

AN ORDINANCE

2011-05-19-0396

**AUTHORIZING THE RENAMING OF "DURANGO BOULEVARD"
TO "CESAR E. CHAVEZ BOULEVARD" FROM SW 36TH STREET
TO SOUTH HACKBERRY STREET AS REQUESTED BY
COUNCILMAN PHILIP CORTEZ, DISTRICT 4.**

WHEREAS, the Director of Development Services pursuant to a City Council Request initiated by Councilman Philip Cortez, District 4 is proposing to rename the entire length of "Durango Boulevard" to "Cesar E. Chavez Boulevard" located in City Council Districts 1, 2, 5, and 6; and

WHEREAS, notice of this proposal to rename said street was properly posted at City Hall, notice was mailed to affected property owners, and notice was disseminated through public service announcements, the notice requirements for renaming streets have been satisfied; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing before the Planning Commission was held on April 27, 2011 allowing all interested persons to be heard; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission approved a motion to support the street name change of Durango Boulevard to Cesar Chavez and keep the current honoree designation of Judge H. F. Garcia Memorial Boulevard; **NOW THEREFORE:**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. The city-owned street known as "Durango Boulevard" located in City Council Districts 1, 2, 5, and 6 between the cross streets of SW 36th Street and South Hackberry Street is hereby renamed "Cesar E. Chavez Boulevard." City staff is directed to provide appropriate signage to this effect.

SECTION 2. The "Cesar E. Chavez" honorary street designation on Commerce Street is hereby rescinded and City Staff is directed to remove applicable signage on that street.

SECTION 3. The "Judge H.F. Garcia Memorial Boulevard" honorary street designation for a segment of Durango Boulevard between IH-35 and IH-37 shall not be rescinded by the action taken under this Ordinance. New signage detailing "Cesar E. Chavez Boulevard" shall include the "Judge H.F. Garcia Memorial Boulevard" designation between IH-35 and IH-37.

SECTION 4. To the extent there are any conflicts with any provision or procedural requirement of the City Code of the City of San Antonio, Texas, including but not limited to, Chapter 6, Article XIV. Naming of City Facilities and Streets, those provisions or procedural requirements are hereby waived.

SECTION 5. Funding in the amount of \$25,000.00 for this ordinance is available in Fund 11001000, Cost Center 2303020001 and General Ledger 5301010, as part of the Fiscal year 2011

Budget.

SECTION 6. Payment not to exceed the amount of \$25,000.00 is authorized and should be encumbered with a purchase order.

SECTION 7. Funding in the amount of \$74,321.00 for this ordinance is available in Fund 11001000, Cost Center 2303020001 and General Ledger 5301010, as part of the Fiscal Year 2011 Budget.

SECTION 8. Payment not to exceed the amount of \$74,321.00 is authorized to Texas Department of Transportation and should be encumbered with a purchase order.

SECTION 9. Funding in the amount of \$15,000.00 is available in Fund 45099000, Project Definition 40-00013 and payment not to exceed \$15,000.00 is authorized to be encumbered and made payable for fabrication and installation services.

SECTION 10. The financial allocations in this Ordinance are subject to approval by the Chief Financial Officer (CFO), City of San Antonio. The CFO may, subject to concurrence by the City Manager or the City Manager's designee, correct allocations to specific Cost Centers, WBS Elements, Internal Orders, General Ledger Accounts, and Fund Numbers as necessary to carry out the purpose of this Ordinance.

SECTION 11. This Ordinance becomes effective immediately upon receipt of eight affirmative votes otherwise it becomes effective on the 29th of May, 2011.







Purpose and Proposal

- CCR Initiated by City Councilman Philip Cortez
- To honor American labor and civil rights leader Cesar E. Chavez
- Would extend the full length of East and West Durango
- Will retain existing honorary designation as Judge H. F. Garcia Memorial Boulevard
- Will eliminate honorary street markers of Cesar E. Chavez on East and West Commerce Street.

36th Street on the west to South Hackberry Street on the east




Street Name Change Plan
