BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio:

Whereas bonds of said City are outstanding as follows;

Whereas said City now desires to exercise its option and redeem all of said bonds; Now Therefore

The City of San Antonio hereby calls in said bonds for redemption, and all

holders thereof are hereby notified to present the same for final payment of all principal and interest due thereon, on the dates "To Be Paid" above set forth, either at the Treasury of said City or at the National Bank of Commerce, of New York City, which is hereby designated as the New York Fiscal Agency of said City of San Antonio for the payment of said bonds as herein provided; and from and after the respective dates herein above fixed for the redemption of said bonds, said City shall not be chargeable with or pay any interest on said bonds, And the City Clerk is hereby directed to cause the publication of this ordinance without certificate three times each in two newspapers in New York City, one in Chicago and one in San Antonio, and all holders of such bonds are hereby required to take notice hereof.

AN ORDINANCE ACCEPTING PROPOSAL OF Young and Ramsey for constructing sanitary sewer, Highland Park, and authorizing contract and appropriating money therefor.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

Section 1. (Acceptance). That the City does hereby accept the attached written proposal of said party named in the caption hereof, dated \_\_\_\_\_ and offering to construct sanitary sewer in Hackberry Street, Drexel Avenue and Rigsby Street in and for said City in accordance with the written specifications and description and drawings prepared and submitted by City Engineer provided said party making said proposal shall strictly comply with all requirements made by or under the provisions of this ordinance and all instruments herein referred to, which are made a part hereof.

Section 2. (Bonds). That the Mayor is hereby authorized to require and approve on behalf of the City proper bond or bonds for the performance and completion of said undertakings.

Section 3 (Contract, etc.) That the Mayor is hereby authorized to cause and require the execution and delivery of a written contract to be drawn in accordance with said proposal, and the terms and conditions understood and required as applicable to said matter.

Section 4 (Appropriation) That to defray the costs and expenses to be paid by the City by reason of the premises, the sum of Six Thousand (\$6000.00) Dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the 1916 General Fund and said funds so appropriated shall be kept in a separate account to be designated as Special Fund, Sanitary sewers in Hackberry Street, Drexel Avenue. and Rigsby St. Highland Park

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

Section 1. (Acceptance) That the City does hereby accept the attached written proposal of said party named in the caption hereof, and offering to construct sewers in alleys between Porter Street and Delmar Avenue, Denver Blvd and Porter St, and Essex Street and Denver Blvd. in and for said City in accordance with the written specifications and description and drawings prepared and submitted by City Engineer provided said party making said proposal shall strictly comply with all requirements made by or under the provisions of this ordinance and all instruments herein referred to, which are made a part hereof.

Section 2. (Bonds) That the Mayor is hereby authorized to require and approve on behalf of the City proper bond or bonds for the performance and completion of said undertakings.

Section 3. Contract Etc.) That the Mayor is hereby authorized to cause and require the execution and delivery of a written contract to be drawn in accordance with said proposal, and the terms and conditions understood and required as applicable to said matter.

Section 4 (Appropriation) That to defray the costs and expenses to be paid by the City by reason of the premises, the sum of Nine Thousand (\$9000.00) Dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the 1916 General Fund shall be kept in a separate account to be designated as Special Fund sanitary sewers in South Heights.

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Commissioner Lambert introduced the following resolution, which was read and adopted:

**-192.1** RESOLUTION

NAMING THE NEW GOLF LINKS IN BRACKENRIDGE PARK THE  
"BRACKENRIDGE GOLF LINKS"

BE IT RESOLVED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, Whereas

it has been noticed that in the Public Press the Golf Links at Brackenridge Park are called the Municipal Links, and Whereas, it is proper that some definite name be given to these Golf Links,

Now Therefore Be It Resolved by the Board of Commissioners that the Golf Links in Brackenridge Park be and they are hereby named the Brackenridge Park Golf Links, and that all users of said links, the public press and the public generally be requested to call these Golf Links the Brackenridge Park Golf Links, or the Brackenridge Park Links; or whether they call it the links, the golf course or the Golf Links, that they always put the name Brackenridge Park at the beginning; and that a copy of this resolution be sent to all of the daily newspapers of this City; and that a copy of this resolution be sent to the Honorable George W. Brackenridge, who by his magnificent gift made possible the daily pleasures that thousands of our people are enjoying every day in this park.

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Commissioner Uhr recommended that petition of S.A. School Board for building permit at Main Avenue High School be granted. Adopted.

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Commissioner Uhr made the following recommendations:

That petition of S.A. Poster Adv. Co. for permit to erect bill boards on W. Pecan Street be granted. Adopted.

That petition of L.W. Gillette for change in Jitney route be granted. Adopted.

That petition of Stires Outdoor Adv. Co. for permit to erect bill board on the East Side of Romana Street be not granted. Adopted.

That petition of B. Black, for permit to erect garage in rear of 205 Garden Street be granted. Adopted.

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Commissioner Uhr submitted the names of 12 men to serve as extra men in the Police Department, and asked their confirmation. Commissioner Garland moved the appointment of five men present, when Commissioner Uhr declared that he insisted upon all of the names submitted being confirmed. His motion receiving no second, he withdrew his nominations.

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Commissioner Uhr introduced the following ordinance, which was read and adopted by the following vote on roll call, to-wit: Ayes, Brown, Garland, Lambert, Kearny and Uhr. Nays, none.

**MB-192.2** Amendment to Section 2 of the ordinance of May 4th, 1916, establishing a police force and regulating same, in and for this City.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

That there be added to Section 2 of the ordinance of May 4th, 1916, establishing a police force and regulating the same, in and for this City, the following:

"Fifteen (15) Extra Policemen or riflemen, to be used in filling temporarily any vacancy in the regular force, caused by dismissal, absence, sickness or any other causes; said extra policemen or reliefmen to receive pay only for the actual time so employed; and provided that before a man becomes a regular policeman, permanently on the pay roll, he must be nominated and confirmed, and that said extra men are not to serve regularly, but only until a permanent vacancy can be filled at this next Commissioners meeting.

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Commissioner Kearny introduced the following ordinance, which was read and adopted by the following vote on roll call, to-wit: Ayes, Brown, Garland, Lambert, Kearny and Uhr. Nays, none.

**MB-193**      AN ORDINANCE

Ordering the laying of sidewalks, etc, on various streets, under the penalties for failure to comply with said order.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

Whereas, The City Commissioners in the exercise of the Police Power, finds and hereby declares a public necessity for the laying of sidewalks, etc., as hereinafter ordered; and

WHEREAS by an ordinance heretofore on the 10th day of August A.D.1914, passed and approved this City Commissioners provided for such cases; said ordinance being entitled "An ordinance prescribing specifications for Sidewalks and Curbing for Public Streets and Places, and providing measures to compel the laying, construction and repair of the same by owners of abutting property; requiring the cost thereof to be paid by the owners of such property and declaring such cost a personal liability of such owners, and a first and prior lien and charge against such property; and prescribing the manner of ordering and compelling the construction of such work, and the punishment for failure to comply with such orders", and proceeding hereupon in accordance with said previous ordinance, which is made a part hereof;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED:

Section One: That the construction of cement sidewalks be and the same is hereby ordered along or in front of the entire extent of each parcel of the property and premises hereinafter described, and that the owners of such premises proceed immediately to construct said improvements, or to cause same to be constructed at their cost and expense, on the streets and public places hereinafter named; the respective premises herein referred to, the owner or owners thereof to whom this order is addressed and each such respective street or public place being as follows, to-wit:

That said improvement shall be constructed promptly in accordance with the specifications and other provisions contained in said ordinance of August 10th, 1914, and that said work shall be commenced within thirty days after the service of notice on this order, and that said notices shall be given and all other things shall be done as therein provided; and that for failure to comply with or violation of this order, any person, association of persons, or corporation found guilty of such offense shall be fined not less than Five (\$5.00) Dollars nor more than Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars, all under and as in said ordinance of August 10th 1914, provided.

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On motion, duly seconded and carried, the meeting adjourned.
