Commissioner Steffler, introduced the following resolution, which was on his motion adopted by unanimous vote.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS: On April 11th, 1929 the City of San Antonio entered into a contract with J. De. Puy as Principal and The National Surety Co. New York: Constitution Indemnity Co.; Massachusetts Bonding and Insurance Co; American Employers Insurance Co; Aetna Casualty & Surety Co. and United States Fidelity and Guaranty Co., as Surities to Construct a Sewage Treatment Pland for the said City of San Antonio, Texas. and

WHEREAS: Article XI, subparagraph (G) requires the Contractor to tie into the outfall sewer "A good substantial tie-in shall be made to the present sewer" and

WHEREAS: The tie in that was made by the Contractor necessitated his cutting an opening in the Main Concrete sewer Line, approximately a yard square to by pass the sewage while the connection was being made. After which when this opening was closed the contractor merely laid thin sheet iron over the opening and covered it with dirt, and,

WHEREAS: With an exceptional Volume of Water going through the main, on January 12th, 1931, this temporary stopper was pushed out and raw sewage was flowwing over the adjacent land to the San Antonio River, and,

WHEREAS, The attention of the contractor was called to this failure, to which he replied

that he was disinterested and would do nothing about it. In the emergency and in the presence of 30 Million gallons of water per day, the City was forced to control this flow the total cost of which was \$2353.40. and,

WHEREAS: The Contractor failing to afford a remedy the City made claim upon the Surities whose Bond we hold the premium being paid by the City through the General Contract. The Surities Companies having failed to give relief. NOW

THEREFORE: BE IT RESOLVED:

That the City Attorney be and is hereby instructed to bring legal action against the Contractor and his Surities for this specific failure and such other failures, hidden at the time of acceptance but which have since become apparent, that the City of San Antonio may secure the relief to which it is entitled under the contract above mentioned.

AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO TO ACQUIRE TITLE TO A ONE-HALF UNDIVIDED INTEREST IN LOT NO. 9, C. B. NO. 2595, FROM J. D. VASBINER, NECESSARY FOR THE WIDENING OF SAN PEDRO CREEK.

WHEREAS, heretofore, to-wit, on the 21st day of December, A. D. 1925, J. A. Vasbinder, by and through J. D. Vasbinder, his attorney in fact, did grant, sell, and convey unto the City of San Antonio an undivided one-half interest in a portion of land described as follows:

Beginning 125.0 feet S. of N. E. Corner of Lot No. 9, C. B. 2595, and extending along E. Line of said Lot No. 9, to an intersection of the N. water edge of San Pedron Creek, thence along N. waters edge of San Pedro Creek to an intersection of W. line of said Lot No. 9, thence along W. line of said Lot 9 to a point 120.0 feet S. of N. WHEREAS said outstanding title to said undivided half interest in said tract or parcel of land is the only outstanding title to the land involved in said widening of said San Pedro Creek, and necessary thereto, and which has not been acquired by the City of San Antonio; therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That the Mayor of the City of San Antonio be and he is hereby authorized to acquire said title to said one-half undivided interest in said lot, tract, or parcel of land above described, for which he is authorized to pay to the owner thereof a sum not in excess of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars; and said Mayor is authorized to cause said sum of money to be paid to the owner of said undivided one-half interest in and to said lot, tract, or parcel of land, the said J. D. Vasbinder, of the County of Bexar, State of Texas, upon the delivery by the said J. D. Vasbinder of his general warranty deed conveying the fee simple title therein to the City of San Antonio, said deed to be in the form and to meet the requirements of the City Attorney of the City of San Antonio, which sum of money it to be delivered to the said J. D. Vasbinder upon the delivery by him of said deed to the Mayor of said City and upon the approval of said deed and said title by the City Attorney of the City of San Antonio.




