

REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL  
OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO HELD IN  
THE COUNCIL CHAMBER, CITY HALL, ON  
THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 5, 1963, 8:30 A.M.

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The regular meeting of the City Council was called to order by the Presiding Officer, Mayor W. W. McAllister, with the following members present: McALLISTER, DE LA GARZA, ROHLFS, KAUFMAN, COCKRELL, GATTI, PADILLA, PARKER and BREMER; ABSENT: None.

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The invocation was given by Councilman Claus H. Rohlfs.

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Minutes of the previous meeting were approved.

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Mr. Leroy Smith, representing the Highland Hills Lions Club, on behalf of the citizens of the Southeast section of the City, presented Councilman Claus H. Rohlfs, who is leaving the City, a Certificate of Appreciation for outstanding civic service to the community.

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First item of business was hearing on Zoning Case No. 1965, to rezone Lot 22, NCB 10949, located on the south side of Dauchy Road, 110' east of Cynthia Linn Drive, from "B" Residence District to "F" Local Retail District.

Planning Director Steve Taylor briefed the proposed change which was recommended by the Zoning Commission. No one spoke in opposition to the change.

On motion of Mr. de la Garza, seconded by Mr. Gatti, the recommendation of the Zoning Commission to grant the change in zone was approved by passage of the following ordinance by the following vote: AYES: McAllister, de la Garza, Rohlfs, Kaufman, Cockrell, Gatti, Padilla Parker and Bremer; NAYS: None; ABSENT: None.

Planning Director Taylor explained that this case had been previously heard by the Council and had been referred back to the Zoning Commission for further study, and it now recommends that the property be rezoned to "E" Office Zone. No one spoke in opposition to the change. On motion of Mr. Rohlfs, seconded by Dr. Parker, the recommendation of the Zoning Commission was approved

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by passage of the following ordinance by the following vote: AYES: McAllister, de la Garza, Rohlf, Kaufman, Cockrell, Padilla, Parker and Bremer; ABSENT: None; NAYS: Gatti.

Next heard was Case No. 1889 to rezone the north 75' of the west 140' of Lot 48, NCB 11371, located on the east side of S. W. 35th St., approximately 750' north of Growdon Drive, from "B" Residence District to "E" Office District; and Lot 48, NCB 11371, except the north 75' of the west 140' thereof, located on the east side of S. W. 35th, 600' north of Growdon Drive from "B" Residence District to "LL" Manufacturing District.

Planning Director Taylor explained the proposed change. He said that this case had been previously heard by the Council and referred back to the Zoning Commission and after study and in agreement with the applicant, the Commission recommended the proposed changes. He stated two notices had been received in opposition, the one from Kelly Air Force Base being qualified. Kelly Air Force Base asked that the Council consider "JJ" Commercial or "KK" Commercial rather than "LL" Manufacturing. He explained that "JJ" or "KK" will permit storage but that it will not allow a salvage operation, which is the desired use of the property. Mr. F. M. Gonzales, applicant, stated that there will not be any burning or smelting operations.

Mr. Albert H. Schmidt, representing Kelly Air Force Base, opposed the change to "LL" as he felt that smelting operations could cause a hazard to the runway.

Mayor McAllister recognized the concern of Kelly Air Force Base in this matter. He said there is already a large area zoned "LL" Manufacturing, and the Council can pass a smoke ordinance if smoke becomes a nuisance in the area of Kelly Air Force Base.

On motion of Mr. Padilla, seconded by Mr. Rohlf, the recommendation of the Zoning Commission was approved by passage of the following ordinance by the following vote: AYES: McAllister, de la Garza, Rohlf, Kaufman, Cockrell, Gatti, Padilla, Parker and Bremer; NAYS: None; ABSENT: None.

Next heard was Zoning Case No. 1959 to rezone Lot 1, NCB 11898, located on the south side of East Terra Alta Road, 151,81 west of North New Braunfels, from "A" Residence District to "B" Residence District; and Lot 2, NCB 11898, irregular in shape, subject property is

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located southwest of the intersection of E. Terra Alta Road, N. New Braunfels and Nacogdoches Road, from "A" Residence District to "E" Office District.

Planning Director Taylor explained that this case was previously heard by the Council and referred back to the Zoning Commission. The Commission is now recommending "B" Zone for Lot 1 and "F" for Lot 2.

Mr. Jim Upmore, representing the applicant, H. B. Zachry Properties, Inc., explained that on Lot 1, which fronts on Terra Alta, duplexes would be constructed. On Lot 2, which fronts on Nacogdoches, shops and office buildings would be built and on the corner of Terra Alta and Nacogdoches Road a filling station would be constructed. He showed plans of the property and explained what would be done to eliminate possible traffic hazards. On Terra Alta there would be screening next to the filling station so that it would not be objectionable to the residents across the street.

Objecting emphatically to the change because the business center proposed would increase the traffic hazards on Nacogdoches and Terra Alta were Mr. C. G. Shawd, 1718 Nacogdoches Road, Mr. A. T. Thompson, Jr., 365 East Terra Alta; Mrs. J. J. Maniatis, 233 East Terra Alta and Mrs. Chesley I. Swann, 335 East Terra Alta.

After discussion of the case, the Council asked Mr. Upmore if he would consider "E" Zone on Tract 2. After consultation with Mr. O. D. Hite, Attorney for H. B. Zachry Properties, Inc., Mr. Upmore asked that Lot 2 be rezoned to "E" Office instead of "F" Local Retail Zone.

On motion of Mr. Gatti, seconded by Mr. de la Garza, Lot 1, NCB 11898 was zoned "B" Residence District and Lot 2, zoned "E" Office District. The motion carrying with it the passage of the following ordinance prevailed by the following vote: AYES: McAllister, de la Garza, Rohlf, Kaufman, Gatti, Padilla and Parker; NAYS: Cockrell and Bremer; ABSENT: None.

Next heard was Case No. 1949 to rezone Lot 10, NCB 12163, located on the north side of Austin Highway, 665.0' southwest of Lanark Drive, from "F" Local Retail District to "J" Commercial District.

The Planning Director explained the proposed change which the Zoning Commission recommended be denied by the City Council.

Mr. Donald E. Sietsma, applicant, explained that he proposed to use the property for a modern auto repair shop. He said he had posted an \$1,800.00 deposit with the Water Board to extend the water main to the property and since denial of the zoning change by the Commission he had not been able to get a refund. He said there were many "J" Commercial non-conforming businesses in the area and there was no objections to the requested change.

The Planning Director stated that there were two legal non-conforming "J" uses and two or three possibly illegal uses.

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No one spoke in opposition to the change. After consideration of the matter, a motion by Mr. de la Garza, seconded by Mr. Bremer to uphold the recommendation of the Zoning Commission and deny the rezoning, failed by the following vote: AYES: de la Garza, and Bremer; NAYS: McAllister, Rohlf, Kaufman, Cockrell, Gatti, Padilla and Parker; ABSENT: None.

Mr. Rohlf then moved that the Zoning Commission be overruled and the property be rezoned "J" Commercial District. Seconded by Mr. Gatti, the motion carrying with it the passage of the following ordinance prevailed by the following vote: AYES: McAllister, Rohlf, Kaufman, Cockrell, Gatti, Padilla, Parker and Bremer; NAYS: de la Garza; ABSENT: None.

Last zoning case heard was Case No. 1873, to rezone Lots 15, 14, 16 and 17, NCB 8034 located northeast of the intersection of Whitman Avenue and Zarzamora Street, from "B" Residence District to "F" Local Retail District.

The Planning Director explained that this case had been heard by the Council previously and referred back to the Zoning Commission, as the Commission has denied the request by a two to two vote. The Commission reheard the case and it was denied by unanimous vote.

Mr. Louis Matusoff, the applicant, stated he desired to construct a building on the property and operate a laundromat. He said the people in the area wanted it and there was no opposition to his request. He presented the Council with a written statement explaining why he felt the property should be rezoned.

After discussion, Mr. de la Garza, moved that the recommendation of the Zoning Commission be overruled and property rezoned to "F" Local Retail District. The motion was seconded by Dr. Parker. The motion, which required seven affirmative votes in order to overrule the Zoning Commission, failed and the rezoning was denied. The vote on the motion is as follows: AYES: de la Garza, Rohlf, Kaufman, Cockrell, Parker and Padilla; NAYS: McAllister, Gatti and Bremer; ABSENT: None.

Mrs. Preston Dial, who on a recent trip to Spain, presented the Mayor of Madrid with an appointment as Alcalde of LaVillita, conveyed greetings from the Spanish Mayor and presented Mayor McAllister with a gift. She stated that the Mayor of Madrid had indicated he would visit San Antonio during Fiesta Week if he was invited by the governing body.

Mayor McAllister accepted the gift and stated San Antonio would be delighted to extend an invitation to the Mayor of Madrid to visit San Antonio.

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After a short recess, the meeting reconvened with all members present.

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Mayor McAllister asked the pleasure of the Council concerning the application of the Housing Authority for additional low rent public housing units.

Councilman Claus Rohlfis introduced the following ordinance:

AN ORDINANCE 31,734

AUTHORIZING PUBLICATION OF THE INTENT TO ENTER INTO A COOPERATION AGREEMENT WITH THE HOUSING AUTHORITY OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS.

Mr. Rohlfis then moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Mr. Gatti.

City Attorney Crawford Reeder explained that the ordinance authorizes the City Clerk to give sixty (60) days notice by publishing the Notice in the official publication of the City. He said the Council is not committed or bound to enter into an agreement at the end of the sixty (60) days. During the sixty days, a petition can be filed by the opponents or proponents, and if sufficient, an election must be held on the question. If the proponents of public housing win the election, then the Council must enter into an agreement. If the opponents win, then the City cannot enter into an agreement. He emphasized that the ordinance merely gives notice of the intent to negotiate an agreement with the Housing Authority, and that the Council will consider the question of whether or not it will enter into an agreement at the end of sixty days. He said no specific number of units are called for in the ordinance.

He explained that if the ordinance is passed as an emergency measure it would become effective immediately. If passed without the emergency measure it would not be effective for ten (10) days.

The Council agreed the ordinance should not have the emergency clause.

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The question was called and on roll call the ordinance was passed and approved by the following vote: AYES: Rohlfs, Kaufman, Cockrell, Gatti, and Padilla; NAYS: McAllister, Parker and Bremer; ABSTAINING: de la Garza.

Since the ordinance was not passed as an emergency measure, the Notice of Intent will be published the first time on September 16, 1963.

Councilman Rohlfs read the following letter of resignation:

Mr. Stephan Harvasty, representing a group of citizens against fluoridated water, criticized the use of City facilities by the Water Board to make a feasibility report on the use of fluoridation. He asked that if the Council was going to consider the report that it request a survey of the corrosive effects to fluoride on water mains, etc.

Mayor McAllister informed Mr. Harvasty that the comments made would be noted and referred to the City Water Board.

Councilman Rohlfs informed him that the report on fluoridation made by the Water Board was done so at the request of the City Council.
