

MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 13TH, A.D. 1917, 4 P.M.

Present: Honorable Sam C. Bell, Mayor, presiding, and Commissioners Heuermann and Lowther. Absent, Garland, Lambert.

Minutes of previous meeting were ordered approved.

----MEMORIALS AND PETITIONS----

The following petitions were read and referred to Commissioner of Taxation.

Prospect Hill Christian Church, for exemption from Taxation.

Charlotte and Alice Ryan, for refund of Taxes.

Pfefferling, Hanson and Co. for refund of taxes.

Petition of Stires Advertising Co. for permit to erect bill board at 641 E.Commerce Street, was read and referred to Building Inspector.

Petition for sanitary sewers in McKinney Avenue, was read and referred to Commissioner of Streets and Public Improvements.

MB-842 AN ORDINANCE

Granting permit to U.S. Government (Quartermaster Fort Sam Houston) to construct Sanitary Sewer in Appler Street.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that,

Section 1. Permission is hereby granted United States Government (Quartermaster Fort Sam Houston) to construct a twelve (12") inch sanitary sewer beginning at a man-hole six hundred and twenty five (625') feet of main City sewer in River Avenue, and extending into the Government reservation (Fort Sam Houston) according to plat, line and grade made by the City Engineer hereto attached; the cost of said sewer being estimated about Three Hundred fifty dollars (\$350.00) to be paid by the said United States Government Quartermaster. The final actual cost to be filed with the City Engineer within ten (10) days after the completion of the sewer.

Section 2. Said sewer, when completed, to be the property of the United States Government and part of Houston Sewer System.

Permits to connect to same to be issued only on the written order of the Post Quartermaster Fort Sam Houston.

This ordinance is hereby declared to be of urgent importance for reasons of public welfare apparent therefrom, and the same shall take effect at once.

- 843 AN ORDINANCE

Appropriating \$950.00 out of the 1917 General Fund to pay Guarantee Motor Car Co. for one Maxwell truck chassis for use in Fire Department.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the sum of Nine Hundred and Fifty and no/100 Dollars (\$950.00) or so much thereof as may be necessary be and is hereby appropriated out of the 1917 General Fund to pay Guarantee Motor Car Co. for one Maxwell Truck chassis equipped per specifications attached to

invoice now on file with City Auditor.

Appropriating \$3.40 to pay court costs out of judgement fund.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, there be and there is appropriated out of the judgement fund the sum of Three and 40/100 Dollars to pay cost bill favor Osceola Archer, District Court in cause B 14880 City of San Antonio vs. Mrs. Theresa Merz.

No. 135 **-845** AN ORDINANCE

Transferring \$52.28 from Commerce Street Widening Fund to Improvement District No. 4 Sinking Fund.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the City Auditor be and is hereby directed to make the necessary entries transferring a balance of \$52.28 from the Commerce Street Widening Fund into Improvement District No. 4 Sinking Fund.

No. 136. **-846** AN ORDINANCE

WHEREAS, Adele Callaghan, widow of Bryan Callaghan, is the owner of certain property fronting forty four feet on the west side of Soledad Street, and bounded on the south by a lot belonging to Rheinholdt Probandt on the north by a lot belonging to Emily A. Emerson, which said property is located in City Block 154, in the City of San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas and

WHEREAS, for the purpose of widening said Soledad Street it is necessary for the City of San Antonio to acquire a strip of land off the east end of said lot, having a width of 6.3 feet on the south and five feet on the north end, and said Adele Callaghan has agreed to convey said strip of land to the City of San Antonio for the sum of Three Hundred and two (\$302.00) Dollars, and the City has agreed to accept said deed for said consideration; THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

That there be and there is hereby appropriated out of the general fund for the fiscal year 1917 the sum of Three Hundred and Two (\$302.00) Dollars, warrant for which shall be made payable to the said Adele Callaghan or order, for the purposes above stated.

Commissioner Heuermann introduced the following resolution which was read and adopted:

The signatures to said bonds herein ordered cancelled, having been verified as the genuine signatures of Clinton G. Brown, Mayor, Fred Fries, City Clerk, and J. Frank Gallagher, City Treasurer.
