AN ORDINANCE

ORDERING A SPECIAL ELECTION IN THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO TO SUBMIT TO THE QUALIFIED VOTERS WHO OWN TAXABLE PROPERTY IN SAID CITY AND WHO HAVE DULY RENDERED THE SAME FOR TAXATION, FIVE SEPARATE PROPOSITIONS TO BORROW MONEY ON THE CREDIT OF THE CITY AND TO ISSUE BONDS OF THE CITY FOR PERMANENT PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS IN AND FOR SAID CITY, AS FOLLOWS: (A) \$300,000.00 TO CONSTRUCT A COLISEUM IN ROOSEVELT PARK; (B) \$130,000.00 TO CONSTRUCT A STADIUM IN SAN JACINTO PARK; (C) \$50,000.00 TO CONSTRUCT MONUMENTS IN PUBLIC PLACES; (D) \$10,000.00 TO CONSTRUCT ADDITION TO WITTE MUSEUM; (E) \$10,000.00 TO CONSTRUCT PERMANENT IMPROVEMENTS IN THE SUNKEN GARDEN.

AN ORDINANCE *MM-1002*

AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE LEASE WITH THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE ON EXPERIMENTAL FARM.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That the Mayor is authorized to enter into a lease agreement with the United States Department of Agriculture on the experimental farm on the old sewer tract from the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five, to and including the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-six, to be used as an experimental farm by the United States Government.
