. J. Sammons, F. Fest and W. T. Carver, Policemen.

The following parties submitted proposals for building a garage at the Central Fire and Police Station, to-wit: E. W. Offinger, H. H. Bogus, Arend and Vogel and Jacob Bausbach, which were read and referred to City Building Inspector.

On motion, duly seconded and carried, the Mayor was authorized to employ a Stock and Inventory Clerk at a salary of \$75.00 per month.

Mayor Brown requested leave of absence from the City extending to Dec 2, which was granted.

MB-249 AN ORDINANCE

Ordering the laying of sidewalks, etc, on various streets, under the penalties for failure to comply with said order.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO

WHEREAS the City Commissioners in the exercise of the Police Power, finds and hereby declares a public necessity for the laying of sidewalks etc, as hereinafter ordered; and

WHEREAS by an ordinance heretofore on the 10th day of August A.D.1914, passed and approved this City Commissioners provided for such cases; said ordinance being entitled "An Ordinance prescribing specifications for sidewalks and Curbing for Public Streets and Places, and providing measures to compel the laying, Construction and repair of the same by Owners of abutting property; requiring the cost thereof to be paid by the owners of such property and declaring such cost a personal liability of such owners, and a first and prior lien and charge against such property; and prescribing the manner of ordering and compelling the construction of such work, and the punishment for failure to comply with such orders", and proceeding hereupon in accordance with said previous ordinance, which is made a part hereof;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED;

Section One. That the construction of cement sidewalks be and the same is hereby ordered along or in front of the entire extent of each parcel of the property and premises hereinafter described, and that the owners of such premises proceed immediately to construct said improvements, or to cause same to be constructed at their cost and expense, on the streets and public places hereinafter named; the respective premises herein referred to, the owner or owners thereof to whom this order is addressed and each such respective street or public place being as follows, to-wit:
