MEETING OF THE MAYOR AN COMMISSIONERS, SITTING AS A COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE, HELD IN THE OFFICE OF THE MAYOR, AT 2:30 P.M. JULY 24, 1947.

PRESENT:

The petitions of M. L. Fisher, Airline Taxi Service; K. M. Fisher, White & Blue Cab Company and Checker Cab Company; A. H. Lumpkin, Attorney for Bellinger Taxi Company, and Jim Hartfield, Bellinger Taxi Agency, relative to taxicab ordinance were taken up, but representative to protestants and Police and Fire Commissioner South had agreed on an amicable settlement of the dispute, and new licenses are to be granted in lieu of those voided.

The Committee directed the City Attorney to draw proper papers for renewing the franchise of the Texas Transportation Company for a period of ten years.
