

SPECIAL MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

WEDNESDAY AUGUST 23, 1923, A. D. 4. P. M.

PRESENT: Honorable John W. Tobin, Mayor presiding, and Commissioners, Bushick, Steffler, Wright.

The Mayor announced the purpose of the Special Meeting to be the canvassing the returns of the Special election held on August 21, 1923, and to declare the result thereof,


Whereupon came to be considered the returns of a Special election held on the 21st day of August 1923, at which election there was submitted to the qualified Voters of the City of San Antonio, for their adoption or rejection certain Amendments to the Charter of said City, said amendments of said Charter being more fully set forth in an ordinance ordering said election, passed and approved by the Commissioners of said City at a regular meeting held on the 19th day of July 1923, and in the notice of said election posted in the election precincts of said City as well as in the election proclamation published in the San Antonio Express on July 20, 1923,

And the Commissioners having resolved themselves into a committee of the whole, with the Mayor as Chairman, to canvass the returns of said election, and to make reports therein, and said committee having canvassed said returns, as tabulated on pages 90 and 91, of the book containing election returns,

And it appearing to the Commissioners that said amendments of the charter were submitted and said Special Election held and conducted, and returns thereof made, All as required by the ordinance/said election, and the law for such cases made and provided, and that at said special election there were cast on each of said amendments of the City/Charter respectively the aggregate number of votes "For" and the aggregated number of votes "Against" said amendments, all as shown by the report of the canvassing committee, and the Commissioners having first compared and canvassed said returns, and having found same to be in all respects correct, it was ordered and declared by unanimous vote of the Commissioners, that said Amendments to the Charter of said City were all and each of them sustained by a majority of the qualified voters, voting at said election.

On motion, duly seconded and carried, the meeting adjourned.
