

## MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 9th, A.D. 1922.

PRESENT: Honorable O. B. Black, Mayor, presiding, and Commissioners Pfeiffer, Lambert, Rieden, Wright.

Minutes of previous meeting were ordered approved.

## ---MEMORIALS AND PETITIONS---

The following petitions were read and referred to Commissioner of Taxation: S.L. Jeffers, for permit to pay taxes without interest and penalty. Mgr. Brady Bldg, for correction of assessment equipment of Empire Theatre.

Petition of Alamo Iron Works, for permit to install fuel oil tank, was read and referred to Commissioner of Fire and Police.

Petition requesting that Preston Place be changed to Lindell Place, was read the third time and granted.

## No. 372 AN ORDINANCE

No. 369 AN ORDINANCE

Appropriating \$1409/26 to pay various merchants bills.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the sum of \$1409.26 or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and is hereby appropriated out of the 1922 General Fund to pay various merchants bills as per itemized invoices on file in the office of City Auditor.

No. 367 AN ORDINANCE

Appropriating \$10. 0 to pay St. Julien Candy Co. account Food Products License paid twice in error.

Commissioner Pfeiffer moved that the word "women" in the caption be changed to read "persons", which was adopted, after which the ordinance was adopted by the following vote on roll call, to-wit: Ayes, Black, Lambert, Rieden, Wright, Nay, Pfeiffer.

Designating a certain portion of the building known as the Central Fire and Police Station as a venereal hospital ward for the quarantine of venereally diseased persons of the City of San Antonio.
