## AN ORDINANCE 12,637

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AN ORDINANCE PASSED AND APPROVED 3 NOVEMBER, 1938, ESTABLISHING ZONING REGULATIONS AND DISTRICTS IN ACCORDANCE WITH A COMPREHENSIVE PLAN: REGULATING AND RESTRICTING THE HEIGHT, NUMBER OF STORIES AND SIZE OF BUILDINGS AND STRUCTURES: PER CENT OF LOT THAT MAY BE OCCUPIED: THE SIZE OF YARDS, COURTS AND OPEN SPACES: DENSITY OF POPULATION: LOCATION AND USE OF BUILDINGS, STRUCTURES AND LAND FOR TRADE, INDUSTRY, RESIDENCE AND OTHER PURPOSES: DIVIDING THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO INTO DISTRICTS, REGULATING AND RESTRICTING THE ERECTION, CONSTRUCTION, RECONSTRUCTION, ALTERATION, REPAIR OR USE OF BUILDINGS, STRUCTURES OR LAND WITHIN SUCH DISTRICT: PROVIDING THE UNIFORM REGULATIONS FOR CLASSES OR KINDS OF BUILDINGS OR STRUCTURES AND USES WITHIN THE RESTRICTED DISTRICT: ADOPTING ZONING MAP DISCLOSING VARIOUS DISTRICTS, USE, AREAS, RESTRICTIONS, LIMITATIONS AND PROVISIONS APPLICABLE TO DISTRICTS AND AREAS; PROVIDING FOR A BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT AND DEFINING THE POWERS THEREOF; TO RE-ZONE: PROPOSITION "D" (POSTPONED ON SEVERAL OCCASIONS FROM JULY 6, 1950) PROPERTY ON SAN ANTONIO LULLWOOD AND ROSEWOOD STREETS. ANY PERSON WHO VIOLATES THIS ORDINANCE OR THE OWNER OF ANY BUILDING OR PREMISES OR PART THEREOF WHERE ANY THING IN VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE PLACED OR SHALL EXIST, AND ANY ARCHITECT, BUILDER, CONTRACTOR, AGENT, PERSON OR CORPORATION EMPLOYED IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, WHO MAY HAVE ASSISTED IN THE COMMISSION OF ANY SUCH VIOLATION SHALL BE GUILTY OF A SEPARATE OFFENSE AND UPON CONVICTION MAY BE FINED NOT MORE THAN \$100.00 AND EACH DAY SUCH VIOLATION EXISTS SHALL CONSTITUTE A SEPARATE OFFENSE. ## A RESOLUTION

DIRECTING THE CITY PURCHASING AGENT TO ADVERTISE FOR SEALED BIDS IN TRIPLICATE TO FURNISH THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO STREET DEPARTMENT WITH VARIOUS BRIDGE LUMBER AND REINFORCING STEEL. BIDS TO BE OPENED THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 14, 1950.

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Commissioner Hein discussed payroll increases on current period. States men are leaving his employment and will not work for their present wages.

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Commissioner Hein discussed the Stinson Field Buildings and the purchasing of the same from the United States Government at a price of \$8000.00 for use as schools. The Government is going to advertise the buildings for sale on September 4, 1950.

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Recommendations of the Zoning Commission to re-zone San Pedro and Mulberry Avenue, was given to the City Attorney for drafting and advertising.
