## AN ORDINANCE 15,058

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING "AN ORDINANCE CREATING THE OFFICE OF INSPECTOR OF WEIGHTS AND MEASURES IN THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO: PRESCRIBING HIS DUTIES: THE STANDARD OF WEIGHTS AND MEASURES FOR THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO: REGULATING THE TESTING AND USE OF WEIGHING AND MEASURING DEVICES: PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF CERTIFICATES OF ACCURACY OF WEIGHING OR MEASURING DEVICES: PROHIBITING THE GIVING OF SHORT WEIGHTS OR MEASURES: REGULATING THE MANUFACTURE AND SALE OF CERTAIN COMMODITIES WITH RESPECT TO WEIGHT, MEASURE AND NUMERICAL COUNT: CONTAINING SPECIFICATIONS AND TOLERANCE: DEFINING CERTAIN TERMS AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE: PROVIDING FOR THE METHOD OF PROSECUTING CORPORATIONS AND OTHERS FOR VIOLATING THIS ORDINANCE: CONTAINING A SAVING CLAUSE: REPEALING ALL FORMER ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HERewith: AND ENACTING THE NECESSARY PROVISIONS INCIDENT TO THE OBJECT AND PURPOSE OF THIS ORDINANCE WHETHER MENTIONED IN DETAIL IN THE CAPTION OR NOT". AND PROVIDING A PENALTY AGAINST VIOLATORS UPON CONVICTION THEREOF WHEN A SEPARATE PENALTY IS NOT PROVIDED HEREIN BY A FINE IN ANY SUM NOT LESS THAN \$10.00 NOR MORE THAN \$200.00, BY CHANGING SECTION 1, SECTION 2, SECTION 8, AND SECTION 15: AND PROVIDING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

1. That Section 1 and Section 2 and Section 8 and Section 15 of an ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE CREATING THE OFFICE OF INSPECTOR OF WEIGHTS AND MEASURES IN THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO: PRESCRIBING HIS DUTIES: THE STANDARD OF WEIGHTS AND MEASURES FOR THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO: REGULATING THE TESTING AND USE OF WEIGHING AND MEASURING DEVICES: PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF CERTIFICATES OF ACCURACY OF WEIGHING OR MEASURING DEVICES: PROHIBITING THE GIVING OF SHORT WEIGHTS OR MEASURES: REGULATING THE MANUFACTURE AND SALE OF CERTAIN COMMODITIES WITH RESPECT TO WEIGHT, MEASURE AND NUMERICAL COUNT: CONTAINING SPECIFICATIONS AND TOLERANCE: DEFINING CERTAIN TERMS AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE: PROVIDING FOR THE METHOD OF PROSECUTING CORPORATIONS AND OTHERS FOR VIOLATING THIS ORDINANCE: CONTAINING A SAVING CLAUSE: REPEALING ALL FORMER ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HERewith: AND ENACTING THE NECESSARY PROVISIONS INCIDENT TO THE OBJECT AND PURPOSE OF THIS ORDINANCE WHETHER MENTIONED IN DETAIL IN THE CAPTION OR NOT", passed and approved by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio on the 14th day of March, 1935, and as amended on the 31st day of May, A. D. 1949, be and the same are amended hereby so that said Sections shall read respectively as follows:

2. "SECTION ONE: There is hereby created a Department of Weights and Measures of the City of San Antonio. Said Department shall be in charge of and under the control of an officer to be known as the Sealer of Weights and Measures of the City of San Antonio, who shall be proposed and nominated by the Commissioner of Sanitation, Parks, and Public Property. That the said Sealer of Weights and Measures shall receive such salary as the Commissioner may provide, payable semi-monthly during the period of his appointment; provided, that the City may impose the duties herein prescribed upon such officers as they see fit already in the employ of the City."

3. "SECTION TWO: DEPUTY SEALERS. There shall ~~be~~ such Deputy Sealers of Weights and Measures as the Commissioner of Sanitation, Parks, and Public Property may propose and nominate, and receive such compensation as the Commissioner may provide, payable semi-monthly during the period of appointment."

4. "SECTION EIGHT: REPORTS TO COMMISSIONER OF SANITATION, PARKS, AND PUBLIC PROPERTY. The Sealer of Weights and Measures shall keep all records which he is required to keep by virtue of the laws of this State, and make reports in relation thereto to the Commissioner of Sanitation, Parks, and Public Property as may be requested, and said Sealer shall make all further additional records and reports as may be required of him by the Commissioner of Sanitation, Parks, and Public Property.

5. "SECTION FIFTEEN: UPON RESIGNATION, ETC. STANDARD BEAMS, ETC., TO BE DELIVERED TO COMMISSIONER OF SANITATION, PARKS, AND PUBLIC PROPERTY. Whenever the Sealer of Weights and Measures shall resign, be removed from office, or remove from the City, it shall be his duty to deliver to the Commissioner of Sanitation, Parks, and Public Property all the standard beams, weights and measures in his possession, and all records, files, and other equipment kept and maintained by him."

6. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are repealed hereby.

7. Otherwise said ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

8. Whereas, an emergency is apparent for the immediate preservation of order, good government and public safety, that requires this Ordinance to become effective at once; therefore upon the passage of this Ordinance by a vote of four-fifths (4/5) of the Commissioners and signature of the Mayor, it shall be effective from and after the date of its passage as made and provided by the Charter of the City of San Antonio.

9. The City Clerk shall publish the descriptive caption of this ordinance which states in summary the purpose of the ordinance and the penalty for violation thereof, 10 times in the "COMMERCIAL RECORDER", a newspaper published in the City of San Antonio.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE SAFE GUARDING OF LIFE AND PROPERTY BY REGULATING AND PROVIDING FOR THE INSTALLATION AND MAINTENANCE OF ELECTRICAL WIRING, DEVICES AND EQUIPMENT PROVIDING THE MANNER AND WAY IN WHICH ELECTRICAL WORKS SHALL BE DONE, THE KINDS AND CLASS OF MATERIAL TO BE USED IN SUCH WORK, THE INSPECTION OF ELECTRICAL WORK, SCALE OF FEES FOR SUCH INSPECTION, CREATING THE OFFICE OF ELECTRICAL INSPECTOR, CREATING AN EXAMINING AND SUPERVISING BOARD, PROVIDING FOR THE GRANTING OF LICENSES TO INSTALL, MAINTAIN AND SELL ELECTRIC WIRING, DEVICES AND EQUIPMENT, TO PREVENT INCOMPETENT PERSONS, FIRMS OR CORPORATIONS FROM INSTALLING MAINTAINING, AND SELLING ELECTRIC WIRING, DEVICES AND EQUIPMENT, DEFINING TERMS USED IN CONNECTION WITH THE INSTALLATION AND MAINTENANCE OF ELECTRICAL WIRING, DEVICES AND EQUIPMENT AND PERSONS ENGAGED IN SUCH WORK, FIXING A PENALTY OF NOT LESS THAN \$10.00 NOR MORE THAN \$200.00 UPON CONVICTION OF THE VIOLATION THEREOF, AND PROVIDING FOR THE GIVING OF A BOND AND THE COLLECTION OF PENALTIES UNDER SAID BOND FOR VIOLATIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE, AND REPEALING ALL FORMER ORDINANCES RELATING THERETO AND IN CONFLICT WITH SAID ORDINANCE", PASSED AND APPROVED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO ON THE 15TH DAY OF NOVEMBER, A. D. 1947, AND AS AMENDED ON THE 31ST DAY OF MAY, A. D. 1949: BY CHANGING SECTION 2 AND SECTION 6 AND SECTION 14: AND PROVIDING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

1. That Section 2, and Section 6, and Section 14, of an ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE SAFE GUARDING OF LIFE AND PROPERTY BY REGULATING AND PROVIDING FOR THE INSTALLATION AND MAINTENANCE OF ELECTRICAL WIRING, DEVICES AND EQUIPMENT, PROVIDING THE MANNER AND WAY IN WHICH ELECTRICAL WORK SHALL BE DONE, THE KIND AND CLASS OF MATERIAL TO BE USED IN SUCH WORK, THE INSPECTION OF ELECTRICAL WORK, SCALE OF FEES FOR SUCH INSPECTION, CREATING THE OFFICE OF ELECTRICAL INSPECTOR, CREATING AN EXAMINING AND SUPERVISING BOARD, PROVIDING FOR THE GRANTING OF LICENSES TO INSTALL, MAINTAIN AND SELL ELECTRIC WIRING, DEVICES AND EQUIPMENT, TO PREVENT INCOMPETENT PERSONS, FIRMS OR CORPORATIONS FROM INSTALLING, MAINTAINING AND SELLING ELECTRIC WIRING, DEVICES AND EQUIPMENT, DEFINING

TERMS USED IN CONNECTION WITH THE INSTALLATION AND MAINTENANCE OF ELECTRICAL WIRING, DEVICES AND EQUIPMENT AND PERSONS ENGAGED IN SUCH WORK, FIXING A PENALTY OF NOT LESS THAN \$10.00 NOR MORE THAN \$200.00 UPON CONVICTION OF THE VIOLATION THEREOF, AND PROVIDING FOR THE GIVING OF A BOND AND THE COLLECTION OF PENALTIES UNDER SAID BOND FOR VIOLATIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE, AND REPEALING ALL FORMER ORDINANCES RELATING THERETO AND IN CONFLICT WITH SAID ORDINANCE", passed and approved by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio on the 15th day of November, A. D. 1947, and as amended on the 31st day of May, A. D. 1949, be and the same are amended hereby so that hereafter said Sections shall read as follows, respectively:-

2. "2. The Electrical Inspector shall be proposed and nominated by the Commissioner of Sanitation, Parks, and Public Property, and before entering upon his duties, take an oath of office, conditioned upon the faithful performance of his duties, and file a Surety Company Bond in the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) payable to the City of San Antonio, Texas, said bond to be approved by the Commissioner of Sanitation, Parks, and Public Property."

3. "6. The Commissioner of Sanitation, Parks, and Public Property shall propose and nominate one or more assistant inspectors to assist in making inspections, and for the proper conduct of the Electrical Inspector's office, the said assistant inspectors to have the same qualifications as provided for the Electrical Inspector, the salaries of such assistant inspectors to be determined by the Commissioner of Sanitation, Parks, and Public Property, said assistant inspectors to take the same oath of office as required of the Electrical Inspector and make the same Bond."

4. "14. There is hereby created a Board to be known as the Examining and Supervising Board; which Board shall consist of seven members who will be proposed and nominated by the Commissioner of Sanitation, Parks, and Public Property. The Board members shall elect their own chairman and secretary."

5. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are repealed hereby. Otherwise said ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

6. Whereas, an emergency is apparent for the immediate preservation of order, good government and public safety, that requires this Ordinance to become effective at once; therefore upon the passage of this Ordinance by a vote of four-fifths (4/5) of the Commissioners and signature of the Mayor, it shall be effective from and after the date of its passage as made and provided by the Charter of the City of San Antonio.

7. The City Clerk shall publish the descriptive caption of this ordinance which states in summary the purpose of the ordinance and the penalty for violation thereof, 10 times in the "COMMERCIAL RECORDER", a newspaper published in the City of San Antonio.

AN ORDINANCE 15,060

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 1 OF "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE THE CONSTRUCTION, ALTERATION, MAINTENANCE, REPAIR AND REMOVAL OF BUILDINGS WITHIN THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF", PASSED AND APPROVED ON THE 31ST DAY OF MAY, A. D. 1949: PROVIDING A PENALTY OF NOT LESS THAN \$5.00 NOR MORE THAN \$200.00 FOR FAILURE TO CONFORM TO ANY OF THE PROVISIONS THEREOF, UPON CONVICTION IN THE DISCRETION OF THE COURT: AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That Section 1 of an ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE THE CONSTRUCTION, ALTERATION, MAINTENANCE, REPAIR AND REMOVAL OF BUILDINGS WITHIN THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF", passed and approved on the 31st of May, A. D. 1949, be and the same is amended hereby so that hereafter the same shall read as follows:

2. "SECTION 1. The Commissioner of Sanitation, Parks, and Public Property shall propose and nominate a City Building Inspector and an Assistant City Building Inspector, whose duty it shall be to see that the provisions of this ordinance are carried out. The control of this department shall be under the jurisdiction of the Commissioner of Sanitation, Parks, and Public Property."

3. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are repealed hereby.

4. Otherwise this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect except as amended hereby.

5. This ordinance being of urgent importance to the public peace, health and safety of the City of San Antonio, the same shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by a four-fifths vote of the Commissioners and signature of the Mayor, as made

and provided by the Charter of the City of San Antonio.

6. The City Clerk shall publish the descriptive caption of this ordinance which states in summary the purpose of the ordinance and the penalty for violation thereof, 10 times in the "COMMERCIAL RECORDER", a newspaper published in the City of San Antonio, Texas.

AN ORDINANCE 15,061

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING "AN ORDINANCE CREATING THE EXAMINING AND SUPERVISING BOARD OF PLUMBERS, DESIGNATING THE MEMBERS THEREOF, AND PRESCRIBING THEIR POWERS AND DUTIES AND TERM OF OFFICE, PROVIDING FOR THE LICENSING OF PLUMBERS, AND THOSE ENGAGED IN PLUMBING WORK WITHIN THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS, THE MANNER AND WAY IN WHICH PLUMBING WORK SHALL BE DONE, THE KINDS AND CLASS OF MATERIAL TO BE USED IN SUCH WORK, THE INSPECTION OF PLUMBING WORK, AND THE SCALE OF FEES FOR SUCH INSPECTION, THE POWER AND DUTIES OF THE INSPECTOR OF PLUMBING, AND REQUIRING PERMITS FOR CERTAIN KINDS OF PLUMBING AND DRAINAGE AND COMPELLING BUILDINGS UNDER CERTAIN CONDITIONS TO BE CONNECTED WITH PUBLIC SEWERS, AND PROVIDING FOR A DRAIN LAYER'S BOND AND REGULATING THE MANNER OF LAYING DRAINS, AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION OF ANY OF THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ACT, AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES AND PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT WITH THIS ACT", PASSED AND APPROVED ON THE 3 DAY OF FEBRUARY, 1914, AND AS AMENDED ON THE 31 DAY OF MAY, A. D. 1949, BY CHANGING SECTION 1, AND SECTION 12, AND SECTION 15 THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That an ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE CREATING THE EXAMINING AND SUPERVISING BOARD OF PLUMBERS, DESIGNATING THE MEMBERS THEREOF, AND PRESCRIBING THEIR POWERS AND DUTIES AND TERM OF OFFICE, PROVIDING FOR THE LICENSING OF PLUMBERS, AND THOSE ENGAGED IN PLUMBING WORK WITHIN THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS, THE MANNER AND WAY IN WHICH PLUMBING WORK SHALL BE DONE, THE KIND AND CLASS OF MATERIAL TO BE USED IN SUCH WORK, THE INSPECTION OF PLUMBING WORK, AND THE SCALE OF FEES FOR SUCH INSPECTION, THE POWER AND DUTIES OF THE INSPECTOR OF PLUMBING, AND REQUIRING PERMITS FOR CERTAIN KINDS OF PLUMBING AND DRAINAGE AND COMPELLING BUILDINGS UNDER CERTAIN CONDITIONS TO BE CONNECTED WITH PUBLIC SEWERS, AND PROVIDING FOR A DRAIN LAYER'S BOND AND REGULATING THE MANNER OF LAYING DRAINS, AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION OF ANY OF THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ACT, AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES AND PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT WITH THIS ACT", passed and approved on the 3rd day of February 1914, and as amended on the 31st day of May, A. D. 1949, be and the same is amended hereby by changing Section 1 and Section 12 and Section 15 thereof so that hereafter the said sections shall read as follows:

2. "Section 1. CREATING, EXAMINING AND SUPERVISING BOARD OF PLUMBERS, NAMING WHAT PERSONS SHALL COMPOSE SAME: FIXING THEIR TERMS AND PROVIDING FOR FILLING VACANCIES. That there is hereby created a board for the examination of plumbers within the City of San Antonio, Texas to be known as the Examining and Supervising Board of Plumbers. Said Board shall consist of the City Health Officer, City Engineer, City Inspector of Plumbing and Drainage, a master plumber of not less than ten years active and continuous experience as a plumber, and a journeyman plumber of not less than five years of such active and continuous experience; the first three above mentioned are to have terms of services upon said board during their continuance in their respective offices, and the last two shall be proposed and nominated by the Commissioner of Sanitation, Parks, and Public Property. If any vacancies shall occur in said board, they shall be filled by persons proposed and nominated by the Commissioner of Sanitation, Parks, and Public Property, for the unexpired term."

3. "Sec. 12. INSPECTOR OF PLUMBING AND DRAINAGE TO TAKE EXAMINATION BEFORE APPOINTMENT. The Commissioner of Sanitation, Parks, and Public Property shall propose and nominate an Inspector of Plumbing and Drainage, named at other places in this ordinance as City Plumbing Inspector, or Plumbing Inspector, respectively, but before such person shall take office, he must first have applied for the office named and must have passed successfully the examination prescribed by the Examining and Supervising Board of Plumbers. The control of this department shall be under the jurisdiction of the Commissioner of Sanitation, Parks, and Public Property."

4. "Sec. 15. INSPECTOR TO FILE COMPLAINT FOR VIOLATION, ETC. Said inspector of Plumbing and Drainage shall also investigate all alleged violations of the plumbing ordinances reported to him, and file complaints against all whom he may have reason to believe are guilty of such violations, and perform such other services as may be required by the Commissioner of Sanitation, Parks, and Public Property, or by law."

5. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are repealed hereby.

6. Otherwise this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect except as amended hereby.

7. This ordinance being of urgent importance to the public peace, health and safety of the City of San Antonio, the same shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by a four-fifths vote of the Commissioners and signature of the Mayor, as made and provided by the Charter of the City of San Antonio.

8. The City Clerk shall publish the descriptive caption of this ordinance which states in summary the purpose of the ordinance and the penalty for violation thereof, 10 times in the "COMMERCIAL RECORDER", a newspaper published in the City of San Antonio, Texas.

AN ORDINANCE TO USE THE CITY SANITARY SEWERS BY A CONNECTION OUTSIDE OF THE CITY LIMITS ON THE PETITION OF RAY BRINK AND LORAIN BRINK

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

1. That the petition of Ray Brink and Loraine Brink, for a license to use the sanitary sewerage system of the City of San Antonio is granted hereby subject to the following precedent conditions.

2. That the permit hereby granted is temporary and the City reserves the right to revoke same at any time, with or without notice.

3. The house plumbing and the connection with the City sewer shall be made and maintained at the cost and risk of the Licensee in conformity with the Ordinances of the City of San Antonio.

4. That this permit is intended to cover only the sewerage from the property of the Licensee as same is now situated on said premises at Number 1021 Bandera Rd. Lot. Tract G Co. ANY PERSON WHO VIOLATES THIS ORDINANCE OR THE OWNER OF ANY BUILDING OR PREMISES OR PART THEREOF WHERE ANYTHING IN VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE PLACED OR SHALL EXIST, AND ANY ARCHITECT, BUILDER, CONTRACTOR, AGENT, PERSON OR CORPORATION EMPLOYED IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, WHO MAY HAVE ASSISTED IN THE COMMISSION OF ANY SUCH VIOLATION SHALL BE GUILTY OF A SEPARATE OFFENSE AND UPON CONVICTION MAY BE FINED NOT MORE THAN \$100.00 AND EACH DAY SUCH VIOLATION EXISTS SHALL CONSTITUTE A SEPARATE OFFENSE., PASSED AND APPROVED June 7, 1951.

That the office of Inspector of Taxicabs created by Section 2 of An Ordinance "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING AND LICENSING TAXICABS; LICENSING CHAUFFEURS; CREATING THE OFFICE OF INSPECTOR OF TAXICABS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO AND PRESCRIBING HIS DUTIES; PROVIDING A PENALTY; PROVIDING FOR THE METHOD OF PROSECUTING INDIVIDUALS AND OTHERS FOR VIOLATING THIS ORDINANCE; ENACTING THE NECESSARY PROVISIONS INCIDENT TO THE OBJECT AND PURPOSE OF THIS ORDINANCE WHETHER MENTIONED IN DETAIL IN THE CAPTION OR NOT; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; AND CONTAINING A SAVING CLAUSE," passed and approved on the 19th day of December, 1935, is hereby abolished and all of its duties and powers are hereby invested in and transferred to the Police Department of the City of San Antonio.

2. That the Commissioner of Fire and Police shall have the right to appoint the member of said department who shall perform the duties and have the powers and rights heretofore vested in the Inspector of Taxicabs.

3. That an Ordinance "REPEALING 'AN ORDINANCE ABOLISHING THE DEPARTMENT OF THE TAXICAB INSPECTOR AND ALL OFFICES THEREIN AND DUTIES THEREOF TRANSFERRED TO POLICE DEPARTMENT WITH AUTHORITY OF FIRE & POLICE COMMISSIONER', PASSED AND APPROVED ON THE 23RD DAY OF FEBRUARY, 1939," passed and approved on the 31st day of May 1949, be, and the same is hereby repealed.

4. This ordinance being of urgent importance to the public peace, health and safety of the City of San Antonio, the same shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by a four fifths vote of the Commissioners and signature of the Mayor, as made and provided by the Charter of the City of San Antonio.

5. The City Clerk shall publish the descriptive caption of this ordinance which states in summary the purpose of the ordinance and the penalty for violation thereof, in the "Commercial Recorder", a newspaper published in the City of San Antonio, 10 times.

## AN ORDINANCE 15.136

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING PAY IN THE FIRE
