

MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO

THURSDAY, JANUARY 23RD, 1919 AT 4:00 P. M.

PRESENT: Hon. Sam C. Bell, Mayor, and Commissioners Coy, Heuermann and Wright.

ABSENT: Commissioner Lambert.

Minutes of the previous meeting were ordered approved.

-----MEMORIALS AND PETITIONS*-----

Protest from Southwestern Telegraph and Telephone Company against assessment for taxation was read and ordered filed.

Communication from Citizens complaining of the condition of Delgado street was read and referred to Commissioner of Streets and Public Improvements.

Bids for furnishing fire extinguishers for use of Fire department were read and referred to City Purchasing Agent.

The following ordinances were introduced by Commissioner Heuermann and after being read were adopted by the following vote on roll call, to-wit: Ayes, Bell, Coy, Heuermann and Wright.

MC-732 AN ORDINANCE

Releasing lien on lots 28, 30, 32, 35, 36 and 37, New City Block 3057, situated on McComb Avenue in the City of San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas.

WHEREAS, on the 31st day of July, A.D. 1918, the City Health Officer of the City of San Antonio filed in the County Clerk's Office of Bexar County a lien for improvements in cleaning weeds and brush from Lots Nos. Twenty-eight (28), Thirty (30), Thirty-two (32), Thirty-five (35), Thirty-six (36) and Thirty-seven (37), in New City Block Three Thousand and Fifty-seven (3057), on McComb Avenue, in the City of San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas, for the sum of Thirty-eight and 30/100 (\$38.30) Dollars; and

WHEREAS, it appearing that no such work was done on said lots, and that said lien was filed in error: Therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

That any claim which the City of San Antonio may have by reason of filing said lien is now hereby relinquished, cancelled and held for naught, and that said lien be and is hereby declared released.

- 733 AN ORDINANCE

Cancelling a paving assessment against Chas. F.A. and Emilie Hummel, constitution a lien on Lot A, City Block 742, for the paving of a portion of Beauregard street in the City of San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas, authorizing payment thereof by the City of San Antonio, and making appropriation therefor.

WHEREAS, a paving assessment was levied and charged against Chas. F.A. and Emilie Hummel, as owners of Lot A, City Block 742, for the paving of that portion of Beauregard street lying in front of said property; and

WHEREAS, said Lot A is public property and held by the City of San Antonio for park purposes and is not the property of the said Chas. F.A. and Emilie Hummel; and

WHEREAS, the said Chas. F.A. and Emilie Hummel, by deed dated December 26th, A. D. 1918, executed and delivered to the City of San Antonio a quit claim deed, forever quitclaiming and releasing unto said City of San Antonio all their right, title and interest in and to said property; and

WHEREAS, the pavement assessed in favor of the Uvalde Rock Asphalt Company against said property amounted to \$188.19 and is past due and unpaid, with interest thereof from January 4th, 1916: Now, therefore

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

Section 1. That the assessment levied and charged against Lot A, City Block 742, City of San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas, to cover the cost of paving that part of Beauregard street upon which said property abuts, be and the same is hereby annulled and set aside in so far as said assessment constitutes a charge or lien against said property or a personal liability of Chas. F.A. and Emilie Hummel.

Section 2; That the sum of Two Hundred and Thirty-five (\$235.00) Dollars, or so much thereof as may be needed, be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the 1918 General Fund, for the purpose of paying the cost of paving of that part of Beauregard street lying and extending in front of Lot A, City Block 742 in the City of San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas, and warrant therefor be drawn in favor of the Uvalde Rock Asphalt Company, the contractor laying such pavement, and that said warrant be delivered to said Company on the delivery to the City of San Antonio of a proper release, covering any lien asserted by them upon said property.

The following ordinances were introduced by Commissioner Coy and after being read were adopted by the following vote on roll call, to-wit: Ayes, Bell, Coy, Heuermann and Wright.

No. 323. - 734 AN ORDINANCE

Appropriating \$14.90 for refund of unexpired Beer Dealers License.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, that the sum of \$14.90 be and is hereby appropriated out of the Special Emergency and Contingency Fund for refund to the parties herein named of unexpired Beer Dealers Licenses to-wit:

No. 324. - 735 AN ORDINANCE

Transferring the sum of Three Hundred (\$300.00) Dollars from the Back Tax Fund to the Judgement Fund.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, that the sum of Three Hundred (\$300.00) Dollars be transferred from the Back Tax Fund to the Judgement Fund.

The following ordinance was introduced by Commissioner Wright, and after being read was adopted by the following vote on roll call, to-wit: Ayes, Bell, Coy, Heuermann and Wright

- 736 AN ORDINANCE

Repealing an ordinance to extend the present Police Regulations of the City of San Antonio covering the sale of Gasoline, automobile oils etc. , passed and approved Sept. 5, 1918.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, that a certain ordinance entitled "An ordinance to extend the present Police Regulations of the City of San Antonio, covering the sale of gasoline, automobile oils, tires and accessories," passed and approved

by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio on the 5th day of September, 1918 be and is hereby totally repealed.

AN ORDINANCE

Forbidding the construction, operation and maintenance of Drive-in Gasoline Filling Stations, within the first fire limits or Fireproof District A of the City of San Antonio, providing penalty and declaring emergency.
