

AN ORDINANCE:

ORDERING AN ELECTION TO BE HELD IN THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, BEXAR COUNTY, TEXAS, FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE QUALIFIED TAXPAYING ELECTORS OF SAID CITY, EIGHT (8) CERTAIN SEPARATE PROPOSITIONS TO BORROW MONEY ON THE CREDIT OF SAID CITY, AND TO ISSUE BONDS OF SAID CITY THEREFOR, THE PROCEEDS FROM THE SALE OF WHICH SHALL BE USED IN EFFECTING AND CONSTRUCTING THE FOLLOWING PERMANENT PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS IN AND FOR SAID CITY, VIZ: (A) BONDS IN THE SUM OF \$600,000.00 FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSTRUCTING A PERMANENT SYSTEM OF SEWERAGE DISPOSAL AND PERMANENT SANITARY SEWERS AND DRAINS, AND ACQUIRING ANY PARCELS OF LAND WHICH MAY BE NECESSARY THEREFOR; (B) BONDS IN THE SUM OF \$750,000.00 FOR THE PURPOSE OF OPENING, WIDENING AND STRAIGHTENING PUBLIC STREETS AND PUBLIC PLACES, AND ACQUIRING ANY PARCELS OF LAND WHICH MAY BE NECESSARY THEREFOR; (C) BONDS IN THE SUM OF \$1,000,000.00 FOR THE PURPOSE OF PERMANENTLY PAVING AND GRADING THE PUBLIC STREETS AND PUBLIC PLACES OF THE CITY; (D) BONDS IN THE SUM OF \$1,000,000.00 FOR THE PURPOSE OF PERMANENTLY IMPROVING THE SAN ANTONIO RIVER, SAN PEDRO AND ALAZAN CREEKS, AND DRAINAGE DITCHES AND STREAMS IN SAID CITY, BY WIDENING, DEEPENING AND CHANGING THE CHANNELS THEREOF, AND CONSTRUCTING PERMANENT LEVEES ALONG AND NEAR THE SAME, AND CONSTRUCTING PERMANENT STORM SEWERS AND DRAINS, WITH MAINS, LATERALS AND NECESSARY ACCESSORIES THERETO, AND TO ACQUIRE ANY LANDS AND OTHER PROPERTY NECESSARY THEREFOR; (E) BONDS IN THE SUM OF \$175,000.00 FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSTRUCTING BRIDGES; (F) BONDS IN THE SUM OF \$600,000.00 FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSTRUCTING SUITABLE BUILDINGS FOR THE FIRE AND POLICE DEPARTMENTS OF THE CITY, THE PURCHASE OF APPARATUS, AND PERMANENT FIRE ALARM AND POLICE SIGNAL SYSTEMS IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, AND ACQUIRING NECESSARY SITES THEREFOR; (G) BONDS IN THE SUM OF \$700,000.00 FOR THE PURPOSE OF ACQUIRING LAND AND SITES FOR PUBLIC PARKS AND CONSTRUCTING PERMANENT PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS IN THE PUBLIC PARKS OF SAID CITY; (H) BONDS IN THE SUM OF \$150,000.00 FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSTRUCTING PERMANENT IMPROVEMENTS AND ADDITIONS TO THE PRESENT CITY HOSPITAL.

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WHEREAS, the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio deem it necessary and advisable to issue bonds of said City for the respective purposes and in the respective amounts hereinafter specified, and desire to submit said propositions to the taxpaying voters as required by law; THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That an election be and is hereby ordered to be held in the City of San Antonio, on Wednesday, the 7th day of May, A. D. 1930, and the Mayor of said City be and he is hereby authorized and directed to issue his proclamation calling said election on said date, at which

election eight (8) certain separate propositions to borrow money on the credit of said City, for the purpose of effecting and constructing permanent public improvements in the said City, shall be submitted to the qualified taxpaying voters of said City, as follows, to-wit:

A:- SANITARY SEWER BONDS: \$600,000.00.

A-2. Shall the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow money on the credit of said City, and issue bonds of said City therefor, for permanent public improvements, in the sum of SIX HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$600,000.00); said bonds to be of the face denomination of ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,000.00) each, and to mature within a period of forty (40) years, viz: To be payable serially in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, each year respectively from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive.

A-3. All of said bonds to bear interest from date at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually; said Commissioners being authorized to negotiate said bonds in lots as they may determine and direct, and be authorized to levy and to assess and to collect annually, taxes sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as same become payable, and create a sinking fund, as provided by law, sufficient to pay said bonds at maturity, viz: As each of said bonds and series of bonds shall respectively mature.

A-4. Said loan being desired for the purpose of protecting the health and safety of the people of the City, by the construction of a permanent system of sewerage disposal and permanent sanitary sewers and drains, and acquiring any parcels of land which may be necessary therefor; said public improvements to be constructed being the construction of a permanent system of sewerage disposal, and permanent sanitary sewers and drains, extending and supplementing the present system of sanitary sewers and drains of said City.

B:- STREET WIDENING AND EXTENDING BONDS: \$750,000.00.

B-5. Shall the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow money on the credit of said City, and issue bonds of said City therefor, for permanent public improvements, in the sum of SEVEN HUNDRED AND FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$750,000.00); said bonds to be of the face denomination of ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,000.00) each, and to mature within a period of forty (40) years, viz: To be payable serially in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, each year respectively from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive.

B-6. All of said bonds to bear interest from date at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually; said Commissioners being authorized to negotiate said bonds in lots as they may determine and direct, and to be authorized to levy and to assess and to collect annually, taxes sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as same become payable, and create a sinking fund as provided by law, sufficient to pay said bonds at maturity, viz: As each of said bonds and series of bonds, shall respectively mature.

B-7. Said loan being desired for the purpose of permanently improving the public convenience and traffic conditions of the public streets and public places of said City, by opening, widening and straightening public streets and public places, and acquiring any parcels of land which may be necessary therefor; said public improvements to be constructed and effected being the permanent opening, widening and straightening of public streets and public places in the several wards of said City and the acquisition of any parcels of land which may be necessary therefor.

C:- STREET PAVING BONDS: \$1,000,000.00.

C-8. Shall the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow money on the credit of said City, and issue bonds of said City therefor, for permanent public improvements, in the sum of ONE MILLION DOLLARS (\$1,000,000.00); said bonds to be of the face denomination of ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,000.00) each, and to mature within a period of

forty (40) years, viz: To be payable serially in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, each year respectively, from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive.

C-9. All of said bonds to bear interest from date at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually, said Commissioners being authorized to negotiate said bonds in lots as they may determine and direct, and to be authorized to levy and to assess and to collect annually taxes sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as same become payable, and create a sinking fund as provided by law, sufficient to pay said bonds at maturity, viz: As each of said bonds and series of bonds shall respectively mature.

C-10. Said loan being desired for the purpose of improving the condition of the public streets and public places of said City by permanently paving and grading the same; said public improvements to be constructed being the paving and grading in permanent manner of public streets and public places, in the several wards of said City.

D:- STORM SEWER AND RIVER IMPROVEMENT BONDS: \$1,000,000.00.

D-11. Shall the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow money on the credit of said City, and issue bonds therefor, for permanent public improvements, in the sum of ONE MILLION DOLLARS (\$1,000,000.00); said bonds to be of the face denomination of ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,000.00) each, and to mature within a period of forty (40) years, viz: To be payable serially in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, each year respectively, from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive.

D-12. All of said bonds to bear interest from date at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually, said Commissioners being authorized to negotiate said bonds in lots as they may determine and direct, and to be authorized to levy and to assess and to collect annually, taxes sufficient to pay interest on said bonds as same become payable, and create a sinking fund as provided by law, sufficient to pay said bonds at maturity, viz: As each of said bonds and series of bonds shall respectively mature.

D-13. Said loan being desired for the purpose of permanently improving the San Antonio River, San Pedro and Alazan Creeks, and drainage ditches and streams in said City, by widening, deepening and changing the channels thereof, and constructing permanent levees and walls along and near the same; and constructing permanent storm sewers and drains, with mains, laterals and necessary accessories thereto, so as to prevent or ameliorate flood conditions, and protect the public health and safety, and to acquire any lands and other property necessary therefor, extending and supplementing the present permanent system of storm sewers and drains of said City.

E:- BRIDGE CONSTRUCTION BONDS: \$175,000.00.

E-14. Shall the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow money on the credit of said City, and issue bonds of said City therefor, for permanent public improvements, in the sum of ONE HUNDRED AND SEVENTY FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$175,000.00); said bonds to be of the face denomination of ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,000.00) each, and to mature serially in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, each year respectively, from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive.

E-15. All of said bonds to bear interest from date at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually; said Commissioners being authorized to negotiate said bonds in lots as they may determine and direct, and to be authorized to levy and to assess and to collect annually, taxes sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as same become payable, and create a sinking fund as provided by law, sufficient to pay said bonds at maturity, viz: As each of said bonds

and series of bonds shall respectively mature.

E-16. Said loan being desired for the purpose of permanently improving the condition of the public thoroughfares and public places of said City, by building permanent bridges; said improvements to be constructed being the construction of permanent bridges over streams crossing public thoroughfares and public places, in the several wards of said City.

F:- POLICE AND FIRE DEPARTMENT IMPROVEMENT
BONDS: \$600,000.00.

F-17. Shall the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow money on the credit of said City, and issue bonds of said City therefor, for permanent public improvements, in the sum of SIX HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$600,000.00); said bonds to be of the face denomination of ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,000.00) each, and to mature within a period of forty (40) years, viz: To be payable serially in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, each year respectively, from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive.

F-18. All of said bonds to bear interest from date at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually; said Commissioners being authorized to negotiate said bonds in lots as they may determine and direct, and to be authorized to levy and to assess and to collect annually, taxes sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as same become payable, and create a sinking fund as provided by law, sufficient to pay said bonds at maturity, viz: As each of said bonds and series of bonds shall respectively mature.

F-19. Said loan being desired for the purpose of permanently improving and extending the facilities and the service of the Fire Department and the Police Department of the City by the construction of permanent buildings, the acquisition of sites for the same, the erection and installation of permanent fire alarm and police signal systems, and the purchase of permanent equipment and apparatus therefor; said permanent public improvements to be the construction and acquisition of buildings for additional fire stations, police stations and the sites therefor, and permanent equipment and apparatus, and permanent fire alarm and police signal systems in connection therewith.

G:- PARK IMPROVEMENT BONDS: \$700,000.00.

G-20. Shall the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow money on the credit of said City, and issue bonds of said City therefor, for permanent public improvements, in the sum of SEVEN HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$700,000.00); said bonds to be of the face denomination of ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,000.00) each, and to mature within a period of forty (40) years, viz: To be payable serially in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, each year respectively, from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive.

G-21. All of said bonds to bear interest from date at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually; said Commissioners being authorized to negotiate said bonds in lots as they may determine and direct, and to be authorized to levy and to assess and to collect annually, taxes sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as same become payable, and create a sinking fund as provided by law, sufficient to pay said bonds at maturity, viz: As each of said bonds and series of bonds shall respectively mature.

G-22. Said loan being desired for the purpose of purchasing and acquiring land and sites for public parks and constructing permanent public improvements in the public parks of said City; said improvements to be constructed being the construction of monuments, permanent buildings, plumbing and other permanent structures in said public parks belonging to the City of San Antonio, and the purchase and acquisition of any necessary land and sites therefor.

H:- CITY HOSPITAL CONSTRUCTION BONDS: \$150,000.00.

H-23. Shall the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow money on the credit of said City and issue bonds of said City therefor, for permanent public improvements, in the sum of ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$150,000.00); said bonds to be of the face denomination of ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,000.00) each, and to mature within a period of forty (40) years, viz: To be payable serially in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, each year respectively, from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive.

H-24. All of said bonds to bear interest from date at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually; said Commissioners being authorized to negotiate said bonds in lots as they may determine and direct, and to be authorized to levy and to assess and to collect annually, taxes sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as same become payable, and create a sinking fund as provided by law, sufficient to pay said bonds at maturity, viz: As each of said bonds and series of bonds, shall respectively mature.

H-25. Said loan being desired for the purpose of constructing necessary permanent additions to the present City Hospital building; said public improvements to be constructed being the erection of permanent additions to and as part of said City Hospital Building, for the use of the public of said City.

26. The manner of holding the said election shall be governed by the laws of the State of Texas regulating general elections, and by the stipulations of the Charter of the City of San Antonio and the Ordinances of the City of San Antonio, for such elections made and provided; and, as provided by law, only those persons shall vote at the said election, who are qualified voters of the City of San Antonio, and who pay taxes on property in said City, and the ballot to be used in the said election shall be an "OFFICIAL BALLOT", arranged in such a manner that the persons qualified to vote at said election, may vote either for or against, any or all, of said propositions.

27. That the form in which the said eight (8) several propositions shall be voted on respectively, shall be substantially as hereinafter set out.

28. That at said election, all voters desiring to support the PROPOSITION A to issue bonds as hereinbefore in Section A described, shall have printed upon their ballots the words:- "FOR the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of SIX HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$600,000.00), payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of constructing a permanent system of sewerage disposal and permanent sanitary sewers and drains, and acquiring any necessary lands therefor."

29. And those opposed to said proposition to issue bonds, shall have printed upon their ballots, the words:- "AGAINST the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of SIX HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$600,000.00), payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of constructing a permanent system of sewerage disposal and permanent sanitary sewers and drains, and acquiring any necessary lands therefor."

30. That at said election, all voters desiring to support the PROPOSITION B to issue bonds as hereinbefore in Section B described, shall have printed upon their ballots the words:- "FOR the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of SEVEN HUNDRED AND FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$750,000.00), payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of opening, widening and straightening public streets and public places of said City, and acquiring any parcels of land which may be necessary therefor."

31. And those opposed to said proposition to issue bonds, shall have printed upon their ballots the words:- "AGAINST the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of SEVEN HUNDRED AND FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$750,000.00), payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of opening, widening and straightening public streets and public places of said City, and acquiring any parcels of land which may be necessary therefor."

32. That at said election, all voters desiring to support the PROPOSITION C to issue bonds as hereinbefore in Section C described, shall have printed upon their ballots, the words:- "FOR the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of ONE MILLION DOLLARS (\$1,000,000.00), payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable and bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of permanently paving and grading the public streets and public places of said City, in the several wards thereof."

33. And those opposed to said proposition to issue bonds shall have printed upon their ballots, the words:- "AGAINST the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of ONE MILLION DOLLARS (\$1,000,000.00), payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of permanently paving and grading the public streets and public places of said City, in the several wards thereof."

34. That at said election, all voters desiring to support the PROPOSITION D to issue bonds as hereinbefore in Section D described, shall have printed upon their ballots, the words:- "FOR the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of ONE MILLION DOLLARS (\$1,000,000.00), payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired to improve permanently the San Antonio River, San Pedro and Alazan Creeks, drains and streams in said City, by widening, deepening and changing the channels, and constructing permanent levees and walls along and near the same, and constructing permanent storm sewers, drains, mains, laterals and necessary accessories, to prevent or ameliorate flood conditions and protect public health and safety, and to acquire property therefor, extending and supplementing the present system of storm sewers and drains."

35. And those opposed to said proposition to issue bonds shall have printed upon their ballots the words:- "AGAINST the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of ONE MILLION DOLLARS (\$1,000,000.00), payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired to improve permanently the San Antonio River, San Pedro and Alazan Creeks, drains and streams in said City, by widening, deepening and changing the channels, and constructing permanent levees and walls along and near the same, and constructing permanent storm sewers, drains, mains, laterals and necessary accessories, to prevent or ameliorate flood conditions and protect public health and safety, and to acquire property therefor, extending and supplementing the present system of storm sewers and drains."

36. That at said election, all voters desiring to support the PROPOSITION E to issue bonds as hereinbefore in Section E described, shall have printed upon their ballots the words:- "FOR the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of ONE HUNDRED AND SEVENTY FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$175,000.00), payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of permanently improving

the condition of the public thoroughfares and public places of said City by building permanent bridges."

37. And those opposed to said proposition to issue bonds shall have printed upon their ballots the words:- "AGAINST the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of ONE HUNDRED AND SEVENTY FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$175,000.00), payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of permanently improving the condition of the public thoroughfares and public places of said City by building permanent bridges."

38. That at said election, all voters desiring to support the PROPOSITION F to issue bonds as hereinbefore in Section F described, shall have printed upon their ballots the words:- "FOR the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of SIX HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$600,000.00), payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan is desired to improve and extend permanently, the facilities and the service of the Fire and Police Department of the City by construction of permanent buildings, acquiring of sites for same, erection and installation of permanent fire alarm and police signal systems, and purchase of permanent equipment and apparatus therefor."

39. And those opposed to said proposition to issue bonds shall have printed upon their ballots the words:- "AGAINST the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of SIX HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$600,000.00), payable serially during the period of forty (40) years in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan is desired to improve and extend permanently, the facilities and the service of the Fire and Police Department of the City by construction of permanent buildings, acquiring of sites for same, erection and installation of permanent fire alarm and police signal systems, and purchase of permanent equipment and apparatus therefor."

40. That at said election all voters desiring to support the PROPOSITION G to issue bonds as hereinbefore in Section G described, shall have printed upon their ballots the words:- "FOR the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of SEVEN HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$700,000.00), payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of purchasing and acquiring land and sites for public parks, and constructing permanent structures, monuments and other permanent public improvements in the public parks of said City."

41. And those opposed to said proposition to issue bonds shall have printed upon their ballots the words:- "AGAINST the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of SEVEN HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$700,000.00), payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of purchasing and acquiring land and sites for public parks, and constructing permanent structures, monuments and other permanent public improvements in the public parks of said City."

42. That at said election all voters desiring to support the PROPOSITION H to issue bonds as hereinbefore in Section H described, shall have printed upon their ballots the words:- "FOR the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio in the sum of ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$150,000.00), payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of constructing and erecting permanent additions to, and as a part of City Hospital Building, for use of the public."

43. And those opposed to said proposition to issue bonds shall have printed upon their ballots the words:- "AGAINST the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio in the sum of ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$150,000.00), payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments, as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of constructing and erecting permanent additions to, and as a part of City Hospital Building, for use of the public."

44. That said election shall be held within the City of San Antonio, and in each and all of the various election precincts thereof, variously located in each of the several wards of said City, as said election precincts are now fixed and established, and being the same election precincts used in recent State and County elections; and said election herein ordered shall be held during the hours required by law, and at the place in each such respective election precinct set opposite the number of such precinct, in the following table, to-wit:-

Precinct No. 1:	City Hall.
Precinct No. 2:	Fire Station No. 12, 1102 South Flores Street.





PROCLAMATION AND NOTICE OF ELECTION

WHEREAS, at a regular meeting of the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, held at the City Hall on the 31st day of March, A. D. 1930, the ordinance hereinafter set forth was duly and finally passed by said City Commissioners, to take immediate effect, and same was duly approved by the Mayor, said ordinance being as follows; viz:-

AN ORDINANCE:

ORDERING AN ELECTION TO BE HELD IN THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, BEXAR COUNTY, TEXAS, FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE QUALIFIED TAXPAYING ELECTORS OF SAID CITY, EIGHT (8) CERTAIN SEPARATE PROPOSITIONS TO BORROW MONEY ON THE CREDIT OF SAID CITY, AND TO ISSUE BONDS OF SAID CITY THEREFOR, THE PROCEEDS FROM THE SALE OF WHICH SHALL BE USED IN EFFECTING AND CONSTRUCTING THE FOLLOWING PERMANENT PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS IN AND FOR SAID CITY, VIZ: (A) BONDS IN THE SUM OF \$600,000.00 FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSTRUCTING A PERMANENT SYSTEM OF SEWERAGE DISPOSAL AND PERMANENT SANITARY SEWERS AND DRAINS, AND ACQUIRING ANY PARCELS OF LAND WHICH MAY BE NECESSARY THEREFOR; (B) BONDS IN THE SUM OF \$750,000.00 FOR THE PURPOSE OF OPENING, WIDENING AND STRAIGHTENING PUBLIC STREETS AND PUBLIC PLACES, AND ACQUIRING ANY PARCELS OF LAND WHICH MAY BE NECESSARY THEREFOR; (C) BONDS IN THE SUM OF \$1,000,000.00 FOR THE PURPOSE OF PERMANENTLY PAVING AND GRADING THE PUBLIC STREETS AND PUBLIC PLACES OF THE CITY; (D) BONDS IN THE SUM OF \$1,000,000.00 FOR THE PURPOSE OF PERMANENTLY IMPROVING THE SAN ANTONIO RIVER, SAN PEDRO AND ALAZAN CREEKS, AND DRAINAGE DITCHES AND STREAMS IN SAID CITY, BY WIDENING, DEEPENING AND CHANGING THE CHANNELS THEREOF, AND CONSTRUCTING PERMANENT LEVEES ALONG AND NEAR THE SAME, AND CONSTRUCTING PERMANENT STORM SEWERS AND DRAINS, WITH MAINS, LATERALS AND NECESSARY ACCESSORIES THERETO, AND TO ACQUIRE ANY LANDS AND OTHER PROPERTY NECESSARY THEREFOR; (E) BONDS IN THE SUM OF \$175,000.00 FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSTRUCTING BRIDGES; (F) BONDS IN THE SUM OF \$600,000.00 FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSTRUCTING SUITABLE BUILDINGS FOR THE FIRE AND POLICE DEPARTMENTS OF THE CITY, THE PURCHASE OF APPARATUS, AND PERMANENT FIRE ALARM AND POLICE SIGNAL SYSTEMS IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, AND ACQUIRING NECESSARY SITES THEREFOR; (G) BONDS IN THE SUM OF \$700,000.00 FOR THE PURPOSE OF ACQUIRING LAND AND SITES FOR PUBLIC PARKS AND CONSTRUCTING PERMANENT PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS IN THE PUBLIC PARKS OF SAID CITY; (H) BONDS IN THE SUM OF \$150,000.00 FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSTRUCTING PERMANENT IMPROVEMENTS AND ADDITIONS TO THE PRESENT CITY HOSPITAL.

WHEREAS, the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio deem it necessary and advisable to issue bonds of said City for the respective purposes and in the respective amounts hereinafter specified, and desire to submit said propositions to the taxpaying voters as required by law; THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That an election be and is hereby ordered to be held in the City of San Antonio, on Wednesday, the 7th day of May, A. D. 1930, and the Mayor of said City be and he is hereby authorized and directed to issue his proclamation calling said election on said date, at which

election eight (8) certain separate propositions to borrow money on the credit of said City, for the purpose of effecting and constructing permanent public improvements in the said City, shall be submitted to the qualified taxpaying voters of said City, as follows, to-wit:

A:- SANITARY SEWER BONDS: \$600,000.00

A-2. Shall the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow money on the credit of said City, and issue bonds of said City therefor, for permanent public improvements, in the sum of SIX HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$600,000.00); said bonds to be of the face denomination of ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,000.00) each, and to mature within a period of forty (40) years, viz: To be payable serially in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, each year respectively from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive.

A-3. All of said bonds to bear interest from date at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually; said Commissioners being authorized to negotiate said bonds in lots as they may determine and direct, and be authorized to levy and to assess and to collect annually, taxes sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as same become payable, and create a sinking fund, as provided by law, sufficient to pay said bonds at maturity, viz: As each of said bonds and series of bonds shall respectively mature.

A-4. Said loan being desired for the purpose of protecting the health and safety of the people of the City, by the construction of a permanent system of sewerage disposal and permanent sanitary sewers and drains, and acquiring any parcels of land which may be necessary therefor; said public improvements to be constructed being the construction of a permanent system of sewerage disposal, and permanent sanitary sewers and drains, extending and supplementing the present system of sanitary sewers and drains of said City.

B:- STREET WIDENING AND EXTENDING BONDS: \$750,000.00.

B-5. Shall the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow money on the credit of said City, and issue bonds of said City therefor, for permanent public improvements, in the sum of SEVEN HUNDRED AND FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$750,000.00); said bonds to be of the face denomination of ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,000.00) each, and to mature within a period of forty (40) years, viz: To be payable serially in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, each year respectively from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive.

B-6. All of said bonds to bear interest from date at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually; said Commissioners being authorized to negotiate said bonds in lots as they may determine and direct, and to be authorized to levy and to assess and to collect annually, taxes sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as same become payable, and create a sinking fund as provided by law, sufficient to pay said bonds at maturity, viz: As each of said bonds and series of bonds, shall respectively mature.

B-7. Said loan being desired for the purpose of permanently improving the public convenience and traffic conditions of the public streets and public places of said City, by opening, widening and straightening public streets and public places, and acquiring any parcels of land which may be necessary therefor; said public improvements to be constructed and effected being the permanent opening, widening and straightening of public streets and public places in the several wards of said City and the acquisition of any parcels of land which may be necessary therefor.

C:- STREET PAVING BONDS: \$1,000,000.00

C-8. Shall the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow money on the credit of said City, and issue bonds of said City therefor, for permanent public improvements, in the sum of ONE MILLION DOLLARS (\$1,000,000.00); said bonds to be of the face denomination of ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,000.00) each, and to mature within a period of

forty (40) years, viz: To be payable serially in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, each year respectively, from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive.

C-9. All of said bonds to bear interest from date at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually, said Commissioners being authorized to negotiate said bonds in lots as they may determine and direct, and to be authorized to levy and to assess and to collect annually taxes sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as same become payable, and create a sinking fund as provided by law, sufficient to pay said bonds at maturity, viz: As each of said bonds and series of bonds shall respectively mature.

C-10. Said loan being desired for the purpose of improving the condition of the public streets and public places of said City by permanently paving and grading the same; said public improvements to be constructed being the paving and grading in permanent manner of public streets and public places, in the several wards of said City.

D:- STORM SEWER AND RIVER IMPROVEMENT BONDS: \$1,000,000.00.

D-11. Shall the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow money on the credit of said City, and issue bonds therefor, for permanent public improvements, in the sum of ONE MILLION DOLLARS (\$1,000,000.00); said bonds to be of the face denomination of ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,000.00) each, and to mature within a period of forty (40) years, viz: To be payable serially in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, each year respectively, from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive.

D-12. All of said bonds to bear interest from date at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually, said Commissioners being authorized to negotiate said bonds in lots as they may determine and direct, and to be authorized to levy and to assess and to collect annually, taxes sufficient to pay interest on said bonds as same become payable, and create a sinking fund as provided by law, sufficient to pay said bonds at maturity, viz: As each of said bonds and series of bonds shall respectively mature.

D-13. Said loan being desired for the purpose of permanently improving the San Antonio River, San Pedro and Alazan Creeks, and drainage ditches and streams in said City, by widening, deepening and changing the channels thereof, and constructing permanent levees and walls along and near the same; and constructing permanent storm sewers and drains, with mains, laterals and necessary accessories thereto, so as to prevent or ameliorate flood conditions, and protect the public health and safety, and to acquire any lands and other property necessary therefor, extending and supplementing the present permanent system of storm sewers and drains of said City.

E:- BRIDGE CONSTRUCTION BONDS: \$175,000.00

E-14. Shall the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow money on the credit of said City, and issue bonds of said City therefor, for permanent public improvements, in the sum of ONE HUNDRED AND SEVENTY FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$175,000.00); said bonds to be of the face denomination of ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,000.00) each, and to mature serially in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, each year respectively, from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive.

E-15. All of said bonds to bear interest from date at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually; said Commissioners being authorized to negotiate said bonds in lots as they may determine and direct, and to be authorized to levy and to assess and to collect annually, taxes sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as same become payable, and create a sinking fund as provided by law, sufficient to pay said bonds at maturity, viz: As each of said bonds

and series of bonds shall respectively mature.

E-16. Said loan being desired for the purpose of permanently improving the condition of the public thoroughfares and public places of said City, by building permanent bridges; said improvements to be constructed being the construction of permanent bridges over streams crossing public thoroughfares and public places, in the several wards of said City.

F:- POLICE AND FIRE DEPARTMENT IMPROVEMENT
BONDS: \$600,000.00.

F-17. Shall the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow money on the credit of said City, and issue bonds of said City therefor, for permanent public improvements, in the sum of SIX HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$600,000.00); said bonds to be of the face denomination of ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,000.00) each, and to mature within a period of forty (40) years, viz: To be payable serially in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, each year respectively, from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive.

F-18. All of said bonds to bear interest from date at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually; said Commissioners being authorized to negotiate said bonds in lots as they may determine and direct, and to be authorized to levy and to assess and to collect annually, taxes sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as same become payable, and create a sinking fund as provided by law, sufficient to pay said bonds at maturity, viz: As each of said bonds and series of bonds shall respectively mature.

F-19. Said loan being desired for the purpose of permanently improving and extending the facilities and the service of the Fire Department and the Police Department of the City by the construction of permanent buildings, the acquisition of sites for the same, the erection and installation of permanent fire alarm and police signal systems, and the purchase of permanent equipment and apparatus therefor; said permanent public improvements to be the construction and acquisition of buildings for additional fire stations, police stations and the sites therefor, and permanent equipment and apparatus, and permanent fire alarm and police signal systems in connection therewith.

G:- PARK IMPROVEMENT BONDS: \$700,000.00

G-20. Shall the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow money on the credit of said City, and issue bonds of said City therefor, for permanent public improvements, in the sum of SEVEN HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$700,000.00); said bonds to be of the face denomination of ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,000.00) each, and to mature within a period of forty (40) years, viz: To be payable serially in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, each year respectively, from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive.

G-21. All of said bonds to bear interest from date at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually; said Commissioners being authorized to negotiate said bonds in lots as they may determine and direct, and to be authorized to levy and to assess and to collect annually, taxes sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as same become payable, and create a sinking fund as provided by law, sufficient to pay said bonds at maturity, viz: As each of said bonds and series of bonds shall respectively mature.

G-22. Said loan being desired for the purpose of purchasing and acquiring land and sites for public parks and constructing permanent public improvements in the public parks of said City; said improvements to be constructed being the construction of monuments, permanent buildings, plumbing and other permanent structures in said public parks belonging to the City of San Antonio, and the purchase and acquisition of any necessary land and sites therefor.

H:- CITY HOSPITAL CONSTRUCTION BONDS: \$150,000.00.

H-23. Shall the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow money on the credit of said City and issue bonds of said City therefor, for permanent public improvements, in the sum of ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$150,000.00); said bonds to be of the face denomination of ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,000.00) each, and to mature within a period of forty (40) years, viz: To be payable serially in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, each year respectively, from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive.

H-24. All of said bonds to bear interest from date at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually; said Commissioners being authorized to negotiate said bonds in lots as they may determine and direct, and to be authorized to levy and to assess and to collect annually, taxes sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as same become payable, and create a sinking fund as provided by law, sufficient to pay said bonds at maturity, viz: As each of said bonds and series of bonds, shall respectively mature.

H-25. Said loan being desired for the purpose of constructing necessary permanent additions to the present City Hospital building; said public improvements to be constructed being the erection of permanent additions to and as part of said City Hospital Building, for the use of the public of said City.

26. The manner of holding the said election shall be governed by the laws of the State of Texas regulating general elections, and by the stipulations of the Charter of the City of San Antonio and the Ordinances of the City of San Antonio, for such elections made and provided; and, as provided by law, only those persons shall vote at the said election, who are qualified voters of the City of San Antonio, and who pay taxes on property in said City, and the ballot to be used in the said election shall be an "OFFICIAL BALLOT", arranged in such a manner that the persons qualified to vote at said election, may vote either for or against, any or all, of said propositions.

27. That the form in which the said eight (8) several propositions shall be voted on respectively, shall be substantially as hereinafter set out.

28. That at said election, all voters desiring to support the PROPOSITION A to issue bonds as hereinbefore in Section A described, shall have printed upon their ballots the words:- "FOR the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of SIX HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$600,000.00), payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of constructing a permanent system of sewerage disposal and permanent sanitary sewers and drains, and acquiring any necessary lands therefor."

29. And those opposed to said proposition to issue bonds, shall have printed upon their ballots, the words:- "AGAINST the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of SIX HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$600,000.00), payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, bearing interest at the rate of five (5) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of constructing a permanent system of sewerage disposal and permanent sanitary sewers and drains, and acquiring any necessary lands therefor."

30. That at said election, all voters desiring to support the PROPOSITION B to issue bonds as hereinbefore in Section B described, shall have printed upon their ballots the words:- "FOR the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of SEVEN HUNDRED AND FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$750,000.00), payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments, as nearly equal as practicable, bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of opening, widening and straightening public streets and public places of said City, and acquiring any parcels of land which may be necessary therefor."

31. And those opposed to said proposition to issue bonds, shall have printed upon their ballots the words:- "AGAINST the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of SEVEN HUNDRED AND FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$750,000.00), payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of opening, widening and straightening public streets and public places of said City, and acquiring any parcels of land which may be necessary therefor,"

32. That at said election, all voters desiring to support the PROPOSITION C to issue bonds as hereinbefore in Section C described, shall have printed upon their ballots, the words:- "FOR the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of ONE MILLION DOLLARS (\$1,000,000.00), payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable and bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of permanently paving and grading the public streets and public places of said City, in the several wards thereof."

33. And those opposed to said proposition to issue bonds shall have printed upon their ballots, the words:- "AGAINST the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of ONE MILLION DOLLARS (\$1,000,000.00), payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of permanently paving and grading the public streets and public places of said City, in the several wards thereof."

34. That at said election, all voters desiring to support the PROPOSITION D to issue bonds as hereinbefore in Section D described, shall have printed upon their ballots, the words:- "FOR the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of ONE MILLION DOLLARS (\$1,000,000.00), payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable; and bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired to improve permanently the San Antonio River, San Pedro and Alazan Creeks, drains and streams in said City, by widening, deepening and changing the channels, and constructing permanent levees and walls along and near the same, and constructing permanent storm sewers, drains, mains, laterals and necessary accessories, to prevent or ameliorate flood conditions and protect public health and safety, and to acquire property therefor, extending and supplementing the present system of storm sewers and drains."

35. And those opposed to said proposition to issue bonds shall have printed upon their ballots the words:- "AGAINST the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of ONE MILLION DOLLARS (\$1,000,000.00), payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired to improve permanently the San Antonio River, San Pedro and Alazan Creeks, drains and streams in said City, by widening, deepening and changing the channels, and constructing permanent levees and walls along and near the same, and constructing permanent storm sewers, drains, mains, laterals and necessary accessories, to prevent or ameliorate flood conditions and protect public health and safety, and to acquire property thereof, extending and supplementing the present system of storm sewers and drains."

36. That at said election, all voters desiring to support the PROPOSITION E to issue bonds as hereinbefore in Section E described, shall have printed upon their ballots the words:- "FOR the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of ONE HUNDRED AND SEVENTY FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$175,000.00), payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of permanently improving

the condition of the public thoroughfares and public places of said City by building permanent bridges."

37. And those opposed to said proposition to issue bonds shall have printed upon their ballots the words:- "AGAINST the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of ONE HUNDRED AND SEVENTY FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS(\$175,000.00), payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of permanently improving the condition of the public thoroughfares and public places of said City by building permanent bridges."

38. That at said election, all voters desiring to support the PROPOSITION F to issue bonds as hereinbefore in Section F described, shall have printed upon their ballots the words:- "FOR the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of SIX HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS(\$600,000.00), payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan is desired to improve and extend permanently, the facilities and the service of the Fire and Police Department of the City by construction of permanent buildings, acquiring of sites for same, erection and installation of permanent fire alarm and police signal systems, and purchase of permanent equipment and apparatus therefor."

39. And those opposed to said proposition to issue bonds shall have printed upon their ballots the words:- "AGAINST the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of SIX HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS(\$600,000.00), payable serially during the period of forty (40) years in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan is desired to improve and extend permanently, the facilities and the service of the Fire and Police Department of the City by construction of permanent buildings, acquiring of sites for same, erection and installation of permanent fire alarm and police signal systems, and purchase of permanent equipment and apparatus therefor."

40. That at said election all voters desiring to support the PROPOSITION G to issue bonds as hereinbefore in Section G described, shall have printed upon their ballots the words:- "FOR the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of SEVEN HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS(\$700,000.00), payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of purchasing and acquiring land and sites for public parks, and constructing permanent structures, monuments and other permanent public improvements in the public parks of said City."

41. And those opposed to said proposition to issue bonds shall have printed upon their ballots the words:- "AGAINST the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of SEVEN HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS(\$700,000.00), payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of purchasing and acquiring land and sites for public parks, and constructing permanent structures, monuments and other permanent public improvements in the public parks of said City."

42. That at said election all voters desiring to support the PROPOSITION H to issue bonds as hereinbefore in Section H described, shall have printed upon their ballots the words:- "FOR the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio in the sum of ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$150,000.00), payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of constructing and erecting permanent additions to, and as a part of City Hospital Building, for use of the public."

43. And those opposed to said proposition to issue bonds shall have printed upon their ballots the words:- "AGAINST the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio in the sum of ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$150,000.00), payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments, as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of constructing and erecting permanent additions to, and as a part of City Hospital Building, for use of the public."

44. That said election shall be held within the City of San Antonio, and in each and all of the various election precincts thereof, variously located in each of the several wards of said City, as said election precincts are now fixed and established, and being the same election precincts used in recent State and County elections; and said election herein ordered shall be held during the hours required by law, and at the place in each such respective election precinct set opposite the number of such precinct, in the following table, to-wit:-
