BE IT RESOLVED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the City of San Antonio does hereby accept the pavement constructed by the Uvalde Rock Asphalt Company on Lavaca Street; the date of acceptance being hereby fixed on the 22nd day of June, 1916, in accordance with the certificate of the City Engineer filed with the Board of Commissioners on June 26, 1916.

The following resolution was read and adopted:

RESOLUTION

Authorizing the Missouri, Kansas and Texas Railway Company of Texas, to extend in a northerly direction its track from the South line of Wilson Street where its track now intersects same on Frank Street, across Wilson Street a distance of about 60 feet into the Government Reservation.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSIONERS of the City of San Antonio that the Missouri, Kansas and Texas Railway Company of Texas is granted permission temporarily to lay its tracks over and across Wilson Street from a point on Frank Street where its tracks now terminates in a northerly direction into the Government Reservation a distance of about 60 feet, for the purpose of a temporary emergency to accommodate the Government in handling troops.

Said track shall be laid under the direction of the Commissioner of the department of Streets and Public Improvements and the construction of the same shall conform to the regulations imposed by the City. Said track to be removed on demand of the City, or when same has served the governmental purposes.

In consideration of the granting of this permit the Missouri, Kansas & Texas Railway Company of Texas binds and obligates itself to hold the City of San

 Antonio free and harmless from all damages to persons~~XX~~/property that may result by reason of the granting of this permit or the exercise of any right thereunder.

Referring to petition from the G.H & S. A. June 22nd asking for permit to construct a temporary track on the west side of Moore Street between Seguin Road and Hood Street, as shown by yellow line on the attached blue print, while they are constructing the permanent track for which franchise was given on the 28th of April 1913, beg to advise that I have this day examined the line and I find no reason why this petition can not be granted, providing the Railroad Company take care of street crossings and drainage under direction of the City Engineer.
