

MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

Held this November 5th, 1925, pursuant to the order
of adjournment on November 2nd, 1925.

PRESENT: Honorable Jno. W. Tobin, Mayor, and Commissioners, Bushick, Lambert, Steffler, and Wright.

When Commissioner Bushick introduced the following resolution which was read and adopted by the following vote on roll call to-wit; Ayes, Tobin, Bushick, Lambert, Steffler, Wright.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

That a proposed amendment to the Charter of said City, as contained in the following Notice, be approved and submitted to the qualified voters thereof, in accordance with said Notice:-

N O T I C E.

Notice is hereby given that on the 28th day of November, A. D. 1925, the following ordinance will be presented to the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio for adoption or rejection:-

AN ORDINANCE

(See p. 141) Ordering an election for the purpose of submitting a certain amendment to the Charter of the City of San Antonio.

WHEREAS, the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio having decided to submit to the qualified voters of said City a certain amendment to the Charter of the City of San Antonio, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

That an election be and the same is hereby ordered to be held on the 30th day of December, A. D. 1925, at which election the following proposition shall be submitted.

(1) Shall Section 18 of the Charter of the City of San Antonio be amended so that the same shall be, and hereafter read, as follows:

"SECTION 18: - Paragraph 1: The elective officers of said City shall receive from the City the following annual compensation, payable in monthly installments, and no more; The Mayor, Eight Thousand ^{Dollars} / (\$8,000.00); and each Commissioner, Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000.00); provided that the salary of the Mayor or any Commissioner shall not be paid during his absence from the City, unless such absence is on the business of the City, or unless such Mayor or Commissioner is excused by the Board of Commissioners.

Paragraph 2: The salaries and wages of all other officers, employees, agents and servants of the City shall be fixed by the Commissioners."

Said election on the adoption of the above proposed amendment shall be held in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas, and all qualified voters of the City of San Antonio shall be allowed to vote in said election. Said proposition shall be printed in full upon the ballots used in said election, and in preparing said ballots it shall be done in such a manner that the voters may vote "Yes" or "No" on such amendment, and after such amendment printed upon said ballots there shall be printed the words "For the amendment" and "Against the amendment". The manner of holding said election shall be governed by the laws of the State of Texas regulating general elections.

A copy of this ordinance, signed by the Mayor, shall serve as proper notice of said election, and the Mayor is directed to cause notice of such election to be published in some

newspaper in the City of San Antonio for thirty days prior to the date of said election, and the City Clerk is directed to mail a copy of the proposed amendment to every qualified voter in the City of San Antonio, as appears from the Tax Collector's rolls for the year ending January 31, 1925.

This ordinance shall not be passed until twenty days' notice has been given of the intention to submit said amendment, by publication for ten days in some newspaper published in said City; by "twenty days" is meant from the first date said notice is published.
