MONDAY, MARCH 13TH, A.D.1922, 4 P.M.

PRESENT: Honorable O. B. Black, Mayor, presiding, and Commissioners Pfeiffer, Lambert, Rieden, Wright.

Minutes of previous meeting were ordered approved.

No. 485 AN ORDINANCE

Appropriating the sum of \$6000.00 for the use of the Carnegie Library, in the City of San Antonio, Texas.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

Section One: That the sum of ~~(1921 General Fund)~~ of Six Thousand Dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the 1921 General Fund, Contingent, for the use and benefit of the Carnegie Library and the City Auditor is hereby authorized and directed to draw proper voucher for said sum, payable to the Trustees of the Carnegie Library of the City of San Antonio, Texas.

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No. 483 AN ORDINANCE

Appropriating \$22.-0 to pay fines ordered remitted by the Mayor.

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No. 484 AN ORDINANCE

Appropriating the sum of \$30,000.00 for constructing bridge over river on Navarro Street.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the sum of \$30,000.00 or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and the same is hereby appropriated out of Bridge Fund of 1919 to construct bridge over San Antonio River on Navarro Street, north of Crockett Street.

The Commissioners authorized the placing of an add in the paper issued under the auspices of the I.O.O.F., provided, in the opinion of the City Attorney, it could be done legally.

The Mayor now nominated Dr. R.L.Barrow for the position of Assistant City Health Officer, which nomination was confirmed by the following vote on roll call, to-wit: Ayes, Black, Pfeiffer, Lambert, Rieden, Wright.

The Mayor now nominated Joe W.Maddox for the position of Registrar of Vital Statistics for the City, and the Commissioner of Sanitation, Parks, and Public Property nominated Dennis McGee for this position. The nomination of Dennis McGee failed of confirmation by the following vote on roll call, to-wit: Ayes, Lambert, Wright. Nays, Black, Pfeiffer, Rieden. The nomination of Joe W. Maddox was then confirmed by the following vote on roll call, to-wit: Ayes, Black, Pfeiffer, Rieden. Nays, Lambert, Wright.

The Mayor now nominated Mrs J.J.Flynn for the position of Complaint Clerk in the Health Department. The Commissioner of Sanitation, Parks and Public Property nominated Joe Dwyer for this position. The nomination of Joe Dwyer was defeated by the following vote on roll call, to-wit: Ayes, Lambert, Wright. Nays, Black, Pfeiffer, Rieden. The nomination of Mrs J.J.Flynn was then confirmed by the following vote on roll call, to-wit: Ayes, Black, Pfeiffer, Rieden. Nays, Lambert, Wright.

The Mayor now nominated Dr. J.B.Albright for the position of Superintendent of Health Inspection Department. There being no other nominations, the nomination of Dr Albright was confirmed by the following vote on roll call, to-wit: Ayes, Black, Pfeiffer, Rieden. Nays, Lambert, Wright.

The Mayor now nominated J.P.Golden for the position of Oiler in the Health Department, and

the Commissioner of Sanitation, Parks and Public Property, not being able to recall the name, nominated the present incumbent as such for that position. The nomination made by the Commissioner of Sanitation, etc. was defeated by the following vote on roll call, to-wit: Ayes, Lambert, Wright. Nays, Black, Pfeiffer, Rieden. The nomination of J.P. Golden was then confirmed by the following vote on roll call, to-wit: Ayes, Black, Pfeiffer, Rieden. Nays, Lambert, Wright.

The Mayor now nominated Miss D. Stone as head nurse in the Health Department. The Commissioner of Sanitation, Parks and Public Property nominated the present incumbent for this office, which nomination failed of confirmation by the following vote on roll call, to-wit: Ayes, Lambert, Wright. Nays, Black, Pfeiffer, Rieden. The nomination of Miss D. Stone was then confirmed by the following vote on roll call, to-wit: Ayes, Black, Pfeiffer, Rieden. Nays, Lambert, Wright.

The Mayor now nominated Miss Lucia Ibarra as nurse in the Health Department. The Commissioner of Sanitation, Parks, and Public Property nominated Miss Wolford for this position, which nomination was defeated by the following vote on roll call, to-wit: Ayes, Lambert, Wright. Nays, Black, Pfeiffer, Rieden. The nomination of Miss Ibarra was then confirmed by the following vote on roll call, to-wit: Ayes, Black, Pfeiffer, Rieden. Nays, Lambert, Wright.

The Mayor now nominated Miss Ollie Maddox for the position of Nurse in the Health Department. The Commissioner of Sanitation, Parks and Public Property nominated Mrs Patton for that position, which nomination was defeated by the following vote on roll call, to-wit: Ayes, Lambert, Wright. Nays, Black, Pfeiffer, Rieden. The nomination of Miss Ollie Maddox was then confirmed by the following vote on roll call, to-wit: Ayes, Black, Pfeiffer, Rieden. Nays, Lambert, Wright.

The Mayor now placed in nomination the name of G.H. Allen as Chief Meat Inspector & Veterinary Surgeon; C.R. May as Barber Inspector, and the following as Food Products and Health Inspectors for the Health Department, viz: ~~viz~~: H.C. Payne, J.R. Childress, A.L. Pytle, J.L. Hill, H.J. Miller, J. Ross Boles, T.A. Hall, J.T. Boyd, R.D. Frame, H.T. Hopkins, Harry Henderson, G.J. Lucchese, Eduardo Chavez, G.W. Wiemer, Lee J. Gittinger, Alex Rossy, J.G. Fikart, each of which was confirmed by the following vote on roll call, to-wit: Ayes, Black, Pfeiffer, Rieden. Nays, Lambert, Wright.

The Commissioner of Sanitation, Parks and Public Property then nominated the following men: Julius Krisch, E.A. Wernette, H.W. Ellis, John W. Mueller, Joe Carle, Wm. Wiegand, Frank Guardo, I.J. Haas, T.H. Trainer, Harry Rohmer, W.D. Collins, M. Villanueva, A. Dirks, E.R. Goulding, Ed Treadwell, Henry Limburger, S.B. Martinez, who failed of confirmation by the following vote on roll call, to-wit: Ayes, Lambert, Wright. Nays, Black, Pfeiffer, Rieden.

On motion, duly seconded and carried, the meeting adjourned.
