

## MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

THURSDAY, OCTOBER 25th, A.D.1917, 4 P.M.

PRESENT: Honorable Sam C. Bell, Mayor, presiding, and Commissioners Lambert, Heuermann and Lowther.

No. 163 **MB-930** AN ORDINANCE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

That the sum of One Thousand (\$1000.00) Dollars be and is hereby appropriated out of the 1917 General Fund warrant for which shall be made payable to I.S. Kampmann and others, upon execution of approved deed of conveyance to the City of San Antonio, of land required by said City for sewer right of way and site for sewer pumping plant, in accordance with plat and field notes hereto attached and made a part hereof, as follows:

## FIELD NOTES

Of a tract of land out of City Block A-40, known as Kampmann Pasture Tract, belonging to Mrs E.K. Meyer and E.S. Kampmann, out of which tract 1.451 acres is to be deeded to the City of San Antonio, for the purpose of building and maintaining a sanitary sewer pumping station.

A. Determining the point of beginning.

From the established S.E. Cor. of New Braunfels Avenue and Sherman Street intersection in an easterly direction from the south line of Sherman Street, a distance of

2208.31 feet, to a corner point in said south line of Sherman Street.

Thence in a southeasterly direction with an angle of 20-3½' turned from east to southeast along the south line of Sherman Street as shown on accompanying plat, a distance of 627.41 feet, to the west fence line of said Kampmann Pasture Tract, for the point of beginning for the field notes of said 1.451 acre tract.

B. Field notes of said 1.451 acres.

Beginning at the intersection of the said south line of Sherman Street with the west fence line of Kampmann Pasture Tract, as shown on accompanying plat, which is made a part of these field notes.

Thence in a southeasterly direction with the extended south line of Sherman Street, a distance of 140.3 feet,

Thence in a southerly direction with an angle of 70.03' turned from southeast to south, a distance of 254.1 feet.

Thence with a right angle in an easterly direction, a distance of 200 feet,

Thence with a right angle in a northerly direction, a distance of 240.7 feet.

Thence in a northwesterly direction parallel and 55.6 feet apart from the extended south line of Sherman Street, a distance of 353.6 feet ~~apart~~ to the west fence line of Kampmann Pasture Tract.

Thence in a southerly direction along said west fence line of Kampmann Pasture Tract a distance of 59.1 feet to the point of beginning.

#### Field Notes.

for a tract of land out of City Block A-40, known as Kampmann Pasture Tract, belonging to Mrs E.K.Meyer and E.S.Kampmann. The owners of the said Kampmann Pasture Tract to give the City of San Antonio an easement to have free access for building and maintenance of a 24" sewer line to be built on this tract of land.

Beginning at a point in the west fence line of said Kampmann Pasture Tract, 199.3 feet north from the point where the south line of Sherman Street intersects the said west fence line of Kampmann Pasture Tract, as shown on accompanying plat, which is made a part of these field notes,

Thence in a southeasterly direction with an angle turned from south to southeast of 70-12' a distance of 263.55 ft.

Thence with a right angle in a southwesterly direction, a distance of 131.9 feet.

Thence with a right angle in a southeasterly direction, a distance of 20 feet,

Thence with a right angle in a northeasterly direction a distance of 131.9 feet.

Thence with a right angle, in a southeasterly direction, a distance of 907 feet,

Thence with a right angle in a northeasterly direction, a distance of 93.4 feet,

Thence with a right angle in a northwesterly direction with the north fence line of Kampmann Pasture Tract, a distance of 20 feet,

Thence with a right angle in a southwesterly direction, a distance of 73.4 feet,

Thence with a right angle in a northwesterly direction, a distance of 1,177.8 feet to the west fence ~~line~~ of Kampmann Pasture Tract.

Thence in a southerly direction with the west line of Kampmann Pasture Tract, a distance of 21.3 feet to the point of beginning,

This tract so describes a tract of land 10 feet wide on either side of the center of a 24" sanitary sewer.

No. 164. **MO-931** AN ORDINANCE

Appropriating \$280.41 out of 1917 General Fund to pay San Antonio Sewer Pipe Works for car sewer pipe.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the sum of Two Hundred, eighty and 41/100 Dollars (\$280.41) or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and is hereby appropriated out of the 1917 General Fund to pay San Antonio Sewer Pipe Works for the following material:

The following resolution was read and adopted:

RESOLUTION

BE IT RESOLVED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, blank credentials shall be issued to the representatives of each group of candidates at the Special election to be held on the 30th day of October, 1917, so that any ~~seateh~~ Judge or Clerk or supervisor whose name has been submitted to the Board of Commissioners and who shall for any reason fail or refuse to serve may be submitted by said representative of such group of candidates by the issuance of credentials by such representatives to the person who is substituted in the place or stead of any Judge or Clerk or Supervisor, who may so fail or refuse to serve, and the presiding officer of any precinct shall recognize and permit these persons holding credentials duly signed by the representatives aforesaid and permit them to serve in the capacity stated in their credentials provided that neither group of candidates shall have more than one Judge and one Clerk and one Supervisor in any polling place at one time.

It is the intention of this resolution to grant to each group of candidates equal representation in each of the 49 voting precincts in the City of San Antonio and to grant to the duly accredited representatives of such group of candidates full authority to substitute any Judge or Clerk or Supervisor in any voting precinct in the place and stead of any such person as may have been therefore appointed to act as such.


