Commissioner Wright, introduced the following resolution, which was read and adopted by the unanimous vote of the Commissioners.

WHEREAS, the State Highway Department of the State of Texas is desirous of designating State Highway No. 9, through the City of San Antonio, from the North City Limits to a junction with Highway No. 66 at the intersection of Main Avenue, and Nueva Street, and routing traffic over the Fredericksburg Road, North Flores Street, South Flores Street, Nueva Street to Main Avenue and continuing on Nueva Street with Routing designated for State Highway No. 66, to-wit: Nueva Street, South St. Mary's Street, Roosevelt Avenue to South City Limits, and,

WHEREAS, the participation of the State Highway Department of Texas in the designation of said Highway is contingent upon the City of San Antonio agreeing to refrain from permitting encroachments upon the right-of-way or said above mentioned Streets, and until and unless the City of San Antonio agrees to refrain from passing ordinances or laws fixing a speed limit of less than twenty miles per hour on said above mentioned Streets, and until and unless the City of San Antonio agrees to refrain from erecting signs, semaphores, and signals that will give preference to local routes or that will hinder or delay traffic on said above mentioned Streets.

THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Council of the City of San Antonio, that for an in consideration of the State Highway Department of the State of Texas designating said Highway No. 9 through the City of San Antonio from the North City Limits to the South City Limits and routing traffic over the Fredericksburg Road, North Flores Street, South Flores Street, Nueva Street, South St. Mary's Street and Roosevelt Avenue, it hereby agrees with the State Highway Department of the State of Texas that it will not, in the future permit encroachment of the right-of-way of said above mentioned Streets, nor will it pass an ordinance of laws fixing a speed limit on the above mentioned Streets or under twenty miles per hour; nor will it allow the erection of signs, semaphores, and signals that will give preference to local routes which intersects with said above mentioned Streets nor that will slow up, hinder, or delay traffic on

on said above mentioned Streets, nor will it repeal or amend any of the provisions of this Resolution without the consent of the State Highway Department.

ML-813 RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the State Highway Department of the State of Texas is desirous of designating State Highway No. 66 through the City of San Antonio, from the North City Limits to the South City Limits, and routing traffic over San Pedro Ave., Main Ave., Nueva Street, St. Marys Street and Roosevelt Ave., and,

WHEREAS, the participation of the State Highway Department of Texas in the designation of said Highway is contingent upon the City of San Antonio agreeing to refrain from permitting encroachments upon the right-of-way of said above mentioned Streets, and until and unless the City of San Antonio agrees to refrain from passing ordinances or laws fixing a speed limit of less than twenty miles per hour on said above mentioned Streets, and until and unless the City of San Antonio agrees to refrain from erecting signs, semaphores, and signals that will give preference to local routes or that will hinder or delay traffic on said above mentioned Streets.

WHEREAS, the State Highway is desirous of receiving Federal Aid for the improvement of said Highway; and,

WHEREAS, the Bureau of Public Roads of the Department of Agriculture of the United States of America will not participate in the construction of said Highway until and unless the City of

San Antonio will agree to refrain from permitting encroachments upon the right-of-way of said above mentioned Streets, and until and unless the City of San Antonio will agree to refrain from passing ordinances or laws fixing a speed limit of under twenty miles per hour on said mentioned Streets, and until and unless the City of San Antonio will agree to refrain from erecting signs, semaphores, and signals that will give preference to local routes or that will hinder or delay traffic on said above mentioned Streets.

THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Council of the City of San Antonio that, for and in consideration of the State Highway Department of the State of Texas and the Bureau of Public Roads of the Department of Agriculture of the United States of America constructing said Highway No. 3-A into the City of San Antonio, and routing traffic over East Commerce, West Commerce Street, to the City Hall, San Antonio, is hereby agrees with the State Highway Department of the State of Texas and the Bureau of Public Roads of the Department of Agriculture of the United States of America that it will not, in the future, permit encroachments on the Right-of-way of said above mentioned Streets, nor will it pass an ordinance or laws fixing a speed limit on the above mentioned Streets of under twenty miles per hour; nor will it allow the erection of signs, semaphores, and signals that will give preference to local routes which intersect with said above mentioned Streets, nor will it slow up, hinder or delay traffic on said above mentioned Streets, nor will it repeal or amend any of the provisions of this Resolution without the consent of the State Highway Department.
