THURSDAY, MARCH 16TH, A. D. 1922, 4 P. M.

PRESENT: Honorable O. B. Black, Mayor, presiding, and Commissioners Pfeiffer, Lambert, Rieden, Wright.

Minutes of previous meeting were ordered approved.

The following petitions were read and referred to Commissioner of Fire and Police:

Sewell for feeding prisoners from March 1st to March 15th inclusive as per itemized bills now on file.
