WHEREAS, Chapter 65 of the San Antonio City Code entitled "Redevelopment Chapter" authorizes the Director of Redevelopment under supervision of the Director of Planning to conduct necessary studies, plans and surveys in connection with redevelopment projects; NOW THEREFORE

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

1. THAT the Director of Redevelopment under supervision of the Director of Planning, be and is hereby authorized and directed to conduct necessary studies, plans and surveys in connection with the proposed redevelopment of the following area in the City of San Antonio known as Area XX, Edgewood Area and more particularly described as follows:

BEGINNING at the intersection of San Joaquin and
W. Commerce Streets; thence East on W. Commerce
Street to Stephenson Road; South on Stephenson
Road to Castroville Road to San Joaquin Street; thence
North on San Joaquin Street to the place of BEGINNING

2. That the above described area known as Area XX, Edgewood Area, be and is hereby designated as the initial project Area for Slum Clearance and Urban Redevelopment.

3. PASSED AND APPROVED this 18th day of September. A. D. 1952.

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Mr. Harvey Hardy, City Attorney, announced that his office would like to put into the record evidence to show that the area selected in the above resolution was substandard and oneⁱⁿ which the Urban Redevelopment would be of benefit to the citizens of San Antonio and the residents in the area involved.

He introduced one of his assistants, Mr. Bert Smith, who made a statement as to the reason for selection by the Urban Redevelopment and Slum Clearance Advisory Board and the Planning & Zoning Commission of this area to be the first one surveyed under the Redevelopment Plan.

Mr. Smith then called upon Mr. William O. Parker, Director of Planning. Mr. Parker produced aerial maps of the area and gave vital statistics on the area. He gave the reasons for the Planning Commission selecting this area based upon the statistic furnished.

Mr. Smith then introduced Capt. Waldron, Director of Urban Redevelopment. Capt Waldron went into detail in describing the squalid conditions found in the area, gave opinions as to benefits to be gained by the project etc. He was closely questioned by the Mayor and Councilmen at great length to get a complete picture of the area.

Mr. Smith then called upon Chief of Police R. D. Allen for information as to crime and delinquency in the area. The comparisons given by the Chief showed the given area to be the chief crime area in the City.

Dr. Hill, Director of Health, next testified. He gave records to show the area exceeds all others of like size in the City in tubercolosis and infant diaharrea and gave as his opinion that crowded conditions and sub standard living conditions were responsible.

Fire Chief Butler then informed the Council as to the extraordinary fire hazards encountered in the area.

Mr. Russell White, Maintenance Engineer in the Department of Public Works, then enlightened the council on drainage and street conditions and on street widths and general engineering defects in the area.

Mr. Smith then closed the hearing by informing the council of the status of the program and what to expect. He told them the decision was theirs.

Councilman Keller then said he noticed Mr. Joe Thiele, Chairman of the Slum Clearance and Urban Redevelopment Advisory Board, in the audience and asked if he would address the council. Mr. Thiele further enlightened the council as to the why of the selection of this particular area for the #1 Project after a study of 20 areas.

When the hearing was announced on the matter of rezoning of part of Lot 6, All of Lot 7, All of Lot 8, NCB 6144, Lot 8 and Lot 8A, NCB 6145, and all of Lot 27, NCB 6570, Mr. Hardy announced that the Planning Board should be heard from first then the proponents, then the opponents and the proponents should again be allowed to be heard.

Mr. Parker, Director of Planning, introduced Mr. Greene, Administrator of Zoning, who produced an aerial map of the area which was proposed for rezoning. He described the conditions in the surrounding area and gave his opinion why the rezoning should be accomplished for the benefit of all the City.

Mr. Parker followed giving the opinion that the school board owning the property adjoining on the east had no objection.

Mr. B. C. Karcher, owner of the property, was then heard. He produced an architects drawing of a 30 unit auto court which he proposes to build on the subject land; showed that it was a natural development and growth and should be rezoned. He was followed by Mr. Joe Thiele who also thought it a benefit and result of natural development if change was made.

Mr. Henry Lee Taylor, Attorney, representing several owners of property in the area then asked to be heard. He called on Mr. R. V. Covey, 135 Parland Place, one of the adjacent owners. Mr. Covey stated he felt that the change would cheapen his property but did admit that he had a duplex and a garage apartment on his property. Cecil Lipscomb, another Parland Place owner, also protested that he would be damaged by the change. Mr. Taylor then read from the Supreme Court decision in the case of Weaver vs. Ham and advised the council that the proposed change was very similar and should be denied. He questioned the statement that the School Board had been officially informed on yesterday that it had never been before the Board.

Mr. J. F. Perry, a resident in the area, said he approved of the change and would like to see the improvement made as he considered it beneficial to the neighborhood.

Mr. White moved that inasmuch as the question of school board approval was in doubt action be deferred and the hearing be recessed until the facts were obtainable. Mrs. Gerhardt seconded and the motion carried.

The meeting then adjourned on motion of Mr. Tucker seconded by Mr. Lozano.
