AN ORDINANCE

CALLING AN ELECTION TO BE HELD IN THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO ON MAY 30, 1959, ON THE PROPOSITION OF THE ISSUANCE OF \$2,150,000.00 NEW POLICE HEADQUARTERS BUILDING BONDS.

* * * * *

WHEREAS, by an ordinance passed on May 19, 1958, the City Council of the City of San Antonio called an election to be held in said city on June 10, 1958, for the purpose of submitting to the resident, qualified electors of said city who owned taxable property in said city and who had duly rendered same for taxation, the following proposition:

"Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, be authorized to issue the bonds of said City in the amount of \$2,150,000.00 maturing serially in such installments as the City Council may prescribe, the maximum maturity being not more than 30 years from their date, bearing interest at a rate not to exceed 5% per annum, and to levy a tax on all taxable property within said City sufficient to pay the annual interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity, for the purpose of constructing and permanently equipping a new Police Headquarters Building in City, as authorized by the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, and the Charter of the City of San Antonio."

and

WHEREAS, at the same meeting of the City Council, held on May 19, 1958, the Council adopted a resolution which provided that in the event the issuance of \$2,150,000.00 in General Obligation Bonds of the City of San Antonio for the purpose of constructing a new Police Headquarters building was authorized at the aforesaid election to be held on June 10, 1958, none of said bonds would be issued or sold until Bexar County shall have voted bonds or otherwise acquired funds for the purpose of constructing a new County Jail in said county; and

WHEREAS, said Resolution further provided that none of said \$2,150,000.00 in General Obligation Bonds would be issued or sold until the City of San Antonio and Bexar County "entered into a written agreement under the terms of which they shall have jointly determined the selection of the respective sites for the new Police Headquarters Building of the City of San Antonio and the new County Jail Building of Bexar County; and

WHEREAS, at such election duly held in the City of San Antonio on June 10, 1958, the issuance of \$2,150,000.00 in General Obligation Bonds of the City of San Antonio was authorized, sustained and approved by a majority of the resident, qualified electors who

owned taxable property in said city and who had duly rendered the same for taxation voting in said election, there being 8,602 votes cast for the issuance of such Bonds, and 8,182 votes cast against the issuance of such bonds; and

WHEREAS, the issuance of General Obligation Bonds of Bexar County, Texas, for the purpose of constructing and permanently equipping a new County Jail was authorized at an election duly held in said county on June 10, 1958; and

WHEREAS, despite numerous meetings between the City Council of the City of San Antonio and the Commissioners' Court of Bexar County, no agreement has been reached determining "the selection of the respective sites for the new Police Headquarters Building of the City of San Antonio and the new County Jail Building of Bexar County"; and

WHEREAS, it is apparent that further meetings and discussions for the purpose of attempting to reach agreement between the City and the County would be futile; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of San Antonio finds that the best interest of said City and of its citizens requires that a new Police Headquarters Building be constructed without further delay, irrespective of the location, and time of construction, of a new Bexar County jail, since the present cramped and inadequate police facilities seriously hamper efficient police operations; and

WHEREAS, the City Council feels that, due to the pledge made in connection with the aforesaid bond election on June 10, 1958, it is at least morally bound to withhold issuance and sale of the new Police Headquarters bonds until agreement is reached with the County, or until the qualified electors authorized to vote in bond elections have released the City Council from said pledge; and

WHEREAS, since agreement with Bexar County appears to be impossible, the City Council deems it advisable to secure authority for the issuance of \$2,150,000.00 in General Obligation Bonds of the City for the purpose of constructing and permanently equipping a new Police Headquarters Building, and that authority to issue such Bonds be in no way dependent upon any agreement with or action on the part of Bexar County, so that said new Police Headquarters may be constructed without further delay irrespective of any action or inaction on the part of Bexar County; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That an election be held in the said City of San Antonio, Texas, on the 30th day of May, 1959, at which election the following proposition shall be submitted to the resident, qualified electors of the City of San Antonio, Texas, who own taxable property in said City and who have duly rendered the same for taxation:

"Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, be authorized to issue the bonds of said City in the amount of \$2,150,000.00 maturing serially in such installments as the City Council may prescribe, the maximum maturity being not more than

30 years from their date, bearing interest at a rate not to exceed 5% per annum, and to levy a tax on all taxable property within said City sufficient to pay the annual interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity, for the purpose of constructing and permanently equipping a new Police Headquarters Building in said City, as authorized by the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, and the Charter of the City of San Antonio."

(If the above described bonds are approved, then the City will not be authorized to issue the \$2,150,000.00 of bonds voted for the same purpose at the election held June 10, 1958, and said authorization shall be considered to have been revoked and cancelled.)

2. That voting machines shall be employed at the election herein ordered in accordance with the provisions of V.A.T.S. Election Code, Article 7.14, and voting machines shall be used for the casting of absentee votes in the Office of the City Clerk, which absentee balloting shall be conducted in the manner made and provided by the Statutes of the State of Texas on the subject, and said election shall be held at the polling places in the regularly prescribed voting precincts of the City of San Antonio, between the hours of 7:00 o'clock A.M. and 7:00 P.M. Central Standard Time. Such voting precincts, polling places, Presiding Judges and Clerks being as follows:

That said election shall be held in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 1, Title 22 of the Revised Civil Statutes of Texas, 1925, as amended, including the provisions of Article 704, as amended by Chapter 382, passed at the first called session of the 44th Legislature, and the Charter of the City of San Antonio, Texas, and only legally qualified electors who own taxable property in the City who have duly rendered the same for taxation shall be qualified to vote.

4. The ballots for said election shall have written or printed thereon the following:




5. A copy of this Ordinance, signed by the Mayor of said City, and attested by the City Clerk shall serve as proper notice of said Election. Notice shall be given in accordance with Article 704, Revised Civil Statutes of Texas, of 1925, as amended. The Mayor is authorized and directed to have a copy of said notice posted at the City Hall in said City and at each of the voting places in said City, not less than fifteen (15) days prior to the date fixed for holding said election. He shall also cause said notice to be published on the same day in each of two successive weeks in the Commercial Recorder, a newspaper of general circulation published within the City of San Antonio, the date of the first publication to be not less than fourteen (14) days prior to the date set for said election. Except as otherwise provided in said Article 704, as amended, the manner of holding said election shall be governed by the laws governing general elections.

6. An emergency exists for the immediate preservation of the public peace, property, health, welfare, and safety, requiring that this ordinance become effective immediately; therefore, upon passage of this ordinance by an affirmative vote of six (6) members of the City Council, it shall be effective from and after the date of its passage as provided by the Charter of the City of San Antonio.
