## ---MEMORIALS AND PETITIONS---

The following petitions were read and referred to Commissioner of Fire & Police:

The Service Garage, for permit to install gasoline tank, 2505 S. Flores Street.  
The Vogue, for permit to erect electric sign.  
The Schuler Company, for permit to erect bill board 1200 Block River Ave.

Petition of Mrs Ethel Brown for correction of assessment was read and referred to Commissioner of Taxation.

Petition of women of West End District urging improvement of West End Lake was read and referred to Commissioner of Sanitation, Parks, etc.

Petition of M.E. Hanson for permit to build stairway on Rive side at 102 E, Commerce Street was read and referred to Commissioner of Sanitation, Parks, etc.

Petition of Service Garage for permit to lower curb at 2505 S. Flores Street was read and referred to City Engineer.

Bids for uniforms for Police and Fire Departments, and for furnishing rubber tires for Fire Department were opened and referred to City Purchasing Agent.

No. 277 AN ORDINANCE *MD-866*

WHEREAS, at the time of the acquisition by the City of San Antonio of what is known as the Coliseum property it was understood that the City was to assume the payment of the special assessment heretofore made for the paving of Romana Street in front of said property as evidenced by special assessment certificate No. 1825 in favor of the Uvalde Rock Asphalt Company, Now Therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

That the sum of Four Hundred and Thirteen and 57/100 (\$413.57) Dollars be and is hereby appropriated out of the River Improvement Fund, warrant for which shall be made payable to the Uvalde Rock Asphalt Company in full settlement of said special assessment, together with interest, costs of court and attorneys fees.

No. 278 AN ORDINANCE *- 867*

Refunding taxes paid in error by Clarence Wolff.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the sum of \$13.26 (the San Antonio School Boards proportion being \$3.51) be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the 1918 General Fund to pay Clarence Wolff account of taxes paid in error on Lots 4 to 10, C.B.2606

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Mr Phelps, representing Alamo Post American Legion, addressed the Commissioners requesting permission for the exhibition of Carnival shows during Armistice week celebration, Nov. 8 to 13.

He was advised by the Mayor that such exhibitions would not be permitted on the streets and plazas of the City, but that no objections would be raised to holding them on private grounds like Bowens Island and other places.

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A hearing was given to property owners interested in the improvement of Leigh Street between S. Presa Street and Labor Street, and of Bwrlson Street between Austin Street and New Braunfels Avenue.
