AN ORDINANCE - 104

ASSENTING TO THE REVOCABLE LICENSE FOR LAND FOR THE WIDENING OF NORTH ALAMO STREET AT THE POST-OFFICE SITE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That this ordinance creates and manifests the assent of the City of San Antonio to all the terms and conditions of the communication of the Assistant Secretary of the Treasury, dated the 21 of December 1933, wherein a revocable license is granted to the City of San Antonio for the use of a 10 foot strip of government land along the entire North Alamo Street side of the
