AN ORDINANCE -717

Appropriating \$762.13 to pay J.K. Burr taxes collected in error.

Burr for taxes collected on a certain tract of land in the northern part of the City, said land having been transferred to the U.S. Government by him on June 2, 1919.

AN ORDINANCE *MD-718*

Making appropriation to pay the judgement and court costs in the Steingruber suit.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION ONE: That the sum of \$1659.25 be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the Back Tax Fund to pay the amount of judgement, \$1244.28 and interest thereon from January 20, 1915, at 6% per annum, \$414.97, in the case of Henry Steingruber vs the City of San Antonio, No. B-6835, in the 45th District Court of Bexar County, Texas, which said judgement became final on the filing of the mandate from the Supreme Court in the office of the Clerk of the District Court of Bexar County, Texas, on July 22, 1920, warrant for which shall be drawn payable to the order of Henry Steingruber.

SECTION TWO: That the sum of \$177.85 be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the Back Tax Fund to pay the Court Costs in the suit mentioned in Section One hereof, warrant for which shall be drawn payable to the order of Osceola Archer.
