MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 16th, A. D. 1926, 10:00 A. M.

Pursuant to the order of adjournment of the meeting of November 15th, 1926, the Commissioners this day meet, with Hon. Phil Wright, Acting Mayor, presiding, and Commissioners Bushick, Lambert, Steffler, present. Absent Mayor Tobin, sick.

When there came on to be considered the returns of a Special Election held on the 15th day of November 1926, to determine whether or not bonds of the City of San Antonio shall be issued, payable serially during the period of forty years in yearly installments as stated in the Ordinance ordering said election said bonds bearing interest at the rate of four and one half per centum ( $4\frac{1}{2}\%$ ) per annum, and whether or not a tax shall be levied, assessed and collected annually, sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as the same becomes payable, and create a sinking fund as provided by law sufficient to pay <sup>said</sup> bonds at maturity; viz; as each of said bonds shall respectively mature, said proposed bonds being voted on under eleven separate propositions, all as stated in the Ordinance ordering said election; and the Board of Commissioners, having undertaken to canvass the returns of said election, and thereafter having made the following report, to wit;
