Repealing resolution and ordinance authorizing contract with Sphinx Advertising System.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that,

SECTION 1. That a certain Resolution purporting to authorize the Mayor to enter into a contract with the Sphinx Advertising System of San Antonio, Texas, said Resolution purporting to have been adopted at a meeting of the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, on October 30, 1922, be and the same is hereby rescinded, and any contract purporting to have been made between said City and W. P. Bates and Jack T. Forrest, trading as partners, under the name and style of the Sphinx Advertising System, be, and the same is hereby declared null and void and of no force or effect.

SECTION 11. That an ordinance authorizing the Mayor to enter into a contract with the Sphinx Advertising System of San Antonio, Texas, for the installation and maintenance of Automatic Trash Cans on the streets of the City of San Antonio, adopted at a meeting of the Commissioners of said City on August 11, 1921 be and the same is hereby repealed, and that certain contract purporting to have been entered into on August 26, 1921, by virtue thereof between the City of San Antonio and W. P. Bates, J. T. Forrest and W. T. Board, trading as partners under the name and style of the Sphinx Advertising System, be and the same is declared null and void and of further force or effect.
