BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that,

1. That the sum of \$100.00 or as much thereof as is necessary, be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the 1932 General Fund, Sewage Plant, to pay J. J. Appelt and wife, Mary K.

Appelt, to acquire an easement for the right-of-way for the Outfall Sewer Ditch, and purposes incidental thereto, upon and across a tract of land out of the J. M. Uriegas Survey No. 32, out of the land conveyed to J. J. Appelt and wife, Mary K. Appelt by R. J. Boyle and J. R. Davis, said land being about 8 miles south of San Antonio on the east side of the Corpus Christi Road.

ML-349 AN ORDINANCE

Granting the petition of Mrs. J. L. Sullivan for permission to connect with the City Sanitary Sewers.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION ONE. That the petition of Mrs. J. L. Sullivan residing at No. 303 Burr Road, County Block No. 5644-B, Lot No. 103, North Brae Addition, outside City Limits, for permission to connect her premises with the City Sewer main, constructed by John Hagy, be and the same is hereby granted, subject to the following conditions:

(1) That the permit hereby granted is purely temporary in and the City reserves the right to revoke same at any time, with or without notice, for any reason that may in the judgment of the City be sufficient.

(2) That the connection with the City sewer be made under the direction of the Commissioners of Streets and Public Improvements, and at such time, place, and in such manner as he may direct,

(3) That this permit is intended to cover only the sewerage from the residence of Mrs. J. L. Sullivan, the said petitioner, as same is now situated on her said premises located at No. 303 Burr Road, outside of the City Limits, and no other person or persons shall be allowed or permitted by the person to whom this permit is granted, his agents, servants, or employees, to use said City Sanitary Sewers through the connection here permitted to be made.

(4) That the use to made of their said sewers connecting with the City sewer system shall be subject to the regulation and direction of the City and no use shall be made thereof which might in any way impair the City sewer system or cause same to be obstructed or damaged in any manner whatsoever.

(5) That in consideration of the permit hereby granted and the service to be rendered the said grantee hereunder, said grantee agrees to pay to the City of San Antonio, as a rental charge the schedule of fees fixed, and to be fixed, by the ordinances of the City of San Antonio, said rental commencing on the date connection is made with the City Sanitary Sewers, but in the event the permit hereby granted is cancelled for any reason, the prorata amount of said rental shall be returned, less any expense incurred by the City in the premises.

(6) That the inspectors of the City shall have free access to the grantee's premises and all buildings situated thereon during the continuance of this permit and while said premises are connected with said City Sanitary Sewers, for the purpose of inspecting the condition of the plumbing and the use of said sewers, and that all conditions as herein embodied are being faithfully observed.

(7) All expense incident to making this connection with the City Sewers shall be borne by the petitioner, and the petitioner shall indemnify, hold and save harmless the City against any

loss or damage of any character whatsoever incident to or caused by her use of the facilities here now granted him.

(8) This Ordinance shall become effective upon the filing by the petitioner of her written acceptance of same with the City Clerk.
