RESOLUTION

GIVING NOTICE THAT BIDS WILL BE RECEIVED FOR THE SELECTION OF A DEPOSITORY FOR THE FUNDS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 1935.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That sealed proposals for the custody of the funds of the City of San Antonio will be received from any banking corporation association or individual banker doing business within the City of San Antonio, that may desire to be selected as a depository for all or any part of the funds of the City of San Antonio, on or before Thursday, the 6th day of June, A. D. 1935, at 10:00 o'clock A. M., at which time the proposals will be opened at the meeting of the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, who will make the selection and designate such depository of City

funds, and thereafter receive and consider the bonds tendered by the proposers; all as made and stipulated by the laws of the State of Texas and the Charter and the Ordinances of the City of San Antonio.

2. Any banking corporation, association or individual banker desiring to bid, shall deliver a sealed proposal to the City Clerk at the City Hall, stating the rate percent upon daily balances which shall not be less than 3% which such bidder offers to pay to the City for the privilege of being made the depository of the funds of the City for the fiscal year next following the date of such meeting; and

3. Any proposal which contemplates a deposit of less than all of the funds of the City shall designate the amount or part of such deposits desired.

4. Each bidder shall include, or combine in the proposal, or shall file a separate proposal at the same time and in the same manner, the terms and conditions upon which the bidder proposes to lend the City of San Antonio, from time to time, as needed, if required by ordinance, such sum or sums of money as the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio may desire to borrow for the use of the City, in anticipation of the receipts of the taxes and the current revenues of the City for such fiscal year.

5. Notice that such bid will be received shall be given by the publication of a copy of this resolution not less than one, nor more than four weeks before such meeting.

6. The Commissioners shall have the right to reject any and all bids and to readvertise for any proposals.
