AN ORDINANCE

CREATING THE EXAMINING AND SUPERVISING BOARD OF BOILERMAKERS, DESIGNATING THE MEMBERS THEREOF, AND PRESCRIBING THEIR POWERS AND DUTIES AND TERMS OF OFFICE, PROVIDING FOR THE LICENSING OF BOILERMAKERS AND THOSE ENGAGED IN BOILERMAKING AND SMOKESTACK WORK WITHIN THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS, THE MANNER AND WAY IN WHICH BOILERMAKING AND SMOKESTACK WORK SHALL BE DONE, THE KIND AND CLASS OF MATERIAL TO BE USED IN SUCH WORK, THE INSPECTION AND TESTING OF BOILERS AND SMOKESTACK WORK, AND THE SCALE OF FEES FOR SUCH INSPECTION AND TESTING, THE POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE INSPECTOR OF BOILERS AND SMOKESTACKS, AND REQUIRING PERMITS FOR CERTAIN KINDS OF BOILERMAKING AND SMOKESTACK WORK, AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION OF ANY OF THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ACT, AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES AND PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT WITH ACT.

PROHIBITING THE OPERATION OF ANY DEVICE, MACHINE, APPARATUS OR INSTRUMENT TO INTENSIFY OR AMPLIFY OR REPRODUCE THE HUMAN VOICE OR ANY OTHER SOUND, ON ANY PUBLIC STREET IN THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, TO PRESERVE THE QUIET AND GOOD ORDER OF THE CITY AND TO PREVENT THE DISTURBANCE OF PERSONS OWNING, USING OR OCCUPYING PROPERTY ADJACENT TO THE PUBLIC STREETS.
