RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Honorable John Raymond Lambert, Commissioner of Sanitation, Parks and Public Property, departed this life on Monday, December 19, 1927, after a long and useful official career, we desire to record our acknowledgment of his worth as a citizen and a member of the governing body of the City of San Antonio.

He was elected an Alderman in 1923 and served continuously as such until the inauguration of the commission form of government in 1915, when he was elected Commissioner of Sanitation, Parks and Public Property, and re-elected at every subsequent election.

San Antonio owes much of its beauty to this splendid man; he seemed to have an intuitive knowledge of what to do, looking to the betterment of conditions and the beautification of everything coming under his purview. Our magnificent park system, our high standard of public centres are all due to his wise administration.

In the death of our honored colleague, the City of San Antonio has indeed sustained an irreparable loss, his family an affectionate husband and father, and the citizens generally a friend whose every impulse was for the betterment of our great city.

RESOLVED, that this memorial be recorded in our Minutes, and an engrossed copy be furnished his family, and the usual badge of mourning be observed for the usual period.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that as a further mark of respect to his memory, we do now adjourn.
