8-22-66 Petition of Westside Area Action Council, requesting the City to consider the possibility of constructing an overpass pedestrian bridge over General McMullen Drive between Castroville Road and West Commerce.

The City Manager made the following report on petitions.

66-949 (1) Petition of Mrs. Ahr and others requesting the City to consider a solution to the traffic problem at the intersection of Sahara Drive and San Pedro and at the intersection of Rhapsody Drive and San Pedro.

Our investigation reveals that this has been a problem for quite some time. In the summer of 1965 two flashing beacons were installed but the problem continues to exist. The accident analysis shows that almost all of the accidents involve a north-bound vehicle attempting to make a left turn into the Harmony Hills area. In order to eliminate this hazard, a design for widening and sheltering left turn lanes was submitted to the State Highway Department.

This design was slightly modified by them. Under the approved plan, the Highway Department will extend a culvert, widen the roadway to provide two lanes in each direction plus left turn lanes and will mark the lane lines. The City will paint the median and will provide all the traffic signs required. The Highway Department work must be done first and they expect to begin in September. It is estimated that their part of the work will require about sixty days to complete. When they finish, we can complete our part within ten days.

Both the Highway Department and City Traffic Engineers agree that traffic signals alone will not solve the problem. It is unknown if signals will be required after the left turn lanes are provided but another study will be conducted at that time.

Our speed graph for this section of San Pedro based on a study of 800 vehicles on August 11, 1966, shows that 50% of the vehicles traveled over 44 m.p.h. and the 85 percentile speed was 49 m.p.h. This is the standard use for setting speed limits. We, therefore, believe the present speed limit is proper and do not recommend a reduction.

The City Council concurred in the action taken.

66-969 (2) Petition of the Santa Maria Community Council requesting the City to widen all canals and creeks, and build safe concrete bridges in the Santa Maria Community which is bordered by Culebra South to Commerce East to 26th and West to 36th Street to avoid flooding in this area.

Our investigation reveals that the drainage in this area is in the Master Storm Drainage Plan which includes three major projects and are estimated to cost \$2,920,000. None of these projects have been included in a funded capital improvement program so, therefore, financing would necessarily require inclusion in a future bond issue. All three of the projects are branches of the main Apache Creek and improvements to this outfall is the responsibility of the San Antonio River Authority. The Public Works Department has been instructed to schedule asphalt patching of all streets within the area, and to perform other routine maintenance as may be required. They have also been instructed to schedule maintenance work in the enforcing of major wood structures where necessary. The City will also clean the drainage channel.

* * *

The City Council concurred.

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66-677 Mrs. John Dutmer, 739 McKinley Avenue, representing a delegation of citizens in the 700 and 800 blocks of McKinley Avenue, protested the operation of concrete batching plants on the McCreless property bounded by South Hackberry, McKinley Avenue, Mahncke Court and IH 37 which is under construction.

She stated that they were not against progress, but the operation, as being conducted, was creating health hazards because of the dust and noise nuisances and was damaging their property and well being. She added that on occasion, the plants operated on a twenty-four hour basis, and asked the Council to look into the matter and give them relief.

Mrs. Harry Guynes, 819 McKinley, also spoke against the operation.

After discussion, City Manager Shelley was instructed to look into the matter and see under what conditions the Council had granted permission for use of the property as a batching plant, with a view toward giving the residents some sort of relief.

* * *

66-1039 Mr. Platon Lerma, Executive Director for Action for Community Development, which conducts a self help housing program for migrant labor in Bexar County, spoke to the Council concerning salvage lumber and materials at Stinson Homes. He stated the City has a contract with the State Office of Economic Opportunity for the demolition and salvage of materials from Stinson Homes. He said they had made application to the State coordinator for some of this salvage and the request had been turned down.

Mr. Lerma asked that since his organization is the only one conducting a self help housing program at this time, that they be allowed to have some of the lumber from Stinson Homes. He added that the materials will be used to build migrant housing in Bexar County in accordance with minimum F H A specifications.

Assistant City Manager Gerald Henckel, explained that the contract with the State Office of Economic Opportunity to salvage materials from Stinson Homes was not exclusive. They would get only those which the City would designate for this use and that if the local organization wanted some of the buildings, that the matter could be worked out satisfactorily.

After discussion of the matter, Mr. Lerma was asked to make an application to the City Manager, Jack Shelley, to designate certain buildings for demolition.

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After a short recess, the meeting reconvened at 10:00 A.M.

66-981 The Mayor opened the scheduled public hearing on the proposed annexation of 242.513 acres of land located on the South side of Rittiman Road and east of IH35 Expressway.

Planning Director Steve Taylor described the area being annexed and advised the Council this action was being taken on request of the developer of the property in order to connect to City utilities.

No one asked to speak on the matter.

The Mayor then declared the hearing closed and stated the first reading of the annexation ordinance will be held on September 8, 1966.

66-982 The Mayor then called up the scheduled public hearing on the proposed annexation of 40.137 acres of land known as Rolling Ridges Subdivision, Unit #1, located on Evers Road northwest of Callaghan Road.

Planning Director Steve Taylor described the property which is to be developed for residences and stated the action was taken on the request of the developer in order to connect to City utilities.

No one asked to speak on the matter.

The Mayor then declared the hearing closed and stated the first reading of the annexation ordinance will be held on September 8, 1966.

66-1040 Councilman Parker brought up the matter of the condition of Dewhurst Road from Eland Street south to the Expressway and asked that a Council committee be appointed to discuss this matter with the City of Balcones Heights.

Assistant City Manager Henckel advised the Council there was a request for the City of San Antonio to repave this portion of the street. The property is in Balcones Heights. He reported that residents of the City of San Antonio use this portion of the street to get on the Expressway and the City of San Antonio garbage trucks use it also. He said an offer was made to Balcones Heights through the property owners that San Antonio would participate with them by paying for the labor if they furnished the materials. Balcones Heights advised they did not have any funds. Suggestion was then made that Balcones Heights de-annex the street and San Antonio annex it.

Mr. Henckel described the properties in the area and stated that the City staff would recommend that if Balcones Heights would de-annex the street along with sufficient property values to justify the annexation, San Antonio would do so. He said no action was taken because San Antonio had no officially designated representatives at the previous meeting with Balcones Heights and the property owners.

He felt that San Antonio should include some of the property north of Eland Street in the agreement. Originally it was suggested that they de-annex everything east of the Expressway.

After discussion, the City Manager was asked to notify the property owners concerned to make a request to the City of Balcones Heights regarding the matter and set a date for a meeting at which the Council will have an official City member present.

66-1041 The Mayor asked Assistant Manager Dave Harner to give a report concerning encephalitis in San Antonio.

Mr. Harner reported that he had talked to Dr. Ross to get the latest status on the matter. He first pointed out that there was a normal pattern for an epidemic.

1. You need heavy springtime rains
2. Recurrent summer rains
3. Proper temperature and humidity

With these three elements, you have an increase in mosquito population and an epidemic could follow.

Mr. Harner reported that in San Antonio, we have not had any of these conditions. The mosquito population in the City, according to studies, including one by Southwest Research Institute, is indicated to be well below normal this year.

Secondly, as a result of the increase in the Health Department Budget, seven control crews have worked all summer and can cover the City in five days, whereas it used to take twelve.

He concluded by stating that in any year, month, or week there are certain illnesses in a city of this size that attack the central nervous system. They are routinely checked to make sure that one is not of the serious types, and so far, San Antonio has not had a serious case and it was felt there will be no major problem under current conditions.

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66-526 City Manager Shelley presented a plan for the Waterway and Marina in the Civic Center prepared by the architect, Mr. Arthur Mathis. Superimposed on the plan was the location of the Groos house which would interfere with the plan which was recommended as the best of several due to space limitations.

Mr. Arthur Mathis stated that of five different proposals, the one presented was the best, but it would require the demolition of the Groos house. He said it would cost about \$60,000 to relocate the house plus \$25,000 for finishing and landscaping.

Mrs. Cockrell presented an alternate plan prepared by Mr. O'Neill Ford for consideration. Mr. Mathis stated he had consulted with Mr. Ford on the plan, however, he felt that it was not feasible due to space problems.

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Mr. Mathis then showed a sketch of the Civic Center and advised that the Groos house could be relocated on the corner of Nueva and South Alamo. He felt that it will fit in fine with the atmosphere of the expansion of LaVillita.

Mr. Shelley then stated there was overlapping jurisdiction of Boards regarding the redevelopment of LaVillita. For example, the Parks Board, the River Walk Commission, and the Fine Arts Commission. There was no doubt but that all three agencies were involved in the matter.

It was the sentiment of the Council that all three Boards should be called in and let them have a meeting to reach an agreement on the redevelopment plan of LaVillita.

Mr. Mathis then, in detail, described the Marina which will have a concrete shelf roof for parking and a turn-around. The parking area will provide from sixty-five to seventy parking spaces.

Mr. Shelley advised the Council that included in this plan and the financing plan is the dedication of public lands as a waterway. The City's obligation will be the construction of the roof and the rest will be the obligation of the Urban Renewal Agency. In this way, the City will have the smaller portion of the cost.

Discussion was again held concerning the Groos house and it was brought out that under a section of the Urban Renewal Law, the historical houses can be demolished and relocated within a project area, the cost to be absorbed by the Urban Renewal Agency.

The Council agreed to the relocation of the Groos house in this manner and the following resolution was introduced and read by the Clerk.

66-1042 City Manager Shelley then reported that the Telephone Company has requested a facility in the vicinity of Nueva and South Alamo and the Groos house could be considered as a possibility to handle their request.

66-148 Mr. Shelley then stated that he would like to have the Council act on the financial program to handle the City's share of the cost of the Urban Renewal project. He stated that all changes in projects in the last two years are included in this financial arrangement including the additional two blocks for the expansion of LaVillita. He added that the Urban Renewal Agency cannot proceed until the Council approves the financial plan. Mr. Shelley was instructed to prepare an ordinance on this matter for consideration at next Thursday's meeting.

66-1043 Mr. Shelley then brought up the matter of the holiday schedule for the current fiscal year and asked if the Council was agreeable with the schedule forwarded to them by the Personnel Department. This schedule includes adding the Friday after Thanksgiving as an additional holiday.

The Council agreed and instructed Mr. Shelley to prepare an ordinance for consideration at the meeting next Thursday.

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There being no further business to come before the Council, the meeting adjourned.
