AN ORDINANCE 08-130

Ordering an election to be held in the City of San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified tax-paying electors of said City, eleven (11) certain separate propositions to borrow money on the credit of said City, and to issue bonds of said City therefor, the proceeds from the sale of which shall be used in effecting and constructing the following permanent public improvements in and for said City, viz:-- (1) Bonds in the sum of \$50,000.00 for the purpose of constructing necessary permanent additions to the present City Hospital building; (2) Bonds in the sum of \$250,000.00 for the purpose of constructing necessary permanent additions to the present City Hall building; (3) Bonds in the sum of \$150,000.00 for the purpose of building incinerators and garbage loading stations, and acquiring sites therefor; (4) Bonds in the sum of \$750,000.00 for the purpose of constructing sewers and drains, and acquiring any land necessary therefor; (5) Bonds in the sum of \$300,000.00 for the purpose of paving and grading the public streets and public places of the City; (6) Bonds in the sum of \$250,000.00 for the purpose of constructing bridges; (7) Bonds in the sum of \$900,000.00 for the purpose of opening, widening and straightening public streets and places; (8) Bonds in the sum of \$150,000.00 for the purpose of acquiring land and sites for public parks, and constructing permanent improvements in the public parks of the City; (9) Bonds in the sum of \$125,000.00 for the purpose of constructing suitable buildings for the Police and Fire Departments, and acquiring necessary sites therefor; (10) Bonds in the sum of \$75,000.00 for the purpose of constructing and completing a public Auditorium building, and completing the acquiring of a site therefor; (11) Bonds in the sum of \$600,000.00 for the purpose of permanently improving the San Antonio River, San Pedro and Alazan Creeks, by widening, deepening, altering, changing and damming the channels thereof, and constructing levees and walls along and near the same, and building dams, dykes and reservoirs at and near the head waters

and watersheds and tributaries thereof, so as to prevent or ameliorate flood conditions and protect the public health and safety, and to acquire any lands and other property necessary therefor.

 WHEREAS, the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio deem it necessary and advisable to issue bonds of said City, for the respective purpose and in the respective amounts hereinafter specified, and desire to submit said propositions to the taxpaying voters as required by law;

THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION ONE: That an election be and is hereby ordered to be held in the City of San Antonio, on ~~Monday~~, the 15th day of November, A. D. 1926, and the Mayor of said City be and he is hereby authorized and directed to issue his proclamation calling said election on said date, at which said election, eleven (11) certain separate propositions to borrow money on the credit of said City, for the purpose of effecting and constructing permanent public improvements within the said City, shall be submitted to the qualified taxpaying voters of said City, as follows, to-wit:-

1st. Shall the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow money on the credit of said City and issue bonds of said City therefor, for permanent public improvements, in the sum of FIFTY THOUSAND (\$50,000.00) DOLLARS; said bonds to be of the face denomination of ONE THOUSAND (\$1,000.00) DOLLARS each, and to mature within a period of forty (40) years, viz:- To be payable serially in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, each year respectively, from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive.

All of said bonds to bear interest from date at the rate of four and one-half (4½%) per centum per annum, payable semiannually; said Commissioners being authorized to negotiate said bonds in lots as they may determine and direct, and to be authorized to levy and to assess and to collect annually, taxes sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as same become payable, and create a sinking fund as provided by law, sufficient to pay said bonds at maturity, viz:- as each of said bonds and series of bonds, shall respectively mature.

Said loan being desired for the purpose of constructing necessary permanent additions to the present City Hospital building; said public improvements to be constructed being the erection of permanent additions to and as part of said City Hospital building, for the use of the public of said City.

2nd. Shall the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow money on the credit of said City and issue bonds of said City therefor, for permanent public improvements, in the sum of TWO HUNDRED AND FIFTY THOUSAND (\$250,000.00) DOLLARS; said bonds to be of the face denomination of ONE THOUSAND (\$1,000.00) DOLLARS each, and to mature within a period of forty (40) years, viz:- To be payable serially in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, each year respectively, from (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive.

All of said bonds to bear interest from date at the rate of four and one-half (4½) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually; said Commissioners being authorized to negotiate said bonds in lots as they may determine and direct, and to be authorized to levy and to assess and to collect annually, taxes sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as same become payable, and to create a sinking fund as provided by law, sufficient to pay said bonds at maturity, viz:- as each of said bonds and series of bonds, shall respectively mature.

Said loan being desired for the purpose of constructing and permanent equipping of useful and necessary additions to and enlargement of the present City Hall building of said City; said public improvements to be constructed being the erection and permanent equipment of

Additions to and as a part of said City Hall building, for the use of said City, and the public thereof.

3rd. Shall the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow money on the credit of said City and issue bonds therefor, for permanent public improvements, in the sum of ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY THOUSAND (\$150,000.00) DOLLARS; said bonds to be of the face denomination of ONE THOUSAND (\$1,000.00) DOLLARS each, and to mature within a period of forty (40) years, viz:- To be payable serially in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, each year respectively, from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive.

All of said bonds to bear interest from date at the rate of four and one-half ($4\frac{1}{2}\%$) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually; said Commissioners being authorized to negotiate said bonds in lots as they may determine and direct, and to be authorized to levy and to assess and to collect annually, taxes sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as same become payable, and to create a sinking fund as provided by law, sufficient to pay said bonds at maturity, viz:- as each of said bonds and series of bonds, shall respectively mature.

Said loan being desired for the purpose of protecting and promoting the health of the people of the City, by building incinerators and garbage loading stations, and acquiring sites therefor, and extending the present sanitary equipment; said public improvements to be constructed being the construction of additional permanent garbage loading stations and permanent building provided with permanent furnaces for the burning of garbage for said City, and acquiring sites therefore, and for extending and supplementing the present permanent sanitary equipment of said City.

4th. Shall the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow money on the credit of said City and issue bonds of said City therefor, for permanent ^{public} improvements, in the sum of SEVEN HUNDRED AND FIFTY THOUSAND (\$750,000.00) DOLLARS; said bonds to be of the face denomination of ONE THOUSAND (\$1,000.00) DOLLARS each, and to mature within a period of forty (40) years, viz:- To be payable serially in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, each year respectively, from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive.

All of said bonds to bear interest from date at the rate of four and one-half ($4\frac{1}{2}\%$) per centum per annum, payable semiannually; said Commissioners being authorized to negotiate said bonds in lots as they may determine and direct, and to be authorized to levy and to assess and to collect annually, taxes sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as same become payable, and create a sinking fund as provided by law, sufficient to pay said bonds at maturity, viz:- as each of said bonds and series of bonds, shall respectively mature.

Said loan being desired for the purpose of protecting the health and safety of the people of the City, by the construction of a permanent system of sewers and drains, and acquiring any parcels of land which may be necessary therefor; said public improvements to be constructed being the laying and constructing of a system of permanent sewers and drains, with mains, laterals, and necessary accessories thereto, extending and supplementing the present system of sewers and drains of said City.

5th. Shall the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow money on the credit of said City and issue bonds of said City therefor, for permanent public improvements, in the sum of THREE HUNDRED THOUSAND (\$300,000.00) DOLLARS; said bonds to be of the face denomination of ONE THOUSAND (\$1,000.00) DOLLARS each, and to mature within a period of forty (40) years, viz:- To be payable serially in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, each year respectively, from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive.

All of said bonds to bear interest from date at the rate of four and one-half ($4\frac{1}{2}\%$) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually; said Commissioners being authorized to negotiate

said bonds in lots as they may determine and direct, and to be authorized to levy and to assess and to collect annually, taxes sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as same become payable, and create a sinking fund as provided by law, sufficient to pay said bonds at maturity, viz:- as each of said bonds and series of bonds, shall respectively mature.

Said loan being desired for the purpose of improving the condition of the public streets and public places of said City, by permanently paving and grading the same; said public improvements to be constructed being the paving and grading in permanent manner, of the streets and public places, in the several wards of said City,

6th. Shall the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow money on the credit of said City and issue bonds of said City therefor, for permanent public improvements, in the sum of TWO HUNDRED AND FIFTY THOUSAND (\$250,000.00) DOLLARS; said bonds to be of the face denomination of ONE THOUSAND (\$1,000.00) DOLLARS each, and to mature serially in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, each year respectively, from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive.

All of said bonds to bear interest from date at the rate of four and one-half (4½%) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually; said Commissioners being authorized to negotiate said bonds in lots as they may determine and direct, and to be authorized to levy and to assess and to collect annually, taxes sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as same becomes payable, and to create a sinking fund as provided by law, sufficient to pay said bonds at maturity, viz:- as each of said bonds and series of bonds, shall respectively mature.

Said loan being desired for the purpose of improving the condition of the public streets of said City, by building permanent bridges; said improvements to be constructed being the construction of permanent bridges over streams crossing public streets in the several wards of said City.

7th. Shall the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow money on the credit of said City and issue bonds of said City therefor, for permanent public improvements, in the sum of NINE HUNDRED THOUSAND (\$900,000.00) DOLLARS ^{said bonds} to be of the face denomination of ONE THOUSAND (\$1,000.00) DOLLARS each, and to mature within a period of forty (40) years, viz:- To be payable serially in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, each year respectively, from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive.

All of said bonds to bear interest from date at the rate of four and one-half (4½%) per centum per annum, payable semiannually; said Commissioners being authorized to negotiate said bonds in lots as they may determine and direct, and to be authorized to levy and to assess and to collect annually, taxes sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as same become payable, and create a sinking fund as provided by law, sufficient to pay said bonds at maturity, viz:- as each of said bonds and series of bonds, shall respectively mature.

Said loan being desired for the purpose of improving the public convenience and traffic conditions of the public streets and public places of said City, by opening, widening and straightening public streets and places, and acquiring any parcels of land which may be necessary therefor; said public improvements to be constructed and effected, being the permanent opening, widening and straightening of public streets and places in the several wards of said City, and the acquisition of any parcels of land which may be necessary therefore.

8th. Shall the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow money on the credit of said City and issue bonds of said City therefor, for permanent public improvements, in the sum of ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY THOUSAND (\$150,000.00) DOLLARS; said bonds to be of the face denomination of ONE THOUSAND (\$1,000.00) DOLLARS each, and to mature within a period of forty (40) years, viz:- To be payable serially in yearly installments as nearly

equal as practicable, each year respectively, from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive.

All of said bonds to bear interest from date at the rate of four and one-half (4½) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually; said Commissioners being authorized to negotiate said bonds in lots as they may determine and direct, and to be authorized to levy and to assess and to collect annually, taxes sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as same become payable, and create a sinking fund as provided by law, sufficient to pay said bonds at maturity, viz:- as each of said bonds and series of bonds, shall respectively mature.

Said loan being desired for the purpose of purchasing and acquiring land and sites for public parks and constructing permanent public improvements in the public parks of said City; said improvements to be constructed being the construction of permanent buildings, plumbing and other structures in said public parks belonging to the City of San Antonio, and the purchase and acquisition of any necessary land and sites therefor.

9th. Shall the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow money on the credit of said City and issue bonds of said City therefor, for permanent public improvements, in the sum of ONE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE THOUSAND (\$125,000.00) DOLLARS; said bonds to be of the face denomination of ONE THOUSAND (\$1,000.00) DOLLARS each, and to mature within a period of forty (40) years, viz:- To be payable serially in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, each year respectively, from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive.

All of said bonds to bear interest from date at the rate of four and one-half (4½) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually; said Commissioners being authorized to negotiate said bonds in lots as they may determine and direct, and to be authorized to levy and to assess and to collect annually, taxes sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as same become payable, and to create a sinking fund as provided by law, sufficient to pay said bonds at maturity, viz:- as each of said bonds and series of bonds, shall respectively mature.

Said loan being desired for the purpose of improving the facilities and service of the fire and police departments of said City, by erecting suitable permanent buildings therefor, and acquiring necessary sites for same; said improvements to be constructed being permanent buildings for additional fire and police stations, and the acquisition of the necessary sites therefor.

10th. Shall the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow money on the credit of said City and issue bonds of said City therefor, for permanent public improvements, in the sum of SEVENTY-FIVE THOUSAND (\$75,000.00) DOLLARS; said bonds to be of the face denomination of ONE THOUSAND (\$1,000.00) DOLLARS each, and to mature within a period of forty (40) years, viz:- To be payable in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, each year respectively, from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive.

All of said bonds to bear interest from date at the rate of four and one-half (4½) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually; said Commissioners being authorized to negotiate said bonds in lots as they may determine and direct, and to be authorized to levy and to assess and to collect annually, taxes sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as same become payable, and create a sinking fund as provided by law, sufficient to pay ^{said} bonds at maturity, viz:- as each of said bonds and series of bonds, shall respectively mature.

Said loan being desired for the purpose of constructing, erecting and completing a permanent public auditorium building in the City of San Antonio, and completing the acquiring of a site therefor; said improvements to be constructed being the erection, construction and completion of a permanent public building to be used as a public auditorium, and acquiring and completing the acquiring of a site therefor, within the corporate limits of said City.

11th. Shall the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow money on the credit of said City and issue bonds of said City therefor, for permanent public improvements, in the sum of SIX HUNDRED THOUSAND (\$600,000.00) DOLLARS; said bonds to be of the face denomination of ONE THOUSAND (\$1,000.00) DOLLARS, each and to mature within a period of forty (40) year, viz:- To be payable serially in amounts of FIFTEEN THOUSAND (\$15,000.00) DOLLARS, each year respectively, from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive.

All of said bonds to bear interest from date at the rate of four and one-half (4½%) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually; said Commissioners being authorized to negotiate said bonds in lots as they may determine and direct, and to be authorized to levy and to assess and collect annually, taxes sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as same become payable, and create a sinking fund as provided by law, sufficient to pay said bonds at maturity, viz:- as each of said bonds and series of bonds, shall respectfully mature.

Said loan being desired for the purpose of permanently improving the San Antonio River, San Pedro and Alazan Creeks, by widening, deepening, altering, changing and damming the channels thereof; and constructing levees and walls along and near the same, and building dams, dykes and reservoirs at and near the head waters and the water sheds of said river and creeks and tributaries thereof, all in a permanent manner, so as to prevent or ameliorate flood conditions, and protect the public health and safety, and to acquire any lands and other property necessary therefor; said improvements to be constructed being the widening, deepening, altering, changing and damming of the channels of the San Antonio River, San Pedro and Alazan Creeks, and constructing levees and walls along and near the same, and building dams, dykes and reservoirs at and near the head waters and the water sheds of said river and creeks and tributaries thereof, all in a permanent manner, and acquiring any lands and other property necessary therefor.

SECTION TWO: The manner of holding said election shall be governed by the laws of the State regulating general elections, and by the provisions of the Charter of the City of San Antonio and the Ordinances of said City for such cases lawfully made and provided; and as provided by law, only those persons shall vote at said election who are qualified electors of said City and who pay taxes on property in said City; and the ballot to be used in said election shall be an "official ballot" arranged in such manner that persons qualified at said election may vote either for or against any or all of said propositions.

SECTION THREE: That the form in which said eleven (11) several propositions shall be voted on respectively, shall be substantially as follows, to-wit:-

1st. That at said election, all voters desiring to support the FIRST PROPOSITION to issue bonds as hereinbefore in Section One described, shall have printed upon their ballots the words:

"FOR the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio in the sum of FIFTY THOUSAND (\$50,000.00) DOLLARS, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of four and one-half (4½%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of constructing necessary permanent addition to the present City Hospital building."

And those opposed to said proposition to issue bonds shall have printed upon their ballots, the words:

"AGAINST the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio in the sum of FIFTY THOUSAND (\$50,000.00) DOLLARS, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of four and one-half (4½%) per centum per annum; said

loan being desired for the purpose of constructing necessary permanent additions to the present City Hospital building."

2nd. That at said election, all voters desiring to support the SECOND PROPOSITION to issue bonds as hereinbefore in Section One described, shall have printed upon their ballots the words:

"FOR THE issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio in the sum of TWO HUNDRED AND FIFTY THOUSAND (\$250,000.00) DOLLARS, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of four and one-half (4½%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of constructing and permanent equipping of useful and necessary additions to and enlargement of the present City Hall building."

And those opposed to said proposition to issue bonds shall have printed upon their ballots, the words:

"AGAINST the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio in the sum of TWO HUNDRED AND FIFTY THOUSAND (\$250,000.00) DOLLARS, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of four and one-half (4½%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of constructing and permanent equipping of useful and necessary additions to and enlargement of the present City Hall building."

3rd. That at said election, all voters desiring to support the THIRD PROPOSITION to issue bonds as hereinbefore in Section One described, shall have printed upon their ballots the words:

"FOR the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio in the sum of ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY THOUSAND (\$150,000.00) DOLLARS, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of four and one-half (4½%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of protecting and promoting the health of the people of the City, by building incinerators and garbage loading stations, and acquiring sites therefor, and extending the present sanitary equipment."

And those opposed to said proposition to issue bonds shall have printed upon their ballots, the words:

" AGAINST the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio in the sum of ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY THOUSAND (\$150,000.00) DOLLARS, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of four and one-half (4½%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of protecting and promoting the health of the people of the City, by building incinerators and garbage loading stations, and acquiring sites therefor, and extending the present sanitary equipment."

4th. That at said election, all voters desiring to support the FOURTH PROPOSITION to issue bonds as hereinbefore in Section One described, shall have printed upon their ballots the words:

" FOR the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio in the sum of SEVEN HUNDRED AND FIFTY THOUSAND (\$750,000.00) DOLLARS, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of four and one-half (4½%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of protecting the health and safety of the people of the City by the construction of a permanent system of sewers and drains, and acquiring any parcels of land which may be necessary therefor."

And those opposed to said proposition to issue bonds shall have printed upon their ballots, the words:

" AGAINST the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio in the sum of SEVEN HUNDRED AND FIFTY THOUSAND (\$750,000.00) DOLLARS, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of four and one-half (4½%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of protecting the health and safety of the people of the City by the construction of a permanent system of sewers and drains, and acquiring any parcels of land which may be necessary therefor."

5th. That at said election, all voters desiring to support the FIFTH PROPOSITION to issue bonds as hereinbefore in Section One described, shall have printed upon their ballots the words:

"FOR the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio in the sum of THREE HUNDRED THOUSAND (\$300,000.00) DOLLARS, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of four and one-half (4½%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of improving the condition of the public streets and public places of the City by permanently paving and grading the same."

And those opposed to said proposition to issue bonds shall have printed upon their ballots, the words:

" AGAINST the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio in the sum of THREE HUNDRED THOUSAND (\$300,000.00) DOLLARS, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of four and one-half (4½%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of improving the condition of the public streets and public places of the City by permanently paving and grading the same."

6th. That at said election, all voters desiring to support the SIXTH PROPOSITION to issue bonds as hereinbefore in Section One described, shall have printed upon their ballots the words:

"FOR the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio in the sum of TWO HUNDRED AND FIFTY THOUSAND (\$250,000.00) DOLLARS, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of four and one-half (4½%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of improving the condition of the public streets and said City by building permanent bridges."

And those opposed to said proposition to issue bonds shall have printed upon their ballots, the words:

"AGAINST the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio in the sum of TWO HUNDRED AND FIFTY THOUSAND (\$250,000.00) DOLLARS, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of four and one-half (4½%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of improving the condition of the public streets of said City by building permanent bridges."

7th. That at said election, all voters desiring to support the SEVENTH PROPOSITION to issue bonds as hereinbefore in Section One described, shall have printed upon their ballots the words:

" FOR the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio in the sum of NINE HUNDRED THOUSAND (\$900,000.00) DOLLARS, payable serially during

the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of four and one-half (4½%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of improving the public convenience and traffic conditions of the public streets and public places of said City, by opening, widening and straightening public streets and places, and acquiring any parcels of land which may be necessary therefor."

And those opposed to said proposition to issue bonds shall have printed upon their ballots, the words:

"AGAINST the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio in the sum of NINE HUNDRED THOUSAND (\$900,000.00) DOLLARS, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of four and one-half (4½%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of improving the public convenience and traffic conditions of the public streets and public places of said City, by opening, widening and straightening public streets and places, and acquiring any parcels of land which may be necessary therefor."

8th. That at said election, all voters desiring to support the EIGHTS PROPOSITION to issue bonds as hereinbefore in Section One described, shall have printed upon their ballots the words:

"FOR the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio in the sum of ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY THOUSAND (\$150,000.00) DOLLARS, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of four and one-half (4½%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of purchasing and acquiring land and sites for public parks and constructing permanent public improvements in the public parks of said City."

And those opposed to said proposition to issue bonds shall have printed upon their ballots, the words:

"AGAINST the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio in the sum of ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY THOUSAND (\$150,000.00) DOLLARS, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of four and one-half (4½%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of purchasing and acquiring land and sites for public parks and constructing permanent public improvements in the public parks of said City."

9th. That at said election, all voters desiring to support the NINTH PROPOSITION to issue bonds as hereinbefore in Section One described, shall have printed upon their ballots the words:

"FOR the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio in the sum of ONE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE THOUSAND (\$125,000.00) DOLLARS, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of four and one-half (4½%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of improving the facilities and service of the Fire and Police Departments of said City, by erecting suitable permanent buildings therefor, and acquiring sites for same."

And those opposed to said proposition to issue bonds shall have printed upon their ballots the words:

"AGAINST the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio in the sum of ONE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE THOUSAND (\$125,000.00) DOLLARS payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly

equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of four and one-half (4½%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of improving the facilities and services of the Fire and Police Departments of said City, by erecting suitable permanent buildings therefor, and acquiring sites for same."

10th. That at said election, all voters desiring to support the TENTH PROPOSITION to issue bonds as hereinbefore in Section One described, shall have printed upon their ballots the words:

" FOR the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio in the sum of SEVENTY-FIVE THOUSAND (\$75,000.00) DOLLARS, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of four and one-half (4½%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of constructing, erecting and completing a permanent public Auditorium building in said City, and completing the acquiring of a site therefor."

And those opposed to said proposition to issue bonds shall have printed upon their ballots, the words:

"AGAINST the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio in the sum of SEVENTY-FIVE THOUSAND (\$75,000.00) DOLLARS, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of four and one-half (4½%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of constructing, erecting and completing a permanent public Auditorium building in said City, and completing the acquiring of a site therefor."

11th. That at said election, all voters desiring to support the ELEVENTH PROPOSITION to issue bonds as hereinbefore in Section One described, shall have printed upon their ballots the words:

"FOR the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio in the sum of SIX HUNDRED THOUSAND (\$600,000.00) DOLLARS, payable serially, in amounts of FIFTEEN THOUSAND (\$15,000.00) DOLLARS each year, respectively, from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive, and bearing interest at the rate of four and one-half (4½%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of improving the San Antonio River, San Pedro and Alazan Creeks, by widening, deepning, altering changing and damming the channels thereof, and constructing levees and walls along and near the same, and building dams, dykes and reservoirs at and near the headwaters and the water sheds of said river and creeks and tributaries thereof, all in a permanent manner, so as to prevent or ameliorate flood conditions and protect the public health and safety, and to acquire any lands and other property necessary therefor."

And those opposed to said proposition to issue bonds shall have printed upon their ballots, the words:

" AGAINST the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio in the sum of SIX HUNDRED THOUSAND (\$600,000.00) DOLLARS, payable serially in amounts of FIFTEEN THOUSAND (\$15,000.00) DOLLARS each year, respectively, from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive, and bearing interest at the rate of four and one-half (4½%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of improving the San Antonio River, San Pedro and Alazan Creeks, by widening, deeping, altering, changing and damming the channels thereof, and constructing levees and walls along and near the same, and building dams, dyks and reservoirs at and near the headwaters and the water sheds of said river and creeks and tributaries thereof, all in a permanent manner, so as to prevent or

ameliorate flood conditions and protect the public health and safety, and to acquire any lands and other property necessary therefor."

SECTION FOUR: That said election shall be held within the City of San Antonio, and in each and all of the various election precincts thereof, variously located in each of the several wards of said City as said election precincts are now fixed and established, and being the same election precincts used in recent state and county elections; and said election herein ordered shall be held during the hours required by law, and at the place in each such respective election precinct set opposite the number of such precinct, in the following table, to-wit:

SECTION SIX: That a copy of this Ordinance signed by the Mayor of the City of San Antonio shall constitute a proper order for said election, and, with such additions thereto as may be appropriated, shall be sufficient proclamation and notice of said election; and the Mayor is hereby directed to cause such notice to be published by posting one copy thereof in each of said election precincts, at a public place, viz:- at the respective voting places hereinbefore named, at least thirty days before the date fixed for said election, and by causing the same to be published in the official journal, viz:- in the SAN ANTONIO EVENING NEWS, a daily newspaper of general circulation, published in the City of San Antonio, at least once in each week for and during a period of four weeks preceding said election.

AN ORDINANCE 08-131

Authorizing the borrowing of money on the credit of the City of San Antonio and the issuance of bonds therefor in the sum of FIFTY THOUSAND (\$50,000.00) DOLLARS for permanent public improvements in said City, namely, for the purpose of constructing necessary additions to the present City Hospital building.

WHEREAS, on the 15th day of November, A. D. 1926, the qualified taxpaying voters of the City of San Antonio, in the State of Texas and County of Bexar, by an election duly held and conducted on said date in said City, in accordance with an Ordinance of the Commissioners of said City ordering said election, passed and approved on the 11th day of October, A. D. 1926, and in accordance with the laws for such cases made and provided, did, as shown by the canvass of the returns of said election, authorize and empower the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio to issue bonds of said City in the sum of FIFTY THOUSAND (\$50,000.00) DOLLARS, payable serially within forty (40) years from date and bearing interest at the rate of four and one-half (4½%) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually, the proceeds of said bonds to be used for the purpose of constructing necessary permanent additions to the present City Hospital building; said public improvements to be constructed being the erection of necessary permanent additions to and as part of said City Hospital building, for the use of the public of said City:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

SECTION ONE: That the City of San Antonio shall borrow money on the credit of the City and shall issue bonds therefor, as hereinafter described, in the sum of FIFTY THOUSAND (\$50,000.00) DOLLARS, for permanent public improvements to be constructed and effected within the limits of the City of San Antonio; said loan being desired for the purpose of constructing necessary permanent additions to the present City Hospital building; said improvements to be construction being erection of permanent additions to and as part of said City Hospital building, for the use of the public of said City; and the purpose for which said bonds are issued as same shall appear in said bonds being "CITY HOSPITAL BUILDING".

SECTION TWO: That the Mayor of said City be and he is hereby authorized and directed to cause to be engraved, printed and executed in due form of law Fifty (50) bonds with coupons attached in conformity with this ordinance; which bonds shall be numbered consecutively from One (1) to Fifty (50) inclusive, each in the denomination of ONE THOUSAND (\$1,000.00) DOLLARS, payable in gold coin of the United States of America of the present standard weight and fine-
