On motion of Mr. Dietert, seconded by Mr. Winton, the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting was dispensed with.

The first zoning case heard was Case 675 to rezone Lot 547, NCB 9308, located at 815 Grosvenor Blvd from "C" RESIDENCE DISTRICT to "F" LOCAL RETAIL DISTRICT. The Planning Director explained the recommendation of the Planning Commission was to rezone the property to "D" APARTMENT DISTRICT be approved. Seconded by Mr. Winton, the recommendation of the Planning Commission was approved by passage of the following ordinance by the following vote: AYES, Kuykendall, Dietert, Passur, McMahon, Winton, Gayoso, Olivares, Daniels, San Martin; NAYS, None.

AN ORDINANCE 26,304

AMENDING SECTION 2 OF AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING ZONING REGULATIONS AND DISTRICTS IN ACCORDANCE WITH A COMPREHENSIVE PLAN, ETC.," PASSED AND APPROVED ON NOVEMBER 3, 1938, BY CHANGING THE CLASSIFICATION AND RE-ZONING OF CERTAIN PROPERTY DESCRIBED HEREIN: CASE NO. 675, TO RE-ZONE FROM "C" RESIDENCE DISTRICT TO "D" APARTMENT DISTRICT, LOT 547, NCB 9308

Next heard was Case No. 943 to rezone Lots 10 and 20, NCB 12199 located on the west side of North New Braunfels Avenue from "A" RESIDENCE DISTRICT to "B" RESIDENCE DISTRICT. The Planning Director explained that the Commission recommended the change because it is in conformity with the neighborhood plan and that sidewalks be provided on North New Braunfels, that curbs be provided along North New Braunfels and that curb cuts be constructed in accordance with the recommendation of the Planning Commission.

Mr. John Dittmar, attorney representing Robert C. Nelson, P. B. Briant, Dr. W. C. Hutchins, and others, owners of adjoining property, protested against the change. He stated that these people had built residences or were planning to build homes on their property and that they had bought the property with the understanding that it was to be "A" RESIDENCE DISTRICT.

Mr. Passur moved that this Zoning Case be referred back to the Planning Commission for restudy. Seconded by Dr. San Martin, the motion carried by the following vote: AYES, Kuykendall, Dietert, Passur, McMahon, Winton, Gayoso, Olivares, Daniels, San Martin; NAYS, None

Next heard was Case 910 to rezone the South 159.7 feet of Lot 6 and the north 100 feet of the 259.7 feet of Lot 6, NCB 11108, Corner of Gillette and Commercial, from "B" RESIDENCE DISTRICT to "F" LOCAL RETAIL DISTRICT.

The Planning Director explained that this was a rehearing of the Case. That the property had been replatted, but the Planning Commission recommended denial because the request is premature, the area predominately being restricted to more or less one-family dwellings and that it would constitute spot zoning.

Mr. Gayoso stated that he doubted anyone would buy these lots for residences and that in his opinion the property can only be used for "F" LOCAL RETAIL use. It was pointed out that provisions had been made for sidewalks and dedication of 13 ft. in the replatting. Mr. Gayoso moved to override the recommendation of the Planning Commission and grant the rezoning. The motion was seconded by Dr. San Martin. It being required to have seven affirmative votes the motion failed by the following vote: AYES, Passur, Winton, Gayoso, Pinson, San Martin, Dietert; NAYS, McMahon, Olivares, Kuykendall.

Mr. Winton then moved that the matter be referred back to the Planning Commission for further study. Seconded by Dietert, the motion carried by the following vote: AYES, Dietert, Passur, Winton, Gayoso, Olivares, Pinson, San Martin; NAYS, Kuykendall, McMahon.

Next Case was Case 861 to rezone Lot A8, NCB 1714 located on the Northeast corner of McCullough and French from "D" APARTMENT DISTRICT to "F" LOCAL RETAIL DISTRICT.

The Planning Director explained that this was a re-hearing of the case heard on March 27, at which time the Council approved the change subject to replatting and dedication. He stated that Mr. Davis was not willing to replat and make dedication. Mr. Bond Davis, owner of the property reviewed the history of the case. He stated that the Planning Commission in 1956 rezone the property across the street on McCullough and has since also granted additional non-conforming use to doctor's offices on McCullough.

Mr. John Wheeler, representing Mr. Davis, stated that it was unconstitutional and illegal to take property from anyone without compensation and that the action taken by the Council at the last hearing was the only legal action it could take.

The minutes of the last hearing were then read by the City Clerk. After further discussion by the Council and City Attorney, Mr. Winton made the motion that this hearing be continued until next Thursday in order that the Council may make a further study of it. Seconded by Mayor Kuykendall, the hearing was continued until May 1, by the following vote: AYES, Kuykendall, Dietert, Passur, Winton, Gayoso, Pinson, San Martin; NAYS, McMahon, Olivares.

Dr. McMahon left the meeting at this time.

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Next heard was Case No. 927 to rezone West 58.33 feet of Lot 22, NCB 8059, located at 1818 El Monte from "B" RESIDENCE DISTRICT to "F" LOCAL RETAIL DISTRICT.

The Planning Director explained that the Planning Commission recommended the change subject to the property complying with the dedication, platting side-back lines, adequate screening, side walks and curb cut provisions. He stated that all provisions had been complied with or agreed to.

Mr. August Offer, Jr., owner of Lot 7, south of the property in question, protested the rezoning. Mr. Alfred Offer, attorney, reviewed the reasons for which the Planning Commission recommended the change and stated that not one was for the welfare of the people.

He stated that there were deed restrictions on the property in question, that the notices of the hearing sent out by the Planning Department were incorrect and although the legal description is correct in his opinion the recommendation of the Planning Department is void. He stated that the recommendation was unreasonable, unfair, and arbitrary, and asked that the change be denied. The owner of Lots 6, 7, and 8, NCB 8059 also opposed the change. Mr. Offer then read a letter from Mr. R. C. Duncan of 825 El Monte Street opposing the change. Mr. Dean F. Jackson, 831 El Monte Street stated that he purchased the property because he thought that deed restrictions would protect his property and asked that the change be denied as did Mr. Erwin Buck. Mr. Sam Biery, attorney for the petitioners, showed the Council on maps the proposed use of the property and stated that they would comply with all the requirements of the Planning Department. After further discussion, Dr. San Martin moved to over-ride the recommendation of the Planning Commission and deny the change. The motion lost for lack of a second.

Mr. Olivares then moved to approve the recommendation of the Planning Commission. Seconded by Mr. Gayoso, the recommendation of the Planning Commission was approved by passage of the following ordinance by the following vote: AYES, Dietert, Passur, Winton, Gayoso, Olivares, Pinson, Kuykendall, San Martin; NAYS, None; ABSENT, McMahon.

The last zoning case heard was Case 948 to rezone Tract A, NCB 9315, located on the northeast corner of Verne and Opperheimer, from "F" LOCAL RETAIL DISTRICT to "C" RESIDENCE DISTRICT. The Planning Director explained that some time ago the property owners had joined together and had the property platted into one Lot and rezoned to "F" LOCAL RETAIL DISTRICT in order that the property could be sold in one package but that the deal had fallen through. That now the people want to have the property replatted into the original lots but the Planning Commission would not do so unless

the property was rezoned back to "C" RESIDENCE DISTRICT. Mr. Charles Peaires stated he was in favor of changing the lots back to the original plat but not to change the zoning because people want to sell the property for business purposes.

After further discussion, Dr. San Martin moved that the recommendation of the Planning Commission to rezone the property back to "C" RESIDENCE DISTRICT be approved. Seconded by Mr. Dietert, the recommendation of the Planning Commission was approved by passage of the following ordinance by the following vote: AYE, Kuykendall, Dietert, Passur, Winton, Gayoso, Olivares, Daniels, San Martin; NAYS, None; ABSENT, McMahon.

The King told of the many activities they had participated in during the week and the great number of children they had entertained.

Mr. Valdez, an attorney representing property owners in the vicinity of Hamilton and West Commerce Streets, presented a petition requesting installation of a traffic control signal device. Mr. Stewart Fischer reported on the matter and gave the requirements for a signal device on a State maintained road. He stated he would inquire about getting State approval. Mr. Andrews, City Manager, stated that a survey would be made into the overall traffic conditions and that it might be that a device can be installed at some location in the vicinity requested.

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The Clerk then read an ordinance accepting proposal and creating contract with Magnolia Petroleum Company to furnish Stinson Airport aviation gasoline for resale. Mr. Albert Tripp, Purchasing Agent, stated he was recommending acceptance of the Magnolia bid because the Gulf Oil Company bid did not meet the requirements as they could not furnish dispensing equipment for sixty days.

Mr. R. E. Porter, representing Gulf Oil Corporation, stated that in the industry it was common practice for one company to allow another 60 days in which to bring in equipment but in this case they were not allowed to do so. He stated that under remarks he had only requested he be allowed 60 days to set up equipment and has since made arrangements to have equipment available by May 1, 1958. The City Attorney reviewed the Gulf Oil Company bid and ruled that the bid did meet specifications. The City Manager then announced that he would like to change his recommendation to accept the bid of Gulf Oil Corporation, which was the low bid. Mr. A. C. Pump, representing Magnolia Petroleum Company stated that since their competitor had been allowed to renegotiate their bid they asked for the same privilege. After further discussion, the Mayor recessed the meeting for one hour to resume at 1:30 p.m.
