A RESOLUTION (1857)

CALLING FOR BIDS FOR LEVELLING OF BASE AND PAVING TENNIS COURT IN PARK AT MENCHACA AND 18th STREET.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That the City Clerk is directed to advertise for sealed bids, in duplicate, addressed to the City Clerk, City Hall, San Antonio 5, Texas, for approximately 800 square yards of levelling the base and paving one tennis court located at West End Park, Menchaca and 18th Streets, together with all labor, material and machinery to do the work.

2. The bids shall be in duplicate and the envelope containing the bid shall be endorsed "Bid for Levelling Base and Pavement at West End Park".

3. Bidder's check, either certified or cashier's check, in the amount of 2½ per cent of the total bid shall accompany each bid. The Construction Bond shall be 50 per cent of the total cost of the job and no maintenance bond shall be required. Plans and specifications and Bidder's forms may be obtained at the office of the City Clerk on the Second Floor of the City Hall.

4. Bids will be received at the office of the City Clerk until 10:00 o'clock A. M. CWT on Thursday, the 8th of March, 1945 and then publicly opened and read aloud in the City Council Chamber. Any bid received after opening time shall be returned unopened.

5. The work shall be done and completed in accordance with the plans and specifications and directions of the City Engineer.

6. The successful bidder will be required to execute the Standard City Form Construction Contract prepared and supplied by the City of San Antonio.

7. In case of ambiguity, duplicity or obscurity in the bids, the City Engineer shall have the exclusive power to construe and apply the meaning thereof.

8. No bids may be withdrawn less than three weeks after the scheduled closing time.

9. The City reserves the right to reject any or all bids and waive formality.

10. Attention is called to Article 5159-a, Revised Statutes of Texas, requiring that not less than the minimum wages prevailing in the locality in which the work is performed for a similar character, shall be paid.

11. Advertisement shall be made by the publication of this resolution for five days in the "COMMERCIAL RECORDER".

MAKING A LEASS WITH JESSE MARTINEZ.

1. That this ordinance makes and manifests a lease between the City of San Antonio, Lessor, and Jesse Martinez, Lessee, in words and figures as follows, WITNESSETH:-
 2. The Lessor demises and leases unto the Lessee the building at the intersection of North Presa and West Market Streets, on New City Block 160, within the corporate limits of the City of San Antonio.
 3. To have and to hold to the Lessee for a term of one month from the 1st of March, A. D. 1945, for and in consideration of \$20.00 rent, payable in advance, at the office of the License and Dues Collector of the City of San Antonio.
 4. The Lessee covenants as follows:
 5. To keep in repair all improvements as the same are now, reasonable wear and tear and damage by fire or other unavoidable casualty excepted;
 6. To use the property for a cafe for the sale of food and drink; and to act as custodian of the remainder of the property belonging to the Lessor which is used as a parking lot for employees of the Health Department;
 7. To yield up the demised premises in such a state of repair and management as shall be in compliance herewith at the expiration of this lease;
 8. The holding over by the Lessee after the expiration of this lease without the written consent of the Lessor shall be at a rate double the amount specified herein;
 9. The Lessee has examined the premises and the improvements hereon and warrants that they are satisfactory for the purpose for which the property is to be used.
 10. The Lessor covenants with the Lessee:
 11. That the Lessee paying the amount specified and observing and performing all and several the covenants and conditions herein on his part contained, shall peaceably hold and enjoy the demised premises during said term without any interruption by the Lessor or any person rightfully claiming under the Lessor.

This instrument in writing constitutes the entire agreement of accord and satisfaction between the parties, there being no other written or parole agreement with any officer or employed of the City; it being understood by the undersigned that the Charter of the City of San Antonio requires all contracts to be in writing and approved by ordinance, before the City is bound.

A RESOLUTION (1907)

MAKING AN APPEAL FROM OFFICE OF DEFENSE TRANSPORTATION RULING DATED MARCH 7, 1945, BY JOHN G. ROSS, DISTRICT MANAGER, DISALLOWING GASOLINE FOR ADDITIONAL TAXICABS IN THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That heretofore, on February 8, 1945, the Board of Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, Texas, comprised of the Mayor and four Commissioners, meeting in session in the Council Chamber of the City of San Antonio, passed a resolution in which the Office of Defense Transportation of the United States Government was requested to allow sufficient gasoline to operate 38 additional taxicabs within the City of San Antonio, Texas. That on March 7, 1945, in reply to the resolution forwarded to the Office of Defense Transportation, a reply was received from Mr. John G. Ross, District Manager of the Office of Defense Transportation, in which the request in the form of a resolution for additional gasoline to operate 38 additional cabs in San Antonio, Texas, was denied. That said denial was based upon the following facts, to-wit:-

A. That there are 177 certified cabs in the City of San Antonio, operating substantially below a reasonable average yearly mileage.

B. That if the aforementioned 117 cabs were operating a reasonable average mileage it would amount to the equivalent of a substantial increase in the number of cabs available to the public.

C. That the said City of San Antonio has been advised that they have 10 days within which to file an appeal from the order of Mr. John G. Ross, the District Manager of the Office of Defense Transportation, from the ruling heretofore issued by him on March 7, 1945, and request that this appeal be forwarded to the District Office of the ODT, or any other proper agency.

2. WHEREFORE, the Mayor and the City Commissioners, meeting in joint session in the Council Chamber of the City Hall, in the City of San Antonio, Texas, do hereby specifically appeal from the ruling of the said John G. Ross, District Manager of the Office of Defense Transportation, from its ruling in connection with the request for additional gasoline for 38 additional cabs in the City of San Antonio, Texas, for the following reasons, to-wit:-

D. That the Board of Commissioners of the City of San Antonio found, at three public hearings, in which the White & Blue Taxicab Company of San Antonio requested additional cabs; at a second hearing in which the Bell Taxicab Company, on January 12, 1945 made a request for additional cabs, and at a third hearing in which the Bellinger Taxicab Company, the Hartfield Taxicab Company and the Black Cat Taxicab Company, which was held on the 20th day of January, 1945, all of said hearings being held in open session in the Council Chamber in the City of San Antonio, Texas, and which hearings were final, and conclusive, following a series of hearings beginning December 12, 1944, and which hearings were likewise all public hearings, according to law, that there is a public necessity for additional taxicabs in the City of San Antonio. That all the testimony at the public hearings so held, showed conclusively and without a question of doubt that additional taxicabs to be used in the City of San Antonio were, for all practical purposes, a vital public necessity.

E. That it was further shown that the last Federal Census of the City of San Antonio in 1940, that the population was 253,000 persons, and that in 1944, according to the testimony adduced, the present population ranges from 400,000 to 500,000 persons, this estimate being taken from the San Antonio Chamber of Commerce records and the OPA calculation, this being exclusive of Army personnel, which is estimated to be approximately 150,000. That before the expansion of population in San Antonio in 1942, the City of San Antonio was licensed with 179

taxicabs, and that since such tremendous expansion, which is almost double what it was in 1940, the Commissioners, at such hearings, took judicial knowledge of the fact that the public transportation system of San Antonio is now taxed to its full capacity in handling both Army and civilian intracity traffic. The evidence further showed that the bulk of activities in the City of San Antonio was in direct war work and highly essential war activities, and that such taxicabs were vitally needed in every respect akin to the war effort. The Mayor and Commissioners further found that the licensing of 38 additional cabs would, without question, fail to alleviate the jammed traffic transportation in San Antonio but would, in some small way, tend towards aiding in alleviating the congestion, and pursuant to such findings the Mayor and Commissioners unanimously granted a permit for licensing 38 additional taxicabs in the City of San Antonio.

F. It is further found from the records in this case that the licensing of 38 additional taxicabs in the City of San Antonio will increase the total number of taxicabs so licensed to do business in San Antonio to a total of 217. This will make a ratio of cabs to the population of one cab for each 1900 population, which is higher than the average ratio for comparable cities in Texas.

G. The Mayor and City Commissioners further find that in the City of Dallas, Texas, which in 1940 had a population of 294,734, and which had an estimated population in 1944 of 440,888, there are 366 licensed cabs. The increase in population in that city is 10 7/10%. In the City of Houston, which in 1940 had a population of 384,514, and which had an estimated population in 1944 of 488,174, or an increase of 11 2/10%, there are 408 licensed cabs. In the City of San Antonio we have had an increase of 30 7/10% and have only 179 licensed cabs. In the City of Fort Worth, which had a population in 1940 of 177,662, and an estimated population in 1944 of 254,001, they have 178 licensed taxicabs. In Corpus Christi, which had a population in 1940 of 57,301, and an estimated population in 1944 of 120,965, they have a little better than 100 licensed cabs; and in the City of Austin, which had a population in 1940 of 87,930, and an estimated population in 1944 of something over 100,000, they have a little better than 100 licensed cabs. In El Paso, with a population in 1940 of 96,810, and an estimated population in 1944 of 137,579, they have 174 licensed cabs.

H. That the figures as above shown with reference to the population of other cities in Texas shows that the population, according to the number of cabs licensed in San Antonio is out of proportion to the population in other cities in Texas, where the population is not one-half the number that are estimated to be in San Antonio, they have more cabs than are at present licensed in San Antonio; therefore, the 38 additional cabs granted a license to operate in San Antonio is in keeping with the demands and necessity of the increase in population of this city; and it is further found that from the records of the public hearing, held in the Council Chamber in San Antonio, Texas, that a number of cabs that are duly licensed to operate in San Antonio, have not been operated by the Yellow Cab & Baggage Company for lack of sufficient drivers, and it is now shown that any attempt was made or that the Yellow Cab & Baggage Company have been unable to secure drivers for the cabs not operated. And it is further found that if the Yellow Cab & Baggage Company have cabs that are not operated, that this is working a hardship upon the citizens of San Antonio, for even with the 38 additional cabs licensed to operate will not alleviate the transportation deficiency in San Antonio, and the record further shows that all of the operators of the 38 additional cabs so granted by the City of San Antonio and licensed to operate, have publicly declared that they have more applicants than are needed to operate these additional cabs from returning veterans and others who are able to operate taxicabs. In view of the circumstances that there

are certain taxicabs that are not operating, and belonging to the Yellow Cab & Baggage Company, causing a hardship upon the citizens of San Antonio, and where it is not shown that any attempt has been made to secure permits for driverw, and the evidence does conclusively show from the records of the hearings held in the Council Chamber that it is imperative and vital to public necessity that additional cabs be licensed to operate in order to alleviate this situation; it is further ordered by the Mayor and Commissioners that all of the transcript of the records obtained from the hearings held in connection with the Bellinger Taxicab Company, the White & Blue Taxicab Company; the Bell Taxicab Company, the Hartfield Taxi Company, and the Black Cat Taxicab Company, be and are hereby incorporated and made a part and attached to this Resolution, in order that the Office of Defense Transportation may read the evidence adduced at the hearings and make thereby the testimony of the various people from all walks of life who testified voluntarily at these hearings, and who comprise a part of the citizenry who have made demand on the City of San Antonio to alleviate the lack of sufficient transportation in this city:

I. Therefore, in conformity with the rules of the Office of Defense Transportation, the City of San Antonio respectfully requests that this appeal from a ruling heretofore rendered on March 7, 1945, by John G. Ross, District Manager of the Office of Defense Transportation, be reviewed and that after such review that the previous request of the City of San Antonio for sufficient gasoline for the operation of 38 additional taxicabs be granted, and that the previous request of the Mayor and City Commissioners, which have unanimously granted, in open hearing, the addition of 38 cabs, in the following proportions, to-wit:-

3 cabs to D. V. Hartfield, doing business as Hartfield Taxicab Company,
 3 cabs to Robert Tease, doing business as Bellinger Taxicab Co.,
 3 cabs to Herbert Williams, doing business as Bellinger Taxicab Co.,
 3 cabs to John Mahalia, doing business as Bellinger Taxicab Co.,
 3 cabs to Jim Hartsfield, doing business as Bellinger Taxicab Co.,
 3 cabs to Rafael Ramon, doing business as Black Cat Taxicab Co.,
 10 cabs to Lon D. Fisher, doing business as the White & Blue Cab Co.,
 10 cabs to Ramon Sanchez, doing business as the Ball Taxicab Co.
