AN ORDINANCE

Appropriating \$1200 to pay for construction of sidewalk on Navarro St. Bridge. (Mill Bridge.)

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the sum of One Thousand two hundred Dollars (\$1200.00) or as much thereof as shall be needed, be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the 1919 Bridge Fund, for the purpose of constructing sidewalks over the Mill Bridge on Navarro Street, as per bid of G. W. Adams.

Granting permit to Wm. Isaac Bledsoe to construct a sanitary sewer on W. Craig Pl. or old Pennsylvania Ave.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio,

SECTION 1. That permission is hereby granted Wm. Isaac Bledsoe to construct an 8" Sanitary Sewer Stub on West Craig Place (Or old Pennsylvania Ave.) beginning at Manhole San Antonio Ave. and extending to the West Property line of San Antonio Ave. according to plat, line and grade made by the City Engineer hereto attached; the cost of said sewer being estimated about Forty Dollars (\$40.00) to be paid by the said Isaac Bledsoe. The final actual cost to be filed with the City Engineer within ten days after completion of the sewer.

SECTION 2. The said sewer to be constructed to the City's line and grade and in accordance

with the City's Standard specification for the construction of sewers in all particulars, and to maintain the sewer in the street for a period of 1 year after the date of the acceptance of the sewer by the City Engineer.

SECTION 3. "Conditioned" that no sewer service connections to this sewer shall be made until it has been completed and properly connected to the City's main, and duly accepted by the City.

SECTION 4. Said sewer, when completed to become the property of the City of San Antonio and part of its public sewer system.

This Ordinance is hereby declared to be of urgent importance for reasons of public welfare apparent herefrom and the same shall take effect at once on the above mentioned condition.

Commissioner Steffler introduced the following resolution, which was read and adopted.

REQUIRING ALL CATTLE KEPT WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO TO BE TESTED BY INTRADERMAL OR SUBCUTANEOUS TUBERCULIN TEST AND REGULATING THE MANNER OF SUCH TEST, AND THE KEEPING OF CATTLE WITHIN SAID AREA, AND PROHIBITING THE SALE OR DISTRIBUTION OF MILK OR MILK PRODUCTS DRAWN FROM COWS NOT TESTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS ORDINANCE, OR PRODUCTS MANUFACTURED FROM MILK DRAWN FROM COWS NOT TESTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS ORDINANCE; AND PRESCRIBING A PENALTY, AN REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH.




Licensing and regulating interurban Motor Buses.
