

AN ORDINANCE *OI-132*

MAKING CONTRACT WITH THE PITLUK ADVERTISING COMPANY

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That this ordinance creates and manifests the contract between the City of San Antonio, as recommended by the Municipal Advertising Commission of the City of San Antonio, and Jack N. Pitluk, doing business as the Pitluk Advertising Company, all of the County of Bexar and State of Texas, WITNESSETH:-

2. The Pitluk Advertising Company agrees to prepare copy for advertisements, booklets and other printed and illustrated matter and publicity matter for magazines and periodicals which shall be authorized by the Municipal Advertising Commission; and where authorized specifically by the Commission, shall place it for publication in the various advertising media which may be approved specifically from time to time jointly by the Commission and by the Mayor and City Commissioners of the City of San Antonio in the City Advertising Campaign for the period between this date and May 31, 1938.

3. None of the services of the Pitluk Advertising Company under this contract shall establish any obligation upon the City of San Antonio and the Municipal Advertising Commission, other than that of paying the cost of such items as may be published in this campaign with the specific joint approval of the Municipal Advertising Commission and the Mayor and Commissioners of the City of San Antonio.

4. The Pitluk Advertising Company agrees to prepare and place copy for the new advertising campaign strictly and solely where specifically authorized and approved from time to time by both the Municipal Advertising Commission and the Mayor and Board of Commissioners of the City of San Antonio. The Pitluk Advertising Company shall not have any authority to make any contracts or incur any expense or obligations for the Mayor and Commissioners or the Advertising Commission, it being agreed that the Pitluk Advertising Company's services and authority are limited to furnishing the copy and material and assistance and advice in said matters and that all contracts and agreements and all matters incurring any financial obligation in connection therewith shall be entered into only upon the action of the Mayor and Commissioners of the City and the Advertising Commission, and that the Pitluk Advertising Company shall not have the authority to incur any financial obligations for them.

5. It is further agreed that in event the Pitluk Advertising Company shall not render its services satisfactorily to the Municipal Advertising Commission and the Mayor and City Commissioners (of which they shall be the sole judge) at any time thereafter the advertising Commission and the Mayor and City Commissioners may at their option terminate this agreement. It is agreed that the Pitluk Advertising Company shall receive no compensation for its services from the Advertising Commission or Mayor and Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, but shall receive its sole compensation by way of commission in the usual rate of 10 percent, 13 percent and 15 percent, and art work at cost, from the publications where the advertising matter is placed; but it shall render to the Advertising Commission and Mayor and City Commissioners a statement of commissions received by it and they shall not be in excess of an amount deemed reasonable by the said Commission and Mayor and City Commissioners.

6. The City of San Antonio will pay all bills which have been approved in sufficient time to enable the Pitluk Advertising Company to secure its commission, and to secure the benefit of all cash discounts.

7. It is not the intention by this contract to create the relation of principal and agent between the parties hereto, but the Pitluk Advertising Company shall have the status of an independent contractor.

8. This contract shall be performable exclusively in the County of Bexar and State

of Texas, and all payments shall be made at the office of the City Treasurer.

9. This instrument in writing constitutes the entire agreement of accord and satisfaction between the parties, there being no other written or parol agreement with any officer or employee of the City; it being understood by the parties hereto that the Charter of the City of San Antonio requires all contracts to be in writing and approved by ordinance, before the City is bound.

MAKING CONTRACT WITH WYATT, ANIOL AND AULD

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That this ordinance creates and manifests the contract between the City of San Antonio, as recommended by the Municipal Advertising Commission of the City of San Antonio, and Wyatt, Aniol & Auld, a partnership consisting of William I. Wyatt, Claude E. Aniol and Orrin C. Auld, all of the County of Bexar and State of Texas, WITNESSETH:-

2. Wyatt, Aniol & Auld agree to prepare copy for advertisements, booklets and other printed and illustrated matter and publicity matter for magazines and periodicals, which shall be authorized by the Municipal Advertising Commission; and where authorized specifically by the Commission, shall place it for publication in the various advertising media which may be approved specifically from time to time jointly by the Commission and by the Mayor and City Commissioners of the City of San Antonio in the City Advertising Campaign for the period between this date and May 31, 1938.

3. None of the services of Wyatt, Aniol & Auld under this contract shall establish any obligation upon the City of San Antonio and the Municipal Advertising Campaign, other than that of paying the cost of such items as may be published in this campaign with the specific joint approval of the Municipal Advertising Commission and the Mayor and Commissioners of the City of San Antonio.

4. AN ORDINANCE OI-136

ACCEPTING AND APPROVING THE SECURITIES PLEDGED BY THE NATIONAL BANK OF COMMERCE OF SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS, TO SECURE THE CITY FUNDS DEPOSITED AND TO BE DEPOSITED IN SAID BANK BY THE CITY DURING THE FISCAL YEAR 1937, AND DIRECTING THE DEPOSITING OF SAID SECURITIES FOR SAFE-KEEPING AND RELEASING THE SURETIES ON ALL BONDS HERETOFORE GIVEN BY SAID BANK AS CITY DEPOSITORY

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That the securities pledged with the Governing Body of the City of San Antonio by the National Bank of Commerce of San Antonio, Texas as City Depository, to secure the Fund of said City, deposited and to be deposited, in said Bank, during the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1937 and ending May 31, 1938, be and the same are hereby accepted and approved, and that receipt signed by the Mayor, countersigned by the City Auditor, and attested by the City Clerk, be given said Bank for securities pledged by it, which said securities are described as follows:

1-(a) Securities pledged by the National Bank of Commerce are described in the attached Exhibit "A" which is made a part of the ordinance by reference as fully as if it were specified herein.

2. The receipt given to said Bank for the securities pledged by it shall recite, in substance, that the said securities have been duly pledged with the Governing Body of the City of San Antonio, by the National Bank of Commerce of San Antonio, Texas, as a Depository of said City, for the purpose of securing the Funds of said City, deposited and to be deposited, in said Bank during the Fiscal Year beginning June 1, 1937, upon the terms and conditions prescribed and provided by law.

3. It is directed that said securities be deposited by the Mayor, for safe-keeping in safe deposit box in the vaults of the National Bank of Commerce rented by the City from the said Bank.

4. That all securities on all bonds heretofore given to said City, by said National Bank of Commerce as City Depository, be and are hereby released from further liability as sureties on such bonds.

AN ORDINANCE

LEVYING SPECIAL TAXES FOR THE PAYMENT OF INTEREST ON AND TO CREATE A SINKING FUND FOR THE ULTIMATE PAYMENT OF CERTAIN ISSUES OF BONDS, ISSUED ON THE CREDITS OF IMPROVEMENT DISTRICTS NO. 2, 4, 7, 8, 12, 14, IN THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JUNE 1, 1937, AND ENDING MAY 31, 1938.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

SECTION 1: That to provide for the payment of the interest on a certain issue of bonds in the sum of \$30,000.00, issued on the credit of Improvement District No. 2, as authorized at a special election held in said Improvement District on the 12th day of October 1903, in accordance with Section 54 of the Charter of the City of San Antonio, and to create a sinking fund for the ultimate payment thereof, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1937 and ending May 31, 1938, a special tax of Three Cents (3) on the One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property, real, personal and mixed, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and Laws of this state, and situated in what is known as said Improvement District No. 2, in the City of San Antonio, as the same has been defined by Ordinance of the City Council of said City.

SECTION 2: That to provide for the payment of the Interest on a certain issue of bonds in the sum of \$76,000.00, dated October 1, 1937, issued on the credit of Improvement District No. 4, as authorized by an ordinance passed and approved on August 27, 1937 in accordance with Sections 54 and 55 of the Charter of the City of San Antonio and to create a Sinking Fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1937 and ending May 31, 1938, a special tax of Twelve Cents (12) on the One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property, real, personal and mixed, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and Laws of this State, and situated in what is known as said Improvement District No. 4, in the City of San Antonio, as same has been defined by ordinance of the City Council of said City.

SECTION 3: That to provide for the payment of the interest on a certain issue of Bonds

in the sum of \$45,000.00, issued on the credit of Improvement District No. 7, as authorized at a special election held in said Improvement District on the 15th day of July, 1908, in accordance with Section 54 of the Charter of the City of San Antonio, and to create a sinking fund for the ultimate payment thereof, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1937 and ending May 31, 1938, a special tax of Four Cents (4) on the One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property, real, personal and mixed, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and Laws of this State, and situated in what is known as said Improvement District No. 7, in the City of San Antonio, as the same has been defined by ordinance of the City Council of said City.

SECTION 4: That to provide for the payment of the interest on a certain issue of Bonds in the sum of \$75,000.00 issued on the credit of Improvement District No. 8, as authorized at a special election held in said Improvement District on the 14th day of March, 1905, in accordance with Section 54 of the Charter of the City of San Antonio, and to create a Sinking fund for the ultimate payment thereof, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1937, and ending May 31, 1938, a special tax of three cents (3) on the One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property, real, personal and mixed, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and Laws of this State, and situated in what is known as said Improvement District No. 8, in the City of San Antonio, as the same has been defined by Ordinance of the City Council of said City.

SECTION 5: That to provide for the payment of the interest on a certain issue of Bonds in the sum of \$5,000.00, issued on the credit of Improvement District No. 12, as authorized at a special election held in said Improvement District on the 17th day of September 1909, in accordance with Section 54 of the Charter of the City of San Antonio, and to create a Sinking Fund for the ultimate payment thereof, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1937 and ending May 31, 1938, a special tax of four Cents (4) on the One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property, real personal and mixed, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and Laws of this State, situated in what is known as Improvement District No. 12, in the City of San Antonio, as the same has been defined by Ordinance of the City Council of said City.

SECTION 6: That to provide for the payment of the interest on a certain issue of Bonds in the sum of \$17,500.00 issued on the credit of Improvement District No. 14, as authorized at a special election held in said Improvement District on the 21st day of June 1919, in accordance with Section 54 of the Charter of the City of San Antonio, and to create a Sinking Fund for the ultimate payment thereof, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1937 and ending May 31, 1938, a special tax of Seven Cents (7) on the One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property, real, personal and mixed, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and Laws of this State, and situated in what is known as Improvement District No. 14, in the City of San Antonio, as the same has been defined by Ordinance of the Board of Commissioners of said City.

SECTION 7; EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, an emergency is apparent for the immediate preservation of public peace, health and safety, to-wit: to preserve the financial and borrowing credit of the City, to secure funds for maintaining the necessary functions of government, and pay the debts of the City, that requires this Ordinance to become effective at once: therefore upon the passage of this Ordinance by a vote of four-fifths (4/5) of the Board of Commissioners, it shall be effective from and after the date of its passage as made and provided by the Charter of the City of San Antonio, Texas.

AN ORDINANCE

OI-139

LEVYING AN ADVALOREM AND OCCUPATION TAX FOR THE SUPPORT OF THE CITY GOVERNMENT OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, AND LEVYING A TAX TO PAY THE INTEREST ON THE BONDED DEBT OF SAID CITY, AND TO CREATE A SINKING FUND THEREFOR, AND A SPECIAL TAX FOR THE SUPPORT OF THE CARNEGIE LIBRARY IN SAID CITY, ALL SAID TAXES BEING LEVIED FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JUNE 1, 1937 AND ENDING MAY 31, 1938.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1: That there is hereby levied for general purposes for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1937 and ending May 31, 1938, on all property, real, personal, and mixed, within the limits of the City of San Antonio, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and Laws of this State, and the Ordinances of this City, an Advalorem Tax of and at the rate of One and Eighteen one-hundredth dollars (\$1.18) on every One Hundred Dollars valuation.

SECTION 2: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1915, ^(1913?) in the sum of \$1,500,000.00 for Paving Public Streets and Public Places, and to create a Sinking Fund for the payment thereof as they may severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1937 and ending May 31, 1938, a special tax of three and forty one one-hundredth (3.41) cents on every one hundred dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

SECTION 3: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1913, in the sum of \$800,000.00 for constructing Sanitary Sewers, and to create a Sinking Fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1937 and ending May 31, 1938, a special tax of One and eighty four one-hundredth (1.84) cents on every one hundred dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

SECTION 4: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1913, in the sum of \$25,000.00 for Construction Sidewalks and Curbing, and to create a Sinking Fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1937 and ending May 31, 1938, a special tax of Five one-hundredth (.05) cents on every one hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

SECTION 5: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1913, in the sum of \$175,000.00 for Constructing Police and Fire Stations, and to create a Sinking Fund for the payment thereof, as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1937 and ending May 31, 1938, a special tax of Thirty Eight one-hundredth (.38) cents on every one hundred dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

SECTION 6: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1913, in the sum of \$375,000.00 for Opening and Widening Streets, and to create a Sinking Fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1937 and ending May 31, 1938, a special tax of Eighty Four one-hundredth (.84) cents on every one hundred dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 7: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1913, in the sum of \$100,000.00 for the Construction of Concrete Bridges and to create a Sinking Fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1937 and ending May 31, 1938, a special tax of Twenty one-hundredth (20) cents on every one hundred dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

SECTION 8: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds

dated September 1, 1913, in the sum of \$300,000.00 for constructing Storm Sewers and Drains, and to create a Sinking Fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1937 and ending May 31, 1938, a special tax of Sixty Six one-hundredth (.66) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

SECTION 9: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1913, in the sum of \$125,000.00 for constructing a City Hospital, and to create a Sinking Fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1937 and ending May 31, 1938, a special tax of twenty Nine one-hundredth (.29) cents on every one hundred dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

SECTION 10: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1913, in the sum of \$50,000.00 for constructing Garbage Incinerators and to create a Sinking Fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1937 and ending May 31, 1938, a special tax of Twelve one-hundredth (.12) cents on every one hundred dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

SECTION 11: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1919, in the sum of \$900,000.00 for street Paving, Storm Sewers and Drains and to create a Sinking Fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1937 and ending May 31, 1938, a special tax of two and fifty one one-hundredth (2.51) cents on every one hundred dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

SECTION 69: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of K-Street Improvement Bonds dated July 1, 1937, in the sum of \$45,000.00 and to create a Sinking Fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1937 and ending May 31, 1938, a special tax of twenty five one-hundredth (.25) cents on every one hundred dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

SECTION 70: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issued of L-Sewer Construction Bonds dated July 1, 1937, in the sum of \$48,000.00 and to create a Sinking Fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1937 and ending May 31, 1938, a special tax of twenty six one-hundredth (.26) cents on every one hundred dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

SECTION 71: That to provide for the support and maintenance of The Carnegie Library in said City, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1937 and ending May 31, 1938, a special tax of four (4¢) cents on every one hundred dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

SECTION 72: That to provide funds to pay current expenses in the matter of the firemen, policemen and fire alarm operators pension fund, authorized under the provision of an ordinance passed and approved by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio on August 26, 1929, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1937 and ending May 31, 1938, a special tax of two (2) cents on every one hundred dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

SECTION 73: That to provide for the advertising of the City of San Antonio, to increase the growth of the City, for the improvement thereof and for the benefit of the inhabitants, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1937 and ending May 31, 1938, a special tax of three (3) cents on every one hundred dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

SECTION 74: That there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1937 and ending May 31, 1938, upon every persons, firm or corporation or association of persons pursuing any occupation half of the State Tax imposed upon each such occupation, subject to such restrictions and limitations may be imposed by the Laws of the State of Texas and ordinances of the City of San Antonio.

SECTION 75: EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, an emergency is apparent for the immediate preservation of public peace, health and safety, to-wit: to preserve the financial and borrowing credit of the City, to secure funds for maintaining the necessary functions of government and pay the debts of the City, that requires this ordinance to become effective at once; therefore upon the passage of this ordinance by a vote of four-fifths (4/5) of the Board of Commissioners, it shall be effective from and after the date of its passage as made and provided by the Charter of the City of

San Antonio, Texas.

AN ORDINANCE

ADOPTING A FINAL BUDGET FOR THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 1937 AND MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE EXPENDITURES THEREOF

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

1. Came on this day the public hearing on the budget filed with the City Clerk as required by law, for the expenditures of the City of San Antonio during the current fiscal year at the time and place and after due notice as provided by law; and, after hearing and considering the said budget, at the conclusion of such hearing, the budget as prepared by the Mayor is acted upon, adopted and finally approved by the Board of Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, which budget is hereto attached and made a part hereof, and which is prepared to show as definitely as possible each of the various projects for which appropriations are set up, the amount of money carried for each of said projects, the financial statement of the City, the funds received from all sources during the previous year, the estimated revenue available for the budget and the rate of tax which is required.

2. Said final budget of the expenditures of the City of San Antonio during the current year 1937, beginning the 1st of June 1937 and ending the 31st of May, 1938, and containing the various amounts appropriated for all purposes, is in words and figures as follows:

 MAINTAIN A SPUR TRACK UPON AND ACROSS BRAZOS STREET TO SERVE ROEGLEIN
 PROVISION COMPANY

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That a privilege and a franchise be and the same is granted hereby to the Texas and New Orleans Railroad Company to construct and maintain a spur track springing from the West bound main tract of the Texas and New Orleans Railroad Company, in City Block 2510, at a point approximately 190 feet westerly from the west line of Brazos Street, and extending easterly on the north side of said main track on property of the Railroad Company, and upon and across Brazos Street on to other property of the Railroad Company, in City Block A-36, in the City of San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas, as shown by solid red line on the attached plat.

2. No switch nor any of the appurtenances thereof shall be placed in said street.
