AN ORDINANCE *MI-793*

PERMITTING THE INTERNATIONAL-GREAT NORTHERN RAILWAY COMPANY TO CONSTRUCT A SPUR TRACK ACROSS SAN FERNANDO STREET TO SERVE THE BLEDSOE WAREHOUSE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

1. That permission be and the same is hereby granted to the International-Great Northern Railway Company, to construct and maintain the following described railroad track, and to operate engines and cars thereupon, on and across the streets hereinafter described, to-wit:-
2. An industrial spur track extension across San Fernando Street, East of South Medina Street, and on the West by Inernational Great Northern Railroad right-of-way, as indicated in yellow on blue print, copy of which is hereto attached. The proposed track extension will be approximately 100 feet in length and run in a general southerly direction, starting approximately 40 feet North of the North line of San Fernando Street, and extending in a Southerly direction across San Fernando Street to the point of intersection of the South line of San Fernando Street approximately 60 feet.
3. Said track being indicated by a solid yellow line on the blue print which is attached

to the petition of the International-Great Northern Railroad Company, for this permit.

4. In consideration of the granting of this permit, the said Railroad Company agrees to have constructed and to maintain said track across said streets in the manner and form ordered and directed by the Commissioner of Streets and Public Improvements and in accordance with lines, grades and system of drainage approved by the City Engineer, and to have constructed such culverts, and make such additional provisions for drainage from time to time as may be deemed necessary by the City; and, further binds and obligates itself, its successors and assigns, to hold said City of San Antonio free and harmless from all damages to persons or property that may result by reason of the granting of this permit or the exercise of any right thereunder; and provided further, that said Railroad Company will have constructed and will maintain proper and suitable crossings under the supervision of said City Engineer and Commissioner of Streets and Public Improvements, so that vehicles can cross over readily.

5. That the license and privilege granted hereby is subject to revocation at the will of the Commissioners or other governing body of the City of San Antonio, and said Railroad Company agrees to remove, or have removed, its said track from said streets on demand, upon the revocation of the license hereby granted.

6. No frog nor switch nor any appurtenance thereof shall be placed on San Fernando Street.

7. Said track shall be constructed with at least twelve inches of concrete beneath the cross-ties, and concrete between the rails, and two feet on the outside of the rails, and paved with the identical material with which San Fernando Street will be constructed under the present contract.

8. Before the track shall be constructed a fifteen inch storm sewer shall be laid from the City Storm Sewer on Medina Street, and properly connected with two inlets on the West side of this track; one inlet being on the North side of San Fernando Street, and one inlet on the South side of San Fernando Street.

9. The acceptance and exercise of any privilege under this Ordinance shall be an acceptance of all its terms and conditions by said Railway Company, its successors and assigns.

AN ORDINANCE *MI-794*

DIRECTING THE CONDEMNATION OF PROPERTY FOR THE OPENING AND EXTENSION OF NORTH ALAMO STREET FROM APPLER STREET TO BROADWAY, BELONGING TO PAUL POPPE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

1. That a public necessity exists for the appropriation of private property for the use of the City of San Antonio to open, extend and establish a public street from the Southeast corner of Original Block 35, at the intersection of Appler Street and North Alamo Street Northerly to the Northwest corner of Original Block 35, at the intersection of Broadway and Cunningham Avenue, a distance of about 355 feet; to provide a way for the free and orderly movement of traffic.

2. The tract of land to be appropriated is within the corporate limits of the City of San

Antonio, County of Bexar and State of Texas, more particularly described as follows:- Part of Original Block 35, Garza and Truehart Addition to the City of San Antonio, New City Block No. A-6, to-wit:-

3. BEGINNING at the intersection of the South line of Cunningham and the East line of Broadway, for the Northwest corner of this tract; THENCE South along the East line of Broadway 42.22 feet to a point where the West line of North Alamo Street extension intersects said East line of Broadway; THENCE angle left 40 deg. 39' along said West line of North Alamo Street for the Southwest corner of this tract; THENCE angle left 54 deg. 01' along the North line of Appler Street 27.85 feet to an intersection with the West line of North Alamo Street, for the Southeast corner of this tract; THENCE angle left 85 deg. 20' along said West line of North Alamo Street, 49.86 feet to a point where the said West line of North Alamo Street intersects the East line of North Alamo Street extension; THENCE angle left 40 deg. 39' along the East line of North Alamo Street extension 354.75 feet to a point in the South line of Cunningham Avenue for the Northeast corner of this tract; THENCE angle left 67 deg. 58' along said South line of Cunningham Avenue, 29.66 feet to the place of beginning, containing .479 acres, more or less.

4. There is filed with the City Clerk a plat of the property proposed to be condemned and such private property shall be condemned for the purpose expressed in this Ordinance, by the same proceedings and under the same rules, as far as applicable, as are now provided by the general laws of the State of Texas for the condemnation of private property for the use of railroad corporations, except that the City of San Antonio shall desposit the exact amount of the award pending appeal if the City should desire to proceed with the improvements and the City shall have the right to assess benefits to the owners of property abutting upon the improvements.

5. Said property is now owned, claimed or in the possession of Paul Poppe, a resident of the County of Bexar and State of Texas.

6. The City is unable to agree with the owner of said property for the purchase thereof, and cannot agree upon the amount of damages, if any, for the appropriation thereof.

7. The City Attorney is directed to proceed with the condemnation of said property; all as provided by the Ordinances of the City of San Antonio, the Charter of the City of San Antonio, and the rules of the State of Texas.

In the acceptance of this easement, it is specially stipulated by the City of San Antonio that nothing in said deed contained nor anything in the ordinance of the acceptance shall ever be used as an estoppel against the City of San Antonio in the exercise of any of the governmental functions of said City.




