

19. Should this agreement be terminated so as to require the District to resume operation of the sewer system and levy of taxes, the City will furnish the District with an accurate record of all extensions and additions to the system and of all connections made therewith.

20. The District will permit the City of San Antonio to maintain, control, use, operate, extend, equip, repair or improve the said sanitary sewer system;

21. In event the bond debt of the District can be fully paid off and discharged or can be refunded so that it will no longer constitute an obligation of the District, any funds of the District then on hand from any source which are not required to pay any other valid obligation of the District will be applied or used to assist in making the final payment on such bonds or the full refunding thereof, provided they no longer constitute an obligation against the District.

22. The District will not levy taxes hereafter for any purpose until and unless required by the failure of the City to pay before delinquency the sums necessary to discharge the above described bonded indebtedness as the same matures; or, for failure of the City to adequately operate and maintain said sewer system; or, unless required by law or order of a Court of competent jurisdiction;

The City will not levy any special or particular tax applicable only to property and persons in the District for operation, extension, equipment, repair or maintenance of the District sewer system or the retirement of outstanding bonded indebtedness of the District, but will levy on property and persons in the District only the usual taxes applicable to all property in the city limits.

23. The District will supply the City with a copy of its records of all sewer connections heretofore made in the District and a copy of all maps and engineering data pertaining to its sewer system.

24. The District shall pay any current obligation, except its bonded indebtedness, which is due now;

25. The District will have its records audited and supply the City with a copy of auditor's report, showing in detail its financial statement and balance sheet as of the effective date of this contract.

26. When the above described outstanding bonds and all interest thereon shall have been paid by the City of San Antonio, or refunded by said City, so that the same shall not constitute a debt of the District, then the entire sewer system of said District shall be and thereupon become the absolute property of the City of San Antonio, to have and to hold.

27. That nothing herein contained shall be construed to cancel the sewer disposal contract now existing between the City and the District; but, during the time the City shall have control and operation of said sewer system said contract shall be suspended, but shall terminate as of the date therein provided, or when the title to the said sanitary sewer system vested in the City of San Antonio as provided herein.

28. It is further agreed that seven-twelfths (7/12) of the tax assessed and levied by the District against persons and property in its boundaries for the fiscal year 1945 shall be credited upon the City tax assessed and levied for its fiscal year beginning June 1, 1945, and ending May 31, 1946. The refund shall be made when a tax receipt shall be delivered to the City showing payment of tax to the District, but penalty and interest shall not be refunded.

29. This contract shall become effective as of the 31 day of December, A. D. 1945.

AN ORDINANCE (2949).

GRANTING FROST BROTHERS A PERMIT TO BUILD ABOVE AND
ACROSS THE ALLEY IN NEW CITY BLOCK 407.

1. That the City of San Antonio grants to Frost Brothers, a private corporation, the license and privilege to build over the alley in New City Block 407 to connect Lot 7 and the east 11.52 feet of Lot 5 with Lot 8, for a term of years to expire on the 1st day of April, A. D. 1966.
2. This structure shall have a minimum clearance of 18 feet above the roadway grade of said alley, and no part of the structure shall interfere in any way with the public utilities on said alley or the use of the alley by the public; and shall be built and maintained solely at the expense of the Licensee.
3. The Licensee assumes responsibility and liability for all damages, demands and causes of action which may result from the erection and from the use and operation of the said structure; and shall hold the City harmless therefrom which obligation shall be a covenant running with this privilege. Any act done by the Licensee in connection with this permit shall operate as a full acceptance thereof and its conditions shall be binding upon the Licensee and its successors and assigns for all intents and purposes. The Licensee acknowledges the title in the Licensor in the premises over which said structure will be built, and will never assail or resist said title.
4. This easement shall never mature into a vested right, and if at any time public necessity requires the alteration or revocation of this permit or the abolition of this structure, the Licensor shall not be held liable to the Licensee, its assigns or successors for any damages.
5. If the Licensee discontinues the use of said structure and abandons the same, or fails to keep any covenant on the part of the Licensee herein contained, then all privileges

given hereby shall terminate, and the licensee shall remove said structure and restore the premises as nearly as possible to the same state and condition that they were in prior to the erection of said structure. Should the Licensee fail or refuse to remove said structure and restore said premises, such removal or restoration may be performed by the Licensor at the expense of the Licensee.

6. If the Licensor shall bring suit to compel the performance of this contract or recover for any breach of this contract, the Licensee shall pay to the Licensor reasonable attorney's fees in addition to the amount of judgment and costs, if any is recovered.

7. The Licenses shall obtain all permits and pay all fees required under the ordinances of the City of San Antonio and shall pay for the recording of a certified copy of this ordinance in the Deed Records of Bexar County, Texas.

8. The building on Lot 8 shall be set back on an oblique line connecting two points on adjacent sides of said lot, each point being 14 feet from the southwest corner of Lot 8, and said area shall be open to the public use during the term of this permit. The Licensee shall have the right to remove the improvements at the termination of this permit.

9. The Licensee will pay the City of San Antonio \$600.00 per year in advance at the office of the License and Dues Collector in San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas, from the day construction begins.

10. The space included in this easement shall be designated as E-1 on the books of the City Engineer and the City Assessor, and they are directed to make a record thereof.

11. The foregoing instrument in writing constitutes the entire contract between the parties, there being no other written or any parole agreement with any officer or agent of the City, it being understood that the Charter of the City of San Antonio requires all contracts of the City to be in writing and adopted by an ordinance.

AN ORDINANCE (3000) *

MAKING A STREET RENTAL CHARGE AGAINST PERSONS ENGAGED
IN THE BUSINESS OF RENTING DRIVERLESS AUTOMOBILES FOR
THE USE OF THE STREETS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That this ordinance makes and manifests a rental charge for the use of the streets, avenues and public places in the City of San Antonio, against each person in the City of San Antonio, who rents, hires, leases or offers for rent, hire or lease, automobiles, motorcycles and vehicles propelled mechanically to the public without drivers supplied by the renter, lessor or hirer, used or to be used on or in the streets, avenues and public places of the City of San Antonio, as provided in Ordinance No. 84, passed and approved the 29 of July 1918, as amended; irrespective of whether the operation extends beyond the corporate limits of the City of San Antonio.

2. Persons engaged in such business shall pay the City of San Antonio, at the office of the License and Dues Collector of the City of San Antonio, 2 per cent of the gross income from such business, to compensate the City of San Antonio for the use of the streets, avenues and public ways of the City of San Antonio in such business.

3. Payment shall be made monthly as accrued and such person will supply the City Auditor on or before the 10th day of each month after the passage of this ordinance, a detailed statement sworn to by such person, or the duly authorized agent of such person, showing the gross receipts received by such person from such business during the preceding month, and at the same time shall deliver to the License and Dues Collector an amount equal to 2 per cent of the gross receipts.

4. The City of San Antonio through any of its officers, agents or servants, shall have access to all the books and records of such person and the right to verify the same and to take testimony thereon and compel the attendance and examine under oath all agents and servants of such person, in order to insure the City in the correct calculation and collection of said rental charge made herein. The City Auditor may prescribe the form and method of the bookkeeping and report.

5. If any such person fails or refuses to make the payments stipulated herein, the City of San Antonio shall have the right to bring an action to recover said debt, together with 8

per cent interest thereon from the date thereof, together with reasonable attorney's fees, and all costs and expenses of the City of San Antonio incurred in the enforcement of this ordinance.

6. If any such person fails to make the payments stipulated herein, the privilege of such person to conduct the business of renting driverless automobiles, as described herein, on the streets of the City of San Antonio shall cease automatically; and if such person continues to operate, then the City of San Antonio shall have the right to bring a civil action to recover \$25.00 a day penalty for each day each such driverless automobile is so operated.

7. The provisions of this ordinance are hereby declared to be severable. If any of its sections, provisions, exceptions, sentences, clauses, phrases or parts be held unconstitutional or void, the remainder of this ordinance shall continue in full force and effect, it being the legislative intent now hereby declared, that this ordinance would have been adopted even if such unconstitutional or void matter had not been included therein.

3- This contract shall become effective upon adoption by the Board of Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, and all agreements, if any existing heretofore between the contracting parties relating to the subject matter of this contract, are superseded expressly hereby and are null and void.

4- This instrument in writing constitutes the entire contract between the parties, there being no other written nor parole agreement with officer or employee of The City of San Antonio; it being understood that the Charter of San Antonio requires all contracts of the City to be in writing and adopted by ordinance.

5- Contract to furnish the Assessor's Department with One Burroughs Calculating Machine with Stand, Model 72 06 00 for a total sum of \$1,400.40 less trade in allowance for One Used Burroughs Machine #72A56581 with Stand in the amount of \$182.50, making a net total sum of \$1,217.90, said net total sum of \$1,217.90 being hereby appropriated out of the 1944 General Fund, Appropriation #841, dated May 31st., 1945, Assessor's Department, in payment of same.

AN ORDINANCE (3013)

LEVYING AN ADVALOREM AND OCCUPATION TAX FOR THE SUPPORT OF THE CITY GOVERNMENT OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, AND LEVYING A TAX TO PAY THE INTEREST ON THE BONDED DEBT OF SAID CITY, AND TO CREATE A SINKING FUND THEREOF, AND A SPECIAL TAX FOR THE SUPPORT OF THE CARNEGIE LIBRARY, CITY-COUNTY TUBERCULOSIS CONTROL, AND MUNICIPAL ADVERTISING IN SAID CITY, ALL SAID TAXES BEING LEVIED FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JUNE 1, 1945 AND ENDING MAY 31, 1946.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

Section 1:- That there is hereby levied for general purposes for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1945 and ending May 31, 1946, on all property, real, personal, and mixed, within the limits of the City of San Antonio, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and laws of the State, and Ordinances of this City, an Advalorem Tax of and at the rate of \$1.23 upon every One Hundred Dollars of valuation.
