

MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 23rd, A.D. 1922, 4 P.M.

PRESENT: Honorable O.B. Black, Mayor, presiding, and Commissioners Pfeiffer, Lambert, Rieden, Wright.

Minutes of previous meeting were ordered approved.

----MEMORIALS AND PETITIONS----

The following petitions were read and referred to Commissioner of Taxation:
Ed. A. Mendel, et al. for correction of assessment and refund.
West End Pharmacy, for refund of Food License.

The following petitions were read and referred to Commissioner of Fire and Police:
Piggly-Wiggly stores for special building permit.
Prassel Sash and Door Co. for permit to construct shed.
D.M. Harvey, for permit to install gasoline tank.

Petition of K. Weimer, proposition to pave certain streets, and lay sewers on condition that the City will do certain things, was read and referred to Commissioner of Streets, etc.

Petition of J.W. Kotham & Son to erect and conduct slaughter house, was read second time and laid over.

Petition of Lakeview Improvement Club requesting City to vacate street south side Euclid Park was read third time and laid over.

Tabulation of bids for auditing City Books was read and ordered filed.

Petition to change the name of West End Lake to Woodlawn Lake and Woodlawn Addition was read and laid over.

Petition of citizens protesting the closing of a certain street near Brazos and Frio Streets, was read and ordered filed.

AN ORDINANCE

Appropriating the sum of Three Hundred and Fifty Six Dollars 56¢ (\$356.56) to pay Southwest Bitulithic Co. the City's part for paving in front Lots 3, 5 and 7

AN ORDINANCE

Appropriating \$36,464.34 to pay Merchants Bills for October.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the sum of \$36,464.34 or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and is hereby appropriated out of the 1922 General Fund to pay merchants bills as per itemized invoices on file in the office of the City Auditor.

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On motion of the Mayor, duly seconded and carried, the City Clerk was instructed to notify the architects of the Municipal Market House, Mess. Dielmann & Spillman, to begin at once on the remodeling of the old market house, according to plans and specifications, on that part of same which is to be used as a restaurant.

A proposal of the owners of the Faville property to sell land to the City necessary for the opening of Lakeview Avenue, was, on recommendation of the City Engineer, accepted.

Commissioner Wright introduced the following ordinance, which was read and adopted by the following vote on roll call, to-wit: Ayes, Black, Pfeiffer, Lambert, Rieden, Wright.

No. 387

AN ORDINANCE

Appropriating the sum of \$942.67 to pay the Southwest Bitulithic Company for repairs to paving required in connection with the installation of the lighting system on Travis Street from Avenue D to North Flores Street; and repealing an ordinance passed and approved by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio on the 10th day of July, A. D., 1922, entitled "An Ordinance appropriating \$942.67 to pay the San Antonio Public Service Company for replacing paving on Travis Street, from Avenue D to North Flores Street, as per agreement between San Antonio Public Service Company and the City of San Antonio, dated May 26th, 1921."

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BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

Section One: That the sum of \$942.67 be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the 1922 General Fund (Lights) to pay the Southwest Bitulithic Company for repairs to paving required in connection with the installation of the lighting system on Travis Street, from Avenue D to North Flores Street, in accordance with proposition made to Commissioner Phil Wright on May 26th, 1921, and accepted by the City on that date.

Section Two: It is further ordained by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio that the ordinance passed and approved by the Commissioners of said City on the 10th day of July, A. D., 1922, entitled "An Ordinance appropriating \$942.67 to pay the San Antonio Public Service Company for replacing paving on Travis Street, from Avenue D to North Flores Street, as per agreement between San Antonio Public Service Company and the City of San Antonio, dated May 26th, 1921" be and the same is hereby repealed.

Section Three: The City Auditor is hereby authorized and directed to prepare and issue a warrant in said sum of \$942.67, payable to said Southwest Bitulithic Company.

Mayor Black introduced the following ordinances, which were read and adopted by the following vote on roll call, to-wit: Ayes, Black, Pfeiffer, Lambert, Rieden, Wright.

AN ORDINANCE.

To relinquish all interest of the City and close a street commencing at Camden Street and running in a southeasterly direction across the property of the Lone Star Cotton Mills between Jones Avenue and the San Antonio River in San Antonio, Texas.

WHEREAS, the property belonging to the Lone Star Cotton Mills, situated on Jones Avenue and Camden Street and running back to the San Antonio River, in the City of San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas, was originally included in the McLane Addition, as per plat thereof recorded in Book 1, in the City Engineer's Office of San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas, in 1890, also in Book D No. 7, Section No. 5, said City Engineer's office; and

WHEREAS, said plat indicates a street running from Camden Street in a southeasterly direction through a portion of said property belonging to the Lone Star Cotton Mills; and

WHEREAS, said street was not actually opened or accepted by the City, and many of the improvements of said company are situated thereon, and it is desired to remove any cloud upon the company's title by virtue of the indication of said street upon said plat;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Commissioners of the City of San Antonio that the City of San Antonio hereby relinquishes any and all claim to that portion of said street indicated on said plat Southeast of Camden Street on said property owned by the Lone Star Cotton Mills, and the same is hereby closed and discontinued.

AN ORDINANCE.

Making it unlawful for any person to smoke Marihuana or to have same in his possession within the City of San Antonio; providing a penalty for the violation hereof, containing an emergency clause, etc.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio:

Section One: It shall hereafter be unlawful for any person to smoke Marihuana within the corporate limits of the City of San Antonio.

Section Two: It shall hereafter be unlawful for any person to have Marihuana in his possession within the corporate limits of the City of San Antonio.

Section Three: Section One hereof shall not apply to persons who may smoke and use Marihuana by virtue of an original written order or prescription from a duly authorized practitioner of medicine, dentistry, veterinary medicine, which order or prescription shall be dated and shall contain the name of the person to whom same is given; or if ordered by a practitioner of veterinary medicine, shall state the kind of animal for which said Marihuana is ordered.

Section Four: Section Two hereof shall not apply to any lawfully licensed practitioner of medicine, dentistry or veterinary medicine, or to druggists, or to persons having Marihuana in their possession by virtue of an original written order or prescription of a lawfully authorized practitioner of medicine, dentistry or veterinary medicine.

Section Five: Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon a conviction thereof, shall be fined in any sum of not less than Ten (\$10.00) Dollars nor more than Two Hundred (\$200) Dollars.

Section Six: All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section Seven: This ordinance is hereby declared to be of urgent importance, for reasons of public welfare apparent herefrom, and upon its passage and approval, shall take effect immediately.

AN ORDINANCE.

Authorizing the Mayor to enter into a contract with Dr. T.T. Parker for lease of gravel pit, and appropriating Seven Hundred (\$700) Dollars to pay the contract price for lease thereof, and repealing an ordinance passed and approved on November 2nd, 1922, entitled "An ordinance appropriating \$700 to pay Dr. T.T. Parker for gravel pit."

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio:

Section One: That the sum of Seven Hundred (\$700) Dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the 1922 General Fund, and chargeable to Street Commissioner's Department, to pay Dr. T. T. Parker for lease of gravel pit described in contract hereto attached and made a part hereof.

Section Two: That the Mayor of the City of San Antonio be and he is hereby authorized, empowered and directed to execute contract for lease of gravel pit in accordance with the form hereto attached and made a part hereof.

Section Three: An ordinance passed and approved on the second day of November, A. D., 1922, entitled "An ordinance appropriating Seven Hundred (\$700) Dollars to pay Dr. T.T. Parker for gravel pit" is hereby in all things repealed and the City Auditor is hereby authorized and directed to cancel voucher or warrant issued in accordance with said ordinance.

Mayor Black introduced the following ordinance, which was read and adopted by the following vote on roll call, to-wit: Ayes, Black, Lambert, Rieden, Wright; Nay, Pfeiffer. No. 383.

AN ORDINANCE

Appropriating the sum of \$4000.00 out of the Market House Fund to apply upon the contract of San Antonio with Leo M.J. Dielman and Beverly W. Spillman, on

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account of services for drawing plans and specifications of the Municipal Market House.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio:

Section One: That the sum of Four Thousand (\$4000) Dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the Market House Fund to apply upon the contract of the City of San Antonio with Leo M. J. Dielman and Beverly W. Spillman on account of services for drawing plans and specifications of the Municipal Market House.

Section Two: The City Auditor is hereby authorized and directed to prepare and issue warrant payable to said Leo M.J.Dielman and Beverly W.Spillman, in said sum of Four Thousand (\$4000) Dollars.

The hearing of property owners interested in the improvement of Pine Street, Nolan Street to Burnett Street, was again called up.
