Mayor Cockrell read the following Proclamation:

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, "The Breakfast of Champions", better known as Menudo, is one of the most unique dishes ever to originate in the Southwest, and

WHEREAS, Menudo is known to have great recuperative powers for over indulgences as it calms the corpuscles and soothes the soul, and

WHEREAS, In all recorded history, no city that loved Menudo ever faced bankruptcy and no utility company serving Menudo in its cafeteria has ever had a power failure, and

WHEREAS, Many Menudo experts will gather this weekend at Menudo Acres located at Outer Loop 1604 and FM 471 to compete for the title of World Champion Menudo Cook in the Fifth Annual World Championship Menudo Cookoff, and

WHEREAS, This confrontation of the world's finest Menudo cooks is held for the benefit of the San Antonio Boys' Clubs,

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NOW, THEREFORE, I, LILA COCKRELL, Mayor of the City of San Antonio, in recognition thereof, do hereby proclaim Saturday and Sunday, October 8 and 9, 1977, as

MAYOR'S COMMISSION ON THE HANDICAPPED

Mayor Cockrell introduced Mr. Francis Roser for a report.

Mr. Roser reported that this week was the observance of National Employ the Handicapped Week. There was a luncheon at Goodwill Industries. Two of the persons recognized for awards at the luncheon were City employees--Joe Bermea and Daniel Marin.

Mr. Roser said that over 3,000 handicapped persons had been placed in local employment during the past year. He reviewed activities that are effectively aiding in the drive to employ the handicapped.

Mr. Roser said that San Antonio should be very proud of the results achieved. San Antonio alone has accomplished more in this field than most states.

Mrs. Dutmer said that Mr. Harold Krepps had spoken at the luncheon. He is blind and the author of "Race into the Wind." He is now Federal Coordinator of Mainstream.

Mayor Cockrell expressed the Council's appreciation for the efforts of Mr. Roser and the Commission.

SAN ANTONIO DEVELOPMENT AGENCY

Mr. Winston Martin, Executive Director of the Urban Renewal Agency, introduced Mrs. Barbara Banker and members of the S.A.D.A. Loan Committee; Mr. Jim Saunders, Mrs. Minnie Garcia and Mr. Richard Borrego.

Mr. Martin commended Councilmen Hartman and Webb and Councilwoman Dutmer who are liaison members of the S.A.D.A. Board. He said that they have spent many hours with the Board and have been most helpful.

Mr. Richard Borrego displayed a plaque which had been awarded to S.A.D.A. by the Southwest Regional Council of the National Association of Housing and Rehabilitation Officers for having the most innovative residential rehab program in a large city.

Mayor Cockrell congratulated Mr. Borrego and the staff on their achievements.

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Mrs. Dutmer moved the approval of the Ordinance. Mr. Steen seconded the motion.

In response to Mr. Wing's concerns about loans to the elderly and low-income groups, Mr. Martin explained the function of their P.E.P. Program which deals with cases of this nature.

Mrs. Margie Cantu, representing St. Alphonsus C.O.P.S. and Colonia San Alphonso, thanked the City Council for their efforts in bettering the community through programs of this kind.

Mr. Pyndus expressed concern over the following points in the Housing Plan presented to the Council.

- 1) allocation of up to 50 percent for paint grants;
- 2) legal fees included; and
- 3) relocation costs.

In response to Mr. Pyndus concerns, Mr. Martin stated that the paint grant originally had no restriction as to its percentage of cost in rehabilitation. There is now a limit of no more than 50 percent. There is also a possibility that C.E.T.A. workers can be used as paint crews and the grant would then be for materials. With reference to the legal fees, Mr. Martin explained that there are many instances where properties are not cleared properly. To assure that these people are in proper ownership and to make it possible for the Urban Renewal Agency to put a lien on the property, it is necessary to get proper title clearance. As to the relocation costs, Mr. Martin stated that they are under the Federal Uniform Relocation Act which stipulates the \$4,000 maximum allocation. He then explained how these monies are used.

CITIZENS TO BE HEARD

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

Representatives of V.O.I.C.E. living in Districts 6 and 7 and a V.O.I.C.E. representative from District 10 spoke to the Council concerning the proposed Capital Improvements Bond Election. Speakers were:

Kay Brown
Karen Sprague
Jim Kerr

Each of the speakers read prepared presentations which are included with the papers of this meeting.

Mrs. Brown and Mrs. Sprague said that they felt that the improvements proposed are not properly distributed and discriminate against their area. They also said that the Council had failed to honor a commitment made by the previous Council concerning improvements to Marbach-Pinn Roads and Jones-Maltsberger Road.

Mr. Kerr said that the same situation exists in District 10. Very little is offered in the program for that District and those that are proposed are at the end of the priority list. He mentioned specifically a library, improvements to Heimer Road and Jones-Maltsberger Road and completion of the Blossom Park.

The matter was discussed by all of the Council and assurance was given that the entire matter is still under study and will receive much attention before it is finalized.

77-52 Mayor Cockrell was obliged to leave the meeting and Mayor Pro-Tem Eureste presided.

MR. LUCIUS S. DELANO

Mr. Lucius S. Delano, 12914 Uhr Road, representing 55 area residents spoke to the Council regarding their dissatisfaction with the private water company. He listed their grievances and asked the City Council to instruct the City Water Board to service their area. (Mr. Delano's prepared statement together with a list of signatures is included with the papers of this meeting.)

Mr. Ortiz asked that copies of Mr. Delano's statement be distributed to the City Council.

MR. E. L. RICHEY

Mr. E. L. Richey asked that a Citation be presented to Mr. Johnny Ovalle. He stated that he had seen Mr. Ovalle working very diligently in keeping the gutters clean around his property, a function which is normally performed by City crews.

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MRS. MARIA DOMINGUEZ

Mrs. Maria Dominguez spoke regarding the expending of City funds by the City Council. She also said that the Municipal Judges don't have microphones and the citizens are not able to hear the proceedings.

MR. RAUL RODRIGUEZ

Mr. Raul Rodriguez spoke against the appointments made by the City Council to the Fire and Police Civil Service Commission. He stated that one new member didn't even show up for the meeting.

Mr. Rodriguez also spoke against the bond issue which is proposed.

SAN ANTONIO COALITION TO DEFEAT BAKKE

Mrs. Sandra Solis and Mr. Manuel Escobar, representing members of the San Antonio Coalition to Defeat Bakke, spoke to the Council regarding a ruling by a California Court that is to be reviewed by the Supreme Court. They asked the Council to go on record opposing the ruling of the California Court. They both stated why, in their opinion, this case is very important to Affirmative Action.

Several Council members expressed their points of view on this matter.

Dr. Cisneros stated he would suggest that Council members, if desiring to do so, could write letters or speak to the issue individually; but he would not support a formal resolution.

After further discussion, Mr. Webb moved to approve the bringing forth of a resolution on the matter at next week's meeting. Mr. Ortiz seconded the motion.

On roll call, the motion failed by the following vote: AYES: Webb, Wing, Eureste, Ortiz, Alderete; NAYS: Cisneros, Dutmer, Hartman, Steen; ABSTAIN: Pyndus; ABSENT: Cockrell.

City Attorney Macon stated that the City Council can file an "Amicus Curiae" brief, that is, a friend of the court brief.

Dr. Cisneros asked Mayor Pro-Tem Eureste to instruct the City Attorney through the staff to investigate the possibility of the City joining opposition to the ruling before the Supreme Court by filing such a brief.

City Attorney Macon stated she will investigate the matter.

MRS. LILA LANDEZ

Mrs. Lila Landez asked the City Council to become more united and get on with the business at hand.

She then spoke to the Council about the C.P.S.B. transmission towers that were to be placed on Zarzamora Street. She asked Council to re-affirm its position on this matter.

At this point in the meeting, Mayor Cockrell returned to the meeting and presided. She responded by reporting what had transpired at the last meeting of the Board of Trustees of the City Public Service Board. She stated that the staff, after reviewing the criteria, had come back to the Board recommending the original route on Zarzamora Street, but the Board concurred in taking no action until the citizens

have an opportunity to meet with them. Mayor Cockrell then suggested that the Council have another briefing on this matter by the C.P.S.B.

Council concurred with this suggestion.

POLICE MANPOWER AND EQUIPMENT

Dr. Cisneros stated that he has spoken with several Council members who are concerned about the many assaults on Police officers. He also spoke of the needed equipment and the status of Police manpower. He suggested that the Council set up a budget committee to work with the staff when they are setting up the City Manager's budget.

Mr. Hartman suggested that a "B" Session be scheduled for presentation of this process.

Mayor Cockrell suggested that she and Dr. Cisneros meet with the City Manager and the Budget staff in preparation for this "B" Session discussion.

Dr. Cisneros reported on one idea that has developed from the Downtown Business Meeting which was held the last week in September. It has been suggested that a major downtown clean-up drive be held to help promote sales during the Christmas holidays.

PUBLIC HEARING
