ACCEPTING PROPOSAL OF SOUTHWEST STONE COMPANY TO FURNISH TRAP-ROCK.

1. WHEREAS, on the 29th day of November A. D. 1933, the City of San Antonio accepted the bid of Rodgers & Stewart for the furnishing of one carload of Trap-Rock, to contain approximately 80 tons, to be in size 1/4 inch downward, freight paid in railway car and delivered to the siding switch of the Street Maintenance Department of the City of San Antonio, immediate shipment, for the price of \$2.20 per ton; and,

2. WHEREAS, upon said date the City of San Antonio rejected all other bids for the furnishing of the above described material; and,

3. WHEREAS, it has been determined by the City Council of the City of San Antonio that the bid of Rodgers & Stewart is not the lowest and best bid for the furnishing of such material; and,

4. WHEREAS, it is now deemed advisable to reject the bid of Rodgers & Stewart and accept that submitted by Southwest Stone Company, at \$2.00 per ton at Knippa, Texas; NOW THEREFORE:-

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

5. That the Ordinance of November 29, 1933, entitled "AN ORDINANCE ACCEPTING THE PROPOSAL OF RODGERS & STEWART FOR ONE CAR-LOAD OF TRAP ROCK", be and the same is hereby repealed.

6. That the bid of Southwest Stone Company wherein \$2.00 per ton on one carload of 1/4" down Trap-Rock, f.o.b. care at Southwest Stone Company's plant at Knippa, Texas, quoted by the Southwest Stone Company in their bid to the City of San Antonio, is hereby accepted, provided that the conditions and requirements of the Street Department of the City of San Antonio be complied with and provided further that the Southwest Stone Company will furnish the City of San Antonio one careload of Trap-Rock to contain approximately 80 tons, to be in size 1/4" down Trap-Rock, at \$2.00 per ton on one car of said 1/4" down Trap-Rock, to be delivered f.o.b. cars at

7. Upon the failure of the Contractor to deliver the proposed supplies and material in strict compliance with the provisions of their proposal and this acceptance, the City shall have the right, without cost or obligation to the City, to purchase the material and have same delivered from whom or at such time and under such conditions as the City shall deem to its, the City's best interest, and any and all expense in so doing shall be borne by the said Contractor, Southwest Stone Company of Knippa, Texas.

8. If any dispute arises between the Contractor or the City as to the meaning of any part of the specifications, description or conditions, or as to the manner of performance of the contract arising from the said proposal and this acceptance, or any parts thereof, or as to the quality or quantity of the material tendered the decision of the Purchasing Agent of the City in such matters shall be final and conclusive, and any doubt as to the meaning of any of the included instruments shall be decided and construed by the Purchasing Agent, who shall give all directions or explanations necessary to make the same effective or to clear any conflict or uncertainty appearing therein.

9. The acceptance and exercise of any right under this contract by the Contractor shall be an acceptance of all of its terms and conditions.

10. All other bids covered by the specifications in this ordinance are hereby rejected
