

MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

MONDAY, FEBRUARY 19TH, A.D. 1917. 4 P.M.

PRESENT: Honorable Clinton G. Brown, Mayor, presiding, and Commissioners Garland, Lambert, Kearny and Uhr.

Minutes of previous meeting were ordered approved.

-----MEMORIALS AND PETITIONS:-----

Petition of San Antonio Traction Company requesting permit to extend its tracks on Elmendorf Street to Fredericksburg Road, was read and held for one week pending the filing of possible objections.

Petition for 8" water mains on Dakota Street was read and referred to Commissioner of Sanitation, Parks and Public Property.

Petition of Mrs. O.F. Frenzel for permit to open meat market, was read and referred to Board of Health.

Petition of Tillie Appleby for correction of assessment, was read and referred to Commissioner of Taxation.

The following petitions were read and referred to Commissioner of Fire and Police: Stires Out Door Adv. Co., for permit to erect electric sign at 222 E. Travis Street. Wm. Roberts, for permit to install a gasoline tank, 324 Roosevelt Ave.

On motion of Commissioner Kearny, duly seconded and carried, a public hearing was given to property owners and others interested in street improvements ordered to be constructed on Army Boulevard from River Avenue to Army Post.

Commissioner Kearny, reporting on petition of Grace Lutheran ^{Sanatorium} ~~CHURCH~~ for Sanitary Sewer, recommended that on account of lack of funds petition be rejected at the present time, but that it be put on the "urgent" list and the work done as soon as finances warrant it. Adopted.

Commissioner Garland introduced the following ordinance, which was read and adopted by the following vote on roll call, to-wit: Ayes, Brown, Garland, Lambert, Kearny and Uhr.

MB-440 AN ORDINANCE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

That the sum of Thirty Eight Thousand Two Hundred and Fifty Six and 62/100 (\$38,256.62) Dollars be, and the same is hereby appropriated from Bond Interest Fund for transfer into the General Interest Fund of the City, and that the City Auditor and City Treasurer be and are hereby directed to make the proper entries therefor upon the books of the City.

Commissioner Garland introduced the following ordinance, which was read and adopted by the following vote on roll call, towit: Ayes, Brown, Garland, Lambert, Kearny and Uhr.

- 441 AN ORDINANCE

Authorizing the payment of wages to City Laborers for the week ending February 15,

1917, and making an appropriation therefor.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

That the Mayor be and he is hereby authorized to issue warrants for the payment of wages to City Day Laborers for thwe week ending February 15th, 1917, and that the following sums be and a e hereby appropriated out of the several special funds for that purpose, to-wit:

General Fund of 1916 \$2377.30

An ordinance granting permit to L.A.Smith to operate an automobile in Local Street Transportation was introduced and on motion of Commissioner Garland, duly seconded and carried, rejected by the following vote on roll call, to-wit: Ayes, Brown, Garland, Lambert, Kearny and Uhr.

Commissioner Garland introduced an ordinance authorizing the Mayor to execute a quit claim deed to John B. Holt, which was read and held pending the decision of the City Attorney.

Commissioner Lambert recommended that petition of J.de la Garza for permit to openmeat market at 309 Montezuma St., be granted. Adopted.

Commissioner Lambert recommended that petition of V.L.James, for permit to tap City water main at intersection of Zarzamora and Buena Vista Street be granted, subject to revocation at any time. Adopted.

Petition of Coleman and Jenkins requesting renewal of permit to store sand and gravel at 3rd St. heretofore revoked by the Mayor was granted, on recommendation of Commissioner Uhr.

Commissioner Kearny was requested by the Mayor to have an ordinance prepared regulating the dumping of building material on paved streets.

Commissioner Uhr introduced the following resolution, which was read and adopted:

RESOLUTION

Ordering S.A. & A. P. Ry. Co. to install arc light at East Cincinnati Ave. and S.A & A.P.Ry. Track.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the San Antonio and Aransas Pass Railway Company be, and they are hereby ordered to have an arc light installed where the San Antonio & Aransas Pass Railway track crosses East Cincinnati Ave. and further that the City Clerk be and he is hereby instructed to notify said Railway Company of this action of the Board of Commissioners, said lamp when erected to be maintained at the cost and expense of said railway Company.

Commissioner Uhr introduced the following resolution, which was read and adopted and ordered sent to the City Attorney:

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO

That the City Attorney be and is hereby instructed to at once file a motion to dissolve the temporary injunction in the case of C.L.McGinnis, et al., vs

the City of San Antonio, et al., being case No. B.-13747, in the 73rd Judicial District, Bexar County, Texas.

Commissioner Uhr introduced the following ordinance, which was read and adopted by the following vote on roll call, to-wit: Ayes, Brown, Garland, Lambert, Kearny and Uhr.

MB - 442 AN ORDINANCE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

That the sum of Twenty Two and 60/100 Dollars (\$22.60) be and is hereby appropriated out of the Fire and Police Building Fund for the fiscal year of 1916, to be paid to J.G.Weisell for 7 days services as custodian of said building, serving while the custodian was under suspension.

The Mayor requested the Commissioners to meet in the Council Chamber on Wednesday Feb. 21, 1917, for an informal discussion of the proposed Charter Amendments.


On motion, duly seconded and carried, the meeting adjourned.
