AN ORDINANCE

AUTHORIZING ISSUE OF WARRANTS FOR DEBT DUE FIREMEN AND POLICEMEN

(For full text of this Ordinance, See Ordinance Book "I", Page 358.)

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The following communication was read by Commissioner Plummer:

April 18, 1939.

RE: ABOUT \$550,000 BACK PAY DUE FIREMEN AND POLICEMEN TO MAY 31, 1939,
(AUDITORS' FIGURES) UNDER THE SPEARS LAW

THREE PRINCIPAL ITEMS ARE INVOLVED:

1. The auditor's figures include about \$150,000 overtime for the firemen for the 15 and 9 hour shifts which they requested and which should be eliminated.
2. The auditor's figures do not include about \$160,000 which was deducted because of payments made by the City to the Pension Fund and which the City Attorney advised was a part of the compensation and could legally be paid only as compensation. Therefore the amount due for adjustment is the \$150 per month minimum less the salaries paid and less the pension payments.
3. About \$38,000 has been deducted for absence because of sickness over and above vacation allowance. This is according to law but I hope deductions can be made only where the absence was from causes not in line of duty. There are some claims for as much as six months absence from diseases not possible in line of duty.

The City Attorney has given us the law. Under our oaths of office we should follow it and I intend to do so. This matter should have more careful consideration than it is receiving as it involves over \$300,000 in addition to the adjudicated debt. I ask that the matter go over for one month until after the election and the political pressure is somewhat lessened. The action now proposed will likely be enjoined by the taxpayers while calmer action may be accepted, to advantage of the firemen and police.

It is wrong in principle that the Legislature should impose expenses upon the City without contributing to its support. If the State wishes to take over our municipal government, both assets and liabilities, let it do so and dissolve the municipality. If the Legislature spends let it pay the bills. It is cheap political demagogy to be liberal at the expense of others. This law adds at least 20% to future tax rates and a big debt right now. If the City is to quietly accept tax impositions by those who pay no taxes, or who pay 38% then make it even and include all public employees in the Legislature's generosity with San Antonio's money and if this is to be a habit it is a short cut to bankruptcy.

The bill was before the Legislature, intentionally I presume, during the last City campaign two years ago. Not a move was made to oppose it because politics were above the City's interests. After the election the law that had not been opposed in the Legislature was fought in the courts because if it was accepted there would have been a 70¢ tax raise last year instead of the 45¢ that nearly caused a tax strike, but of course this debt for operating expenses was piling up for which it is now proposed to issue bonds without voting just as unvoted bonds were issued in 1931 for weed cutting and which the taxpayers will be paying for many years. It is purely a legal and not a moral debt and illegal liberality is wrong.

Now we are in another political campaign and the law that was fought in the courts and which the City accepted only under protest is welcomed in such fashion that it is proposed to pay over \$300,000 more than the law or the courts require.

The fire and police department already gets about one fourth of the City's taxes. With this Spears bill it will hereafter get about one third and the City taxpayer, who was already overburdened, can hereafter figure the cost of this law to him as about one tenth of his total City tax bill.

Out State Senator has stated that the law was put in the criminal and not civil code and that the City was a criminal in permitting the firemen to fix their own hours by working alternately in 15 and 9 hours shifts instead of 12 hour shifts which would have suited the City just as well. He argues that crime is not legalized by agreement. If true, were not the firemen co-inspirators and "criminals" with the City when they requested this arrangement of their hours and thus seduced the City into crime for their benefit? Must not one come into court with clean hands? Can one criminal sue another for compensation for crime? I admit it would be a crime if the firemen got about 3-1/2 times as much as the police, largely because of this item.

I am willing to accept the auditor's report except:

1. Overtime pay of firemen because of the 15 and 9 hour shifts to be abandoned and waived.
2. Full pay shall be allowed for time off from causes in line of duty.
3. Individual adjustments pro and con may still be made.

In view of the frequent and politically opportune changes in the attitude of the administration I, as a newcomer in City government, respectfully ask answers to the following questions, unless some of the answers suggested in the foregoing are admitted to be true, viz:

Why was this bill not opposed while it was pending in the Legislature at this time two years ago?

If it was not opposed in the Legislature why was it contested two years in the courts while this back pay accumulated? It was fought to the last and every cent now paid is paid under protest: then why pay \$300,000 more than the Courts have said the City owes? Is it possible that the campaign now on explains such reversal and liberality with the taxpayers' money?

What do those who favor this liberality to the firemen and police propose to do for other City employees? do they favor the same for school teachers?

When the law was passed why were the firemen not put on the 12 hour shifts instead of the 15 and 9 so that the City would not now be confronted with a claim of \$150,000 technical overtime when there was, in fact, no overtime?

Why was there no reserve fund created while this debt was accumulating instead of now issuing bonds for operating expenses?

As City Officials, we are charged with the duty of protecting the City, but also

of giving a square deal. All that the firemen and police get under this law is an unexpected gift and an imposition upon the San Antonio taxpayers and a discrimination in favor of the firemen and police against all other City employees and of the Firemen over the police.

No one objects to good wages but the ability of the taxpayers to pay as well as justice to other City employees must be considered and the firemen and police must be on the square with their City.
