

MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

MONDAY, NOVEMBER 27TH, A.D.1922, 4 P.M.

PRESENT: Honorable O.B.Black, Mayor, presiding, and Commissioners Pfeiffer, Lambert, Wright. Absent, Rieden.

Minutes of previous meeting were ordered approved.

----MEMORIALS AND PETITIONS----

The recommendation of the architects of the Municipal Market House, that bids be advertised for to install electrical work in East Annex of Market House, Cold Storage Room, Engine Room and Restaurant was adopted.

Petition to change the name of West End Lake to Woodlawn Lake, etc. was read the second time and laid over.

Petition protesting against the paving of Bryant Street was read and ordered filed.

The following petitions were read and referred to Commissioner of Taxation:

O.F.Lehman, for correction of assessment.
E.Ortiz, for refund of Jitney License.

Petition of Frost Bros. to erect bulletin on roof 221 E,Houston St. was read and referred to Commissioner of Fire and Police.

Petition of residents on Gertwood, Polk and Archer Streets for street improvements was read and referred to Commissioner of Streets, etc.

Petition of G.H & S A.R'way Co. to make certain changes in tracks was read and referred to City Engineer.

Petition of J.W.Kothman & Son to erect slaughter House was again brought up and on motion of Commissioner Lambert, referred to Board of Health.

Commissioner Wright made the following recommendations, which were adopted:
Prassel Sash & Door Co. for the construction of shed, granted.
For arc light Center & Mesquite Streets, granted.
Piggly-Wiggly Stores, for special building permit granted.

Commissioner Pfeiffer recommended that petition of Brunswick Balke Collender Co. for correction of assessment be granted. Adopted.

AN ORDINANCE

Directing the payment of salaries and wages for services rendered by officers and employees of the City of San Antonio for the month of November, 1922, as per pay rolls, and appropriating money therefor.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the following sums of money or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and is hereby appropriated for the payment of officers and employees for the several accounts and departments as specified in the attached schedule as salaries and wages for services rendered to the City for the month of November, 1922.

The bid of the Kerite Co. to supply City with aerial electrical cable was accepted upon recommendation of the City Purchasing Agent.

Bids to furnish the City with oil and gas were read and referred to City Purchasing Agent.

Hearing of property owners interested in the improvement of Bryant Street, Mitchell Street and Reservoir Street were called, and on motion, duly seconded and carried, the hearings were continued until Monday, December 4, 1922.
